*NPA said to demand permit to campaign, win fees*

## Chief Superintendent Carlos told candidates: No to NPA extortion

CAMP RUPERTO KANGLEON, PALO, Leyte – The region's top police officer issued a warning against elected officials, some of them are in the running in this year's elections, not to give in to the 'extortion' activity of the New People's Army (NPA).

As government officials, they should support with the government and not with the rebel group, Chief Supt. Dionardo Carlos, police regional director, said.

"The intelligence units of the PNP and military are comparing their notes. Since the start of election period this January, we started monitoring and consolidate it and submit to the general headquarters," he said.

It was learned that of the 349 government officials said to be supporting

the NPA members through financial support, in the country, some of them are from the region.

The number of government officials, ranks as high as governors, said to be giving support to the armed group of the Communist Party of the Philippines were provided by the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG).

The DILG, however, did not identify these government officials reason why Carlos could not also reveal their names though he is in favor in unmasking them.

"The people have the right to know but revealing their names must not be on my level but in the department level," the police regional director said.

During election time,

the NPA reportedly asked candidates to give them permit-to-campaign or even permit-to-win fees.

**Referring to candidates either suspended or found guilty**  
**Comelec says only final ruling could bar candidates from running**

TACLOBAN CITY- Candidates who have either been suspended or found guilty by a court are still eligible to run in this year's midterm elections.

Thus said lawyer Felisimo Embalsado, assistant regional director of the Commission on Elections (Comelec), when asked if these candidates are still qualified to run for public posts relative to the May 13 elections despite of the suspension order or been found guilty by a court meted against them.

According to Embalsado, these candidates are still entitled to run considering that they could contest the ruling by filing their motion for reconsiderations.

"There is no final decision or conviction yet in-

volving these candidates. They can still appeal their cases up to the Supreme Court under our laws," the elections assistant regional director said.

Among those in the running in this year's elections whose qualifications were put into doubt were Mayors Stephany Uy-Tan of Catbalogan City and Christopher Sheen Gonzales of Guiuan, Eastern Samar, and Rep. Milagrosa 'Mila' Tan of Samar's second congressional district.

Rep. Tan, who is running for governor of the province, was found guilty of graft case by the Sandiganbayan involving alleged anomalous procurement of medicine.

## Families fleeing in Samar town part of NPA orchestration, says Major Gen. Farnacio

CATBALOGAN CITY- The reported incident of families fleeing at their village in San Jose de Buan, Samar was orchestrated by the New People's Army