In the wake of massive flood, landslide due to 'Usman'

Solons seek Pres. Duterte's help to stop illegal logging in Samar Island

TACLOBAN CITY—Two congressmen from Samar Island have asked President Rodrigo Duterte to also give focus in stopping illegal logging activities just like what he is doing on illegal drug activities in the country.

The call of Reps. Raul Daza of Northern Samar and Edgar Mary Sarmiento of Samar came in the wake of massive flooding that were experienced by both provinces after these areas were hit by tropical depression 'Usman' last December 28.

Both congressmen said that like illegal drugs, illegal logging could also result to the deaths of innocent people.

"If these illegal logging activities will not be eliminated, these will bring more misery to the people and not only that as these will prevent development of the area because if you have flooding, landslide,

how can you improve the infrastructure," Daza said.

Rep. Sarmiento said he hopes that illegal logging activities in Samar and Northern Samar, among the country's most depressed provinces, would also come to its end with the intercession to the President.

"We have to bring this matter to the President. We have to do something to solve this not tomorrow but immediately," the Samar solon added.

On Tuesday (Jan.29), the committee on natural resources of the House of Representatives chaired by Rep. Rodrigo Abellanos of Cebu conducted a hearing upon the request of both

Daza and Sarmiento on the reported illegal logging activities in the two provinces.

During the three-hour hearing, officials of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources were grilled by the committee members why illegal logging activities continue to exist in the region.

Rep. Daza also scored DENR Regional Director Crizaldy Barcelo why he issued two logging permits in Northern Samar.

Rep. Sarmiento suggested to the DENR officials to review their policies concerning issuances of logging permits to ensure that only legitimate concessionaires

Tacloban city gov't vows to cleanup Panalaron Bay, other major waterways

TACLOBAN CITY—While this city's major bodies of water are often seen to be dirty with all sorts of wastes could be seen floating, the Fishery Law Enforcement Team (FLET) insists that they are doing their job in cleaning them up.

In fact, their main concern now involves the cleaning up of the Panalaron Bay, said Carlos Dave Castello, FLET coordinator.

Earlier, photos of Panalaron Bay, one of the city's major bays, full with garbage

circulated in the social media with netizens calling the attention of the city government to conduct its own clean up.

Cleaning up or rehabilitating the country's major bodies of water has become a sort of frenzy after President Rodrigo Duterte issued an order to collect garbage at the Manila Bay and restore its old glory.

Manila Bay is earlier known to have one of the best spots in the world for watching sunset.

Castello said that their

office, together with the City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (CDRRMO) and the Tacloban Youth Office, and even some volunteers are taking turns in cleaning up the city's bodies of water, to include Panalaron Bay, long before Mr. Duterte directed for cleanup of bays and creeks.

The city's main public market, seaport, and several business establishments



DOH reports of 491 dengue cases in EV in January

GOVERNMENT CENTER, PALO, Leyte-The Department of Health (DOH-8), based here, reported that about 491 individuals have been afflicted with dengue fever in the region.

Boyd Cerro, chief of the regional epidemiology and surveillance unit of the DOH-8, said that the current cases of dengue covering the month of January, is lower by 22% compared to the same period last year.

Last year, the DOH reported 10,811 dengue fever cases in the region which resulted to the deaths of 59 people, majority of them were children.

Among the symptoms of dengue fever are fever, muscle pain, stomach ache, and low platelet count, to name a few.

The common age bracket for dengue cases usually range from 5-14 years old for children, and 15-49 years old for adults. The symptoms usually manifest on children as they have weaker immune systems compared to adults.

However, adult cases are more vulnerable since they already have existing diseases that may be triggered by the newly acquired virus in their bodies.

The DOH advised to follow the so-called 4S: search and destroy; seek early consultation and avoid self-medication; self-protection during the season; and

Second engagement in the city since 2014 American soldiers to visit Tacloban City as part of its Pacific Partnership Program

TACLOBAN CITY – American soldiers are coming here in the city as part of its Pacific Partnership Program slated to be staged next month.

This was disclosed by city information officer Ma. Lumen Tabao who said that initial meeting in connection to the March 10 to 24 exercises have already been held.

Filipino soldiers, to include its engineering battalion based in the city, are also to participate the event, she said.

Tabao said that this is the second time that Tacloban City will be hosting the Pacific Partnership Program since 2014.

Among the activities during the 15-day event are beach and coastal cleanup and tree planting, press engagements, visits to school and orphanages, medical missions, rehabilitation of a rehabilitation center, and construction of an evacuation center in the northern part of Tacloban.

“Some ground works especially on construction will be started this February by personnel from the Army engineers, but the official program will last for two weeks from March 10 to 24,” Tabao said.

Tabao added that American soldiers will be arriving before the end of February.

Holding the Pacific Partnership again in Tacloban is a big gain for the city, the city official said.

“This will have a big impact for us. We will gain more by learning from their expertise,” Tabao said.

In 2014, more than 300 servicemen from the United States, Japan and Australia landed in Tacloban to participate the Pacific Partnership Program, few months after the devastation of super typhoon ‘Yolanda’.

Their works included engineering, medical, veterinary and other aid work.

During their stay in the city, they joined the locals in the construction of four-classroom buildings and two-science buildings at the San Fernando Central Elementary School and the repair of the orthopedic building of the Tacloban City Hospital.

The foreign soldiers also helped in the construction of a two-classroom buildings at the Castilla Elementary School in Palo, Leyte. (ROEL T. AMAZONA)

GSIS-Maasin taps LGUs to spread loan condonation program for inactive members

MAASIN CITY- The government’s pension firm in this city is coordinating closely with the various local government units to make known an easy payment scheme for those no longer in public service but still have outstanding loans to pay.

“The Program for Reconstruction and Repayment of Debts (PRRD) was intended for those out of government work yet still have remaining unpaid loan balances of six months or more,” Cecilia Tenaja, GSIS-Maasin branch manager, said.

At the Kapihan sa PIA forum last week, Tenaja said her office had already sent communication letters to the different local chief executives in order to reach out to those formerly employed in these localities, had paid premiums, had borrowings, but in twists of fate resigned or severed from service.

GSIS-Maasin area of coverage includes Baybay City, Inopacan, Hindang, Hilongos, Bato, and Matalom in the province of Leyte, and the whole of Southern Leyte.

Visiting these places for further emphasis of virtually introducing the

Tacloban City gets DILG seal of “Good Financial Housekeeping” anew

TACLOBAN CITY - The city government of Tacloban passed the Seal of Good Financial Housekeeping (SGFH) – one of the core assessment areas of the Seal of Good Local Governance conceived to promote transparency and accountability in Local Government Operations by the Department of Interior Local Government (DILG).

In an official list released by the Bureau of Local Government Section (BLGS) of the Regional DILG signed by Alfred Mamuyac, Melany Quiton, and Director Atty. Odilon Pasaraba, Tacloban passed the 2018 SGFH along with six other cities in the region.

City DILG Director Atty. Darwin Bibar, in an interview over “Sumat Tacloban” – the biweekly radio program of the City Information Office, said that the certification is an indication that the local

government unit under the leadership of Mayor Cristina G. Romualdez is “compliant with the accounting and auditing standards, rules and regulations.”

He added that other areas considered for the seal were the functionality of the local development council, adherence of the local government to the full disclosure policy and the good utilization rate of the development fund, the COA Audit Opinion, and sound revenue generation initiatives.

The DILG financial clearance got by LGU Tacloban is the latest to the growing list of national and regional awards it has reaped in the past years such as Seal of Child Friendly Local Governance Award, the Seal of

Customs 2018 earnings up nearly four-fold in East Visayas

TACLOBAN CITY -- The Bureau of Customs’ (BOC) field office here has earned an all-time high of P1.12 billion in collections in 2018, nearly quadrupling its target income.

In less than six months last year, the bureau has already surpassed the P388 million annual collection goal, BOC-Tacloban district collector Jose Naig said in a press briefing Tuesday (Jan.29).

This is the first time for the regional BOC to hit the P1 billion collection mark.

The district office, which covers all ports in six provinces of the Eastern Visayas region, has doubled its collection compared to the P524 million earnings in the previous year.

The BOC noted high collections from the importation of fuel, liquefied petroleum gas, rice, cement, and construction materials.

For fuel alone, the agency earned P133 million in July alone from a shipment of 7,300 metric tons of unleaded gasoline by Insular Oil Corp. through the Babatngon, Leyte port, according to Naig.

The Customs official said the importation of rice by the National Food Authority accelerated in the second half of last year in response to the rice shortage.

Demand for construction materials also went up with the government’s “Build, Build, Build” initiative and continuing reconstruction activities after super typhoon ‘Yolanda’ in the past five years.

The sub-port of Isabel, Leyte has been consistently earning high collections from ore, slag, ash, inorganic chemicals, organic and inorganic compounds of precious metals, and others. These are raw material requirements of the Philippine Associated Smelting

and Refining Corp. and the Philippine Phosphate Fertilizer Corp.

For 2019, the BOC raised its target for the region to P1.2 billion as the bureau raised its nationwide goal to PHP677 billion from P588 billion last year.

“Even with the record-high collection goal, we are optimistic to meet or even surpass the target this year as demand for imported products increases. Once the Rice Tarrification bill is approved, we will get to be able to collect more from the importation of rice from neighboring countries,” Naig said.

The BOC is an agency under the Department of Finance primarily tasked to assess and collect customs revenues from imported goods and other dues, fees, charges, fines and penalties. It is also mandated to prevent the entry of smuggled goods. (SARWELL Q. MENIANO/PNA)

Samar encounter killed 2 NPA members

TACLOBAN CITY- Two alleged members of the New People’s Army (NPAs) died in an encountered with members of government forces in Matuguinao, Samar on Tuesday (Jan.29).

Brigadier General Ramil Bitong, commanding officer of the 803rd Infantry Brigade, told Leyte Samar Daily Express (LSDE) that the 20 minute firefight took place in Barangay Carolina of said town of about 10 am that resulted to the death of the two rebels.

Several firearms owned by the NPA members were

also recovered by the soldiers belonging to the 63rd Infantry Brigade whose camp is based in San Jorge town, also in Samar.

Bitong said that the soldiers were in the area when they encountered about 10 rebels which resulted to a fire battle.

The government forces immediately coordinated with the municipal government of Matuguinao to help them identify the two dead rebels as they conducted hot pursuit against the fleeing NPA members.

According to Gen. Bi-

tong, the unfortunate incident could have been avoided only if the NPA members would listen to the call of the government to stop their criminal activities and avail the Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program.

“We cannot let this rebels get way with the atrocities they have committed against helpless civilians. I’ve said many times that we will not rest until they are banished or killed,” he said. (JAZMIN BONIFACIO)

GSIS-PRRD to these municipalities and cities was also among the priority to-do list she has lined up, Tenaja added.

Crizal Inocando, a division staff who was also a guest at the Kapihan, reported that quite a number of formerly employed members with remaining debts to settle showed up at their office to fill up application forms for loans restructuring and condonation under the PRRD.

She cited the case of an individual whose untouched 2010 loan balance had reached P 105,000.00 on current computation, but paid only a one-time sum of P 21,000.00.

If paid on installment for a period of three years, the PRRD-based balance of P 21,000 will only be paid P683 per month.

GSIS-PRRD, which was launched on December 18, 2018 for a one-year period until December 18, 2019, offered a

lower interest rate of 10 percent instead of the usual 12 percent per annum, while surcharges and penalties are waived, for the benefit of inactive members. (LDL/MMP/PIA-8 Southern Leyte)




Pork Insertions



Terrorism

The twin bombing at a church in Jolo Sulu that killed at least 25 people and wounded 111 others is an act of terrorism. The bombings were carried out by a terrorist organization such as the Abu Sayyaf or the Dalima Islamiyah.

The attack would have an effect on a decades push for peace that culminated on voters approving expanded Muslim self-rule in Mindanao. These two explosions would pose the

question whether Martial Law was really working in Mindanao. Billions of pesos in taxpayers money had been poured into the military’s intelligence fund with little effect. There were security lapses in security as there was a motorcycle parked outside the cathedral in whose utility box the second bomb was reportedly placed.

God and the digital age

THE final report of the Synod of Bishops on young people, faith and vocational discernment that concluded last October has an interesting observation regarding the digital culture that is now pervasive in the world. It talks about the great benefits and the dangers that the digital world is giving us.

It is intriguing to note that the good and bad things in this world are becoming more and more blended. They do not come to us anymore in some clear-cut ways, but rather in a united way, so subtle that we now hardly can distinguish which is which.

Our new technologies are like Trojan horses that can appear to us as a great gift to humanity, but actually they contain a lot of concealed dangers. They are very treacherous. Whatever

benefit and sense of success and accomplishment they bring are akin to a Pyrrhic victory when the good things are somehow nullified by the bad things they also cause.

The new technologies and the digital culture have significantly changed the way people understand things in general and as a consequence, their behavior also. They create an “approach to reality that privileges images over listening and over reading that influences the way people learn and the development of their critical faculty.” It’s like we are having a new ball game.

It’s true that these new technologies give a lot of benefits. They provide “an extraordinary opportunity for dialogue, encounter and exchange between persons, as well as access to information

and knowledge.” It can “facilitate the circulation of independent information that can provide effective protection for the most vulnerable, etc.”

As to its dark side, the report says that the “digital environment is also one of loneliness, manipulation, exploitation and violence...Digital media can expose people to the risk of dependency, isolation and gradual loss of contact with concrete reality, blocking the development of authentic interpersonal relationships.”

Besides, the report noted that “there are huge economic interests operating in the digital world, capable of exercising forms of control as subtle as they are invasive, creating mechanisms of manipulation of consciences and of the democratic process.

“The way many platforms work often ends up favoring encounter between person who think alike, shielding them from debate. These closed circuits facilitate the spread of fake news and false information, fomenting prejudice and hate...”

We don’t have to look far to validate these very serious observations and they definitely have to be addressed accordingly. And I believe that the



Proposed Philippine Farm Mechanization Plant Assembly

Further, unless the tax, surcharges and penalties are paid before the expiration of the year for which the taxes due except when the notice of the assessment or special levy is contested administratively or judicially pursuant to the provisions of **Sec. 226 of RA 7160**, the delinquent real property will be sold at public auction, and the title to the property will be vested in the purchaser subject, however, to the right of the delinquent owner of the property or any person having legal interest therein to redeem the property within one (1) year from the date of sale.

NOTICE OF REAL PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT IN THE CITY OF TACLOBAN FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2019

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the provisions of Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as the **Local Government Code of 1991**, the Basic tax on real property at the rate of two percent (2%) per annum, on all commercial and industrial lands, buildings and improvement and one percent (1%) for the Special Educational Fund (SEF) for the Calendar Year 2019 shall become due and payable on the first day of January. Said taxes, however, may be paid in four (4) equal installments without interest at the option of the taxpayer, as follows:

- 1st Installment on or before March 31, 2019
- 2nd Installment on or before June 30, 2019
- 3rd Installment on or before September 30, 2019
- 4th Installment on or before December 31, 2019

Under **Ordinance No. 99-58** of the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Tacloban City, any taxpayer who pays the real property taxes due on his property within the prescribed period of payment shall be given the following discounts:

If Annual tax is paid on or before January 31, 2019-----	20% discount
If paid on or before the last day of the 1 st month of every quarter -----	15% discount
If paid within the quarter-----	10% discount

Provided however, that there is no real property tax delinquency on the subject property.

Accordingly, if the real property tax due for the first quarter of a tax year is not paid on or before the 31st day of March of the same year, the interest shall be reckoned from the first day of January at the rate of two percent (2%) for every month of delinquency or fraction thereof, on the basis of the total amount due for the entire year and not on the amount due for the first quarter of the year.

After the end of the year for which the taxes are due and the real property taxes are not paid this office will avail of the remedies provided for by law to enforce collection thereof.

Failure to pay the real property taxes for both the Basic and Special Education Fund tax (SEF) on or before the dates indicated above shall subject the taxpayer to the payment of interest of two percent (2%) for each month of delinquency or fraction thereof, until the tax is fully paid, but in no case shall the total interest on the unpaid tax or portion thereof exceed 36 months or 72%.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-13-31

AN ORDINANCE CONVERTING THE MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS DIVISION TO CITY MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS OFFICE, PROVIDING FUNDS THERE-OF, DEFINING ITS ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Sponsored by: **Hon. Eden C. Pineda**

WHEREAS, at present there exists the Management Information Systems Division, an indispensable arm of the City Government, which is solely responsible for the centralization and modernization of the government’s data systems in this modern age of information and communication technology;

WHEREAS, the Management Information System Division has remained a division of the City Mayor’s Office with only five (5) plantilla employees and nine (9) Job Order Workers;

WHEREAS, there is an apparent need to carry out an almost insurmountable task of remaining, upgrading and developing various projects to keep the City Government abreast of the fast-paced progress of modern-day transactions and correspondence requiring a bigger manpower complement for the said division necessitating the creation of a department.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained as it is hereby ordained by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Tacloban, Philippines, that:

Section 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as “**AN ORDINANCE CONVERTING THE MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM DIVISION TO CITY MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS OFFICE OF TACLOBAN CITY.**”

Section 2. CREATION AND PURPOSE. It is hereby created, organized and operated the **City Management Information System Office (CMISO)**, a department of the City Government of Tacloban to ABSORB the Management Information System Division which shall be including its current five (5) plantilla positions (Information Technology Officer II, Computer Programmer II, Computer Maintenance Technologist II, Administrative Assistant III (Computer Operator II) and Administrative Assistant II (Data Controller II)), responsible in the maintenance and development of information systems and technologies in the City Government of Tacloban.

Section 3. COMPOSITION. It is hereby created the following positions to constitute the CMISO, including the above-mentioned five (5) plantilla positions with their corresponding salary grades, to wit:



Section 4. ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE. The City Management Information Systems Office shall be headed by the **City Government Department Head II**. It shall be composed of two Divisions, namely: (1.) **RESEARCH, MAINTENANCE AND DEVELOPMENT DIVISION**; and (2) **ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION**. Hereunder is the organizational structure of the **CMISO**:

Section 5. QUALIFICATIONS:

1. City Government Department Head II - Bachelor’s degree, Five (5) years in position involving management and supervision, Thirty-two (32) hours of training in management and supervision, Career Service Professional or appropriate second level eligibility.
2. Information Technology Officer II - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, Three (3) years of relevant experience, Sixteen (16) hours of relevant training. Career Service Professional or appropriate second level eligibility.
3. Information Systems Analyst III - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, 2 years relevant experience and 8 hours relevant training. Career Service Professional.
4. Computer Programmer III - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, 2 years relevant experience, 8 hours relevant training, Career Service Professional.
5. Computer Maintenance Technologist II - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, 1 year relevant experience and 4 hours relevant training. Career Service Professional (Second Level Eligibility).
6. Computer Programmer II - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, 1 year relevant experience and 4 hours relevant training. Career Service Professional or appropriate second level eligibility.
7. Senior Administrative Assistant II (Computer Operator IV) - Bachelor’s degree relevant to the job, 3 years relevant experience and 16 hours of relevant training. Career Service Sub-professional.
8. Administrative Assistant III (Computer Operator II) - Completion of two (2) years studies in college or High School graduate with relevant vocational/trade course, 1 year relevant experience and 4 hours of relevant training, Career Service Sub-professional (First Level Eligibility).
9. Administrative Assistant II (Data Controller II) - Completion of two (2) years studies in college or High School graduate with relevant vocational/trade course, 1 year relevant experience and 4 hours of relevant training, Career Service Sub-professional (First Level Eligibility), Data Encoder (MC 11,s.96-Cat.I).
10. Administrative Aide VI (Electronics and Communications Equipment Technician I) - Completion of two (2) years studies in college or High School Graduate with relevant vocational/trade course, Experience - None required, Training - None required, Eligibility - None required.

Section 6. FUNCTIONS OF THE CITY MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS OFFICE. The CMISO shall have the following functions: (a) develop and maintain an integrated information application system (b) manage information and technology systems,

database and Information Technology Infrastructure (c) provide for Information and Communications Technology standards and policies and such other duties and functions as may be assigned by the City Mayor, and specifically,

A. The Research, Maintenance and Development Division, shall perform the following functions:

1. Establish the project development cycle, related documentation standards, and overall procedures to be followed;
2. Produce documentation up to and including the phase of functional system specification. Introduce completed projects to the user, and follow up the integration of newly installed software in organizations;
3. Produce functional system specifications of new applications and applications to be re-developed;
4. Testing of newly completed applications for conformity with technical system design and specifications;
5. Verify that corrective action has been performed and that reported problems are resolved;
6. Implement version control and in charge of archiving of Information Systems;
7. Collate information to establish the overall map of the location of all data within the electronic government system;
8. Provide oversight like audits and compliance with operational policies and standards and direction to IT related issues to government organizations in the different sections;
9. Ensure that all systems design cater for seamless integration with existing systems and as far as possible anticipated future ones;
10. Implement business process re-engineering activities to improve information systems design and implementation;
11. Prioritize new project in terms of an organization’s overall governance, project portfolio processes and contingencies;
12. Recommend to management areas that need information technology to improve its operations;
13. Monitor and review project performance and its effect on project delivery;
14. Train users on the operation of new systems and applications deployed; and
15. Document new systems and application user manuals and training modules
16. Carry out the coding as per the technical system design and specifications, in conformity with coding standards;
17. Improve version control standards;
18. Develop applications that will be common to the whole of electronic government network;
19. Installation of completed projects;
20. Maintain Application programs;
21. Maintain all IT equipment and operating systems;
22. Facilitate customer requests for IT services;
23. Conduct inventory and inspection of all IT equipment and software;
24. Prepare reports on status of all IT equipment and its utilization;
25. Conduct information technology awareness;
26. Assist the Research and Development Division in the deployment of developed applications and systems;
27. Prepare the IT specifications and hardware design requirements;
28. Provide technical evaluation of all IT equipment and operating systems requirements and ensures that all deliverables are met upon project completion;
29. Responsible for new equipment installation and commissioning activities;
30. Manage the local area network and wide area network and the systems operating in them;
31. Primarily responsible for the security of all application software/OS and ensures protection from disasters by formulating emergency procedures to be followed in case of disastrous events;
32. Prepare and execute computer protection runs schedule;
33. Responsible for the physical security of the computer room or datacenter;
34. Review and make recommendations on status of the network;
35. Coordinate with the different client departments on their telecommunication needs.

B. The **Administrative Division** shall be responsible for the following:

1. Office supplies, property and procurement management;
2. Inventory of office supplies and office equipment;
3. Updating of supplies and equipment records;
4. Preparation of maintenance contracts for equipment;
5. Preparation and dissemination of memos for inter communications and intra office;
6. Document filing system;
7. Preparation of office budget and procurement plan;
8. Perform personnel services including payroll processing, leave of absence processing, time keeping supervision and file maintenance among others;
9. Assist management in formulating office policies/standards in compliance with CSC regulations; and
10. Prepare related administrative reports.

Section 7. DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS:

A. The **City Government Department Head II** shall have the following functions:

1. Leads the Department in developing computer systems or undertaking specialist activities, including technical activities and provide associated advice;
2. Provides key technical support in the development, implementation and maintenance of a centralized database system & network infrastructure of the City Government; serves as a project lead in developing and implementing new technology;
3. Liaise with subject matter staff undertaking their own programming and provide advice on complex information technology problems;
4. Reviews reports of computer and peripheral equipment production, malfunction, and maintenance to ascertain costs and plan operating changes;
5. Establishes IT policies, standards, practices and security measures to ensure effective and consistent information processing operations and to safeguard information resources;
6. Monitors and resolves escalated issues related to quality assurance, security management, systems administration and systems development;
7. Approves recommendation and evaluation of proposed systems for computerization;
8. Recommends to the City Mayor, the City Administrator and other department heads areas where information technology can be best utilized;
9. Evaluates the effectiveness and performance of vital office functions and running information systems; and
10. Recommends to the department head areas where information technology can be best utilized.

B. The **Information Technology Officer II** shall have the following functions:

1. Formulates periodic information system plans of the office through maximum utilization and implementation of appropriate technology and other matters related to Information Technology;
2. Plans organizes and coordinates work activities of the office;
3. Performs such other related duties as may be assigned from time to time.

C. The **Computer Programmer III** shall have the following functions:

1. Codes programs based on user specifications and systems development methodology;
2. Develop, implement, maintain, and enhance systems;
3. Provides information technology support services to the City Government;
4. Perform debugging/testing for all developed systems.

D. The **Computer Maintenance Technologists II** shall have the following functions:

1. Checks and maintains computer equipment and peripherals;
2. Conduct periodic assessment of computer hardware and perform such other related duties and functions assigned by superior.

E. The **Computer Programmer II** shall have the following functions:

1. Study, design and develop Information Systems of the offices in the City Government of Tacloban for efficient planning, programming and evaluation mechanism;
2. Conducts periodic assessment of all computer software;
3. Assists in the management and supervision of the office;
4. Performs other related duties as may be assigned by superior from time to time.

F. The **Senior Administrative Assistant II** (Computer Operator IV) shall have the following functions:

1. Administers various information systems implemented in the City Government;
2. Updates system’s data link library and scripts;
3. Supervises system users and train new tax collectors;
4. Troubleshoots system malfunctions and failures;
5. Monitors and maintains system’s performance;
6. Resolves user problems by answering questions and requests.

G. The **Administrative Assistant III (Computer Operator II)** shall have the following functions:

1. Feeds and saves communication data in the computer and print the same as needed;
2. Takes care of the computer and safeguards the equipment;
3. Performs other related duties as may be assigned by the superiors from time to time.

H. The **Administrative Assistant II (Data Controller II)** shall have the following functions:

1. Manages, maintains and secures the City’s information data bank as well as the network efficiency and integrity;
2. Performs other related duties as may be assigned by the superiors from time to time.

I. The **Administrative Aide VI (Electronics and Communications Equipment Technician I)** shall have the following functions:

1. Investigates hardware problems and performs major and minor system hardware and communication connection repairs;
 2. Installa, monitor, maintain and troubleshoot electronic and communication equipment;
 3. Prepares reports on status of electronic devices/equipment;
 4. Performs related duties as required.
- Section 8. APPROPRIATIONS.** A funding of Eight Million, Seven Hundred Forty-Four

Thousand, Nine Hundred Sixty-Five Pesos and Fifty-Six Centavos (Php8,744,965.56) shall be appropriated from the general fund for the organization and operation of the Office. Thereafter, the City Government of Tacloban shall appropriate a regular budget for the effective operation of the Office and shall include it in its annual appropriations henceforth.

Section 9. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 10. REPEALING CLAUSE. All laws, ordinances, resolutions and executive orders inconsistent herewith shall be deemed repelled or modified accordingly.

Section 11. EFFECTIVE CLAUSE. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after publication in a newspaper of local circulation.



In compliance to the 1987 Philippine Constitution and the Local Government Code of 1991 to provide effective and efficient service through enactment of ordinances and approval of resolutions, as well as in line with Seal of Good Local Governance, the Sangguniang Panlungsod has been steadfast in providing effective information dissemination to the general public relative to approved ordinances and resolutions, in which cases are published in a locally-circulated newspaper.

The need to publish approved ordinances has been explicitly provided in the Local Government Code of 1991, to wit:

Section 59. *Effectivity of Ordinances or Resolutions.* -

xxx

(d) In the case of highly urbanized cities, the main features of the ordinance or resolution duly enacted or adopted shall, in addition to being posted, be published once in a local newspaper of general circulation within the city: Provided, That in the absence thereof the ordinance or resolution shall be published in any newspaper of general circulation.

Section 511. *Posting and Publication of Ordinances with Penal Sanctions.* - Ordinances with penal sanctions shall be posted at prominent places in the provincial capital, city, municipal or barangay hall, as the case may be, for a minimum of three (3) consecutive weeks. Such ordinances shall also be published in a newspaper of general circulation, where available, within the territorial jurisdiction of the local government unit concerned, except in the case of barangay ordinances. Unless otherwise provided therein, said ordinances shall take effect on the day following its publication, or at the end of the period of posting, whichever occurs later.

xxx

The **Leyte Samar Daily Express, Inc.**, has been publishing approved ordinances of the Sangguniang Panlungsod for the past years. It claims to be the leading newspaper publisher in our locality and, so far, we observed that it had not missed its obligation for publication of ordinances.

Lastly, we hope that this suffice the requirements stated in your memo directives and as stipulated in Section 53 of the 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 9184.

I hope to have clarified you on this matter.

Leyte Vice Gov. Loreto appeals to the public to heed authorities’ call for cooperation

TACLOBAN CITY – Leyte Vice Governor Carlo Loreto issued an appeal to the public to cooperate with authorities after the Philippine National Police (PNP) put the entire force in heightened alert after the twin bombing that rocked Jolo, Sulu.

Under the directive from the national headquarters, Chief Supt. Dionardo Carlos, police regional director, said that they were instructed to intensify security and intelligence gathering, search and checkpoint operations and to strictly implement the election gun ban.

“Let’s toe the line. This is being done for our safety and security. If we cooperate, this gruesome incident can be prevented to hap-

pen in our province, in our region,” Loreto said.

Loreto said that the province joins the whole nation in expressing sympathy with the residents of Jolo especially to the family of the victims of bombing at the Cathedral of Our Lady of Mount Carmel last January 27 that killed 27 people and injured 80 others.

“It’s very sad. I think all of us should come together to celebrate the beauty of

life and not to destroy or ruin others life. Political and religious belief should be set aside and should not be used to destroy other,” Loreto added.

Chief Supt. Carlos said that they are in constant coordination with intelligence units and exchange of information.

Heightened security measures and increase of police visibility are undertaken in ports of the region particularly in Liloan and San Ricardo ports, both in Southern Leyte which serves as the main gateways for those coming in and out of Mindanao to the region.

“We will keep watch and be vigilant and continue monitoring these places,” Chief Supt. Carlos said. (ROEL T. AMAZONA)

“We are excited but at the same time worried that the project will not be finished before October, but we are determine to finish the improvement before we celebrate another milestone year of Leyte Landing Commemoration,” Petilla said.

The park’s Eternal Flame, which was constructed during the 50th year commemoration in 1994, will be refurbished.

The Eternal Flame features dedications carved in stone tablet of countries involved at the Battle of Leyte Gulf dur-

ing World War II lead by the United States against the Japanese Forces.

The McArthur Landing Memorial National Park was damaged when the town was hit Yolanda in November 8, 2013.

For one, the statue of General Carlos P. Romulo was toppled due to the storm surge spawned by Yolanda.

Additional improvement of the park includes the construction of a two-storey building for coconut juice vendors located few meters away from the McArthur Park.

Pathways will be constructed along the tree park for people to enjoy walking under its shades.

A small bridge will be put up to have guests of the Leyte Oriental Hotel easy access to the park.

The MacArthur Landing Memorial National Park is situated in a 6.78 hectares in Barangay Candahug that features seven double-life-size bronze statues standing in a man-made pool depicting the arrival of McArthur in Leyte province, making good of his ‘I shall return’ promise.

4 tremors jolt EV on Wednesday with no report of damages

TACLOBAN CITY- Eastern Visayas was hit by four minor earthquakes on Wednesday(Jan.30) with two of these jolts’ epicenters traced to a town in Eastern Samar province.

Based on the monitoring of the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs), the first earthquake in the region was traced in San Vicente, a town in Northern Samar.

The said tremor was recorded to have occurred at 12:17 am with a 2.9 magnitude.

The second was in Mondragon town, also in North-

ern Samar with a 2.1 magnitude at about 6:41 am.

The third and fourth earth movements were felt in Hernani town, Eastern Samar.

The town of more than 8,500 people first felt the tremor at 10:21 am having a magnitude of 2.7.

And after more than an hour or about 11:27 am, the town again was hit by a tremor which has a magnitude of 4.9.

Carlo Gabora, tourism officer of the said town, said that while they have hit by a successive jolts, these were ‘minor’ and did not result to any damage.

“We both felt the two earthquakes this morning but there were no damage reported due to these incidents. We were in our office and we just stayed inside,” he said.

The last earthquake to hit the region was felt in Tacloban City, more than 130 kms from Hernani town.

The quake was felt in Tacloban City at intensity III.

Phivolcs reported that all four earthquakes were of tectonic in origin with no damage reported to areas that felt the jolts.

Office (DEO) ended 2018 with an 84.62% accomplishment of its infrastructure projects.

According to district engineer David P. Adongay Jr., Biliran-DEO surpassed the 80.87% planned target accomplishment by 3.75% as of December 31, 2018.

Out of the 60 total projects, 44 were completed and 16 are on-going.

Adongay said that the main reason for the slight delay are the implementation of big ticket projects amounting to P50 million and above.

“Medyo nadedelayed ang aming projects because of the late approval of authority to bid and implementation of these projects from the DPWH Central Office pero yung mga projects namin na below P50 million ay almost completed na,” Adongay said.

Adongay said that the

target completion date for all 2018 projects is on June, 2019.

“Hopefully we can complete this by March 2019,” Adongay added.

Under 2018 Regular Infrastructure Program, Biliran DEO has completed 18 flood control projects, four rehabilitation of bridges, four slope protections, three access roads leading to tourist destinations, three access roads leading to trades and industries and economic zones, two asphalt overlays and one drainage project.

Meanwhile, under 2018 Local Infrastructure Program, Biliran DEO has already completed four multipurpose buildings, one flood control project, one Farm-Market Road (FMR) project, one seawall project, one bay walk/breakwater project and one road concreting project. (PR)

She added that Mayor Romualdez will call for a press conference to explain why she is not seen some times at the City Hall.

An information relayed by the City Information Office to this paper said that Mayor Romualdez was in the city last week to check the condition of families resettled at the northern part of the city.

These families were relocated by the city government after their houses were totally destroyed when Tacloban City was pummeled by super typhoon 'Yolanda' in 2013.

On Thursday(Jan.31), Mayor Romualdez was at her office accepting several guests.

Vice Mayor Jerry 'Sambo' Yaokasin, in an earlier interview, said that he would not assume the post as acting mayor as long as there is no order from the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG).

As vice mayor, Yaokasin could succeed Romualdez in an acting capacity.

"As long as she signs executive orders and signs documents, I believe she is still functioning (as city mayor),"Yaokasin said.

Yaokasin is seeking for a reelection with Romualdez's husband, Alfred, seeking to reclaim the post he held for nine years.

'Proyekto 25" of E. Samar government yields improve delivery of health services

TACLOBAN CITY-A banner program under the administration of acting Governor Ferdinand Marcelo 'Dindo' Picardal of Eastern Samar dubbed as "Proyekto 25" has brought reforms to the operations of health care facilities in the province.

George Erroba, provincial administrator, said that Picardal is "fixing the bureaucracy in Eastern Samar provincial government to better serve the constituents."

"Gov. Picardal doesn't like that people have to line up and wait for a long time, so we have put up a mechanism to speed up the transactions," Erroba said.

Picardal also established a Provincial Governor's Office (PGO) in the hospitals to "immediately respond to the problems and monitor the needs of the patients" who are confined in the different health care facilities.

The PGO is an initiative of Picardal to provide transparency and good governance in the province following the goal of "Proyekto 25", Erroba added.

With the full implementation of "No Balance Billing" policy in all hospi-

tal establishments and the availability of the medicines and supplies, more people opted to go to government hospitals because of the availability of logistics, Erroba said.

He added that PhilHealth officials across the country have recognized the implementation of "No Balance Billing" in Eastern Samar.

On bed occupancy of the hospitals, Eastern Samar had served around 18, 230 in-patients (admissions) in all of its hospitals with 44 percent or 8, 194 admitted in Eastern Samar Provincial Hospital, as of November 2018.

On the average, the monthly bed occupancy rate is 80 percent.

Also, five out of nine hospitals had more than 85 percent monthly bed occupancy rate.

In 2017, the provincial average of monthly bed occupancy rate was only 48 percent but was increased to 80 percent in 2018.

On its hospital revenue, it showed that there was a 62 percent increase in the hospital income or about P100 million collection.

Tingog committed to expand LIDE into ecological industrial zone

TACLOBAN CITY—Tingog party-list has expressed commitment to expand the Leyte Industrial Development Estate (LIDE) into the proposed Leyte Ecological Industrial Zone (LEIZ), an integrated special economic zone that covers the towns of Palompon, Isabel and Ormoc City.

“We need more productive jobs in the region. This means getting our industrialization policy back on track. But we need an industrialization policy that is both responsive to our current needs and attentive to our ecological realities,” said Philip Jude Acidre, the second nominee of Tingog.

Acidre said that the objectives that were envisioned for LIDE were not fully realized.

“Almost three decades after, we have yet realized our vision of a competitive regional economy. That is why we need not only to bring more industrial locators to LIDE, but also engage with light-to-medium industries that could benefit from the infrastructure that is already in place,” he said.

Established in 1980s, LIDE is home to Philip-

pine Associated Smelting and Refining Corporation (Pasar), a copper smelting and refinery plant; Philippine Phosphate Fertilizer Corporation (Philphos), once the largest fertilizer production and processing plant in the country; and Lepanto Consolidated Mining Company, then a strong player in the minerals industry.

The estate is considered as first special economic zones in the Philippines and the centerpiece of the country’s industrialization plan.

However, Acidre said that at present there is “no initiatives to attract new locators or even upgrade the facilities located at LIDE.”

“Despite the decline in manufacturing activities in LIDE, the economic benefits that came with the industries remain,” Acidre said in a statement.

No additional industrial locators have moved into the industrial estate, he

added.

“Lepanto has since then stopped its operations while Philphos has yet to resume full operations after the 2013 Super Typhoon Yolanda,” Acidre added.

Meanwhile, Pasar is operating at half the capacity it did before the typhoon.

“Did you know that the total copper output of Pasar is more than half our country’s entire copper industry output – which we can even double if we develop further our copper industry’s downstream? Did you know that one of the by-products of copper processing is gold and silver – which can lead to the development of a local jewelry industry?” Acidre asked.

The party-list nominee maintained that the proposed LEIZ is part of Tingog’s legislative agenda to generate more jobs and uplift Eastern Visayas from poverty.

would be given permits and in turn, these concessionaires would not abuse their permits.

The massive flooding that hit Samar, particularly the Oquendo District of Calbayog City, and several towns of Northern Samar spawned by Usman, was said to have been compounded by the illegal logging activity.

Sarmiento said that Oquendo district, which is composed of 46 barangays and is near to the town of Lope de Vega, the hard-hit area of Northern Samar due to Usman, suffered a massive flooding never seen before.

“It’s the first time that this thing happened in Oquendo (District),” the Samar solon said.

Earlier, residents of Barangay Cag-anahaw, which is part of the Oquendo District, blamed the unchecked illegal logging activity in their area as the culprit why their village was practically submerged by flood water which re-

sulted to the killing of seven people.

Last January 9, a composite team that included personnel of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, soldiers of the 43rd Infantry Battalion and police personnel from the Northern Samar provincial headquarters seized more than 1,700 pieces of illegal cut lumber worth P2.8 million in Barangay Happy Valley in San Isidro, Northern Samar.

It was learned that illegal logging activity in the said area has been ongoing for years now.

The government forces could not enter the area due to the presence of the New People’s Army who reportedly are in cahoots with the illegal loggers.

Meantime, Rep. Sarmiento asked the DENR to distribute the illegally seized logs to the affected residents due to Usman which they could use in rebuilding their destroyed houses. **(JOEY A. GABIETA)**

Cleaning up Tacloban's major ways is everybody's responsibility, says official

TACLOBAN CITY – Cleaning the bodies of water located within the city should be supported by all.

Thus said Ma. Lumen Tabao, information officer of the Tacloban city government, reacting to posts in the social media referring efforts to clean the Panalaron Bay, in particular.

Tabao said that members of the Fishery Law Enforcement Team (FLET) conduct regular cleanup of the said bay which is located within the city's main public market.

But the city information officer said that most of the wastes found at the Panalaron Bay were not from the market but those coming from villages along the Mangonbangon Creek and the communities along the bay.

"We cannot control the flow of current especially during high tide. If we really want the bay to be clean, let's make this as a concerted effort and not only the City Hall that will work because the government is not only the City Hall of Tacloban," Tabao said.

Tabao added that a single cleanup drive is not enough to clean the Panalaron Bay from all wastes, adding that it would take everyone to be responsible to properly dispose their trash to ensure that this will not end up at sea.

She added that personnel of FLET and the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office have agreed to clean the bay.

"Villages along the waterways and coastline should also help in cleaning the bay by starting within their communities, avoid throwing their trash at Mangonbangon Creek and at the bay so that they will not pollute the sea," Tabao added.

Tabao, meantime, expressed her support to the An Waray party-list founder Florencio "Bem" Noel who called for volunteers
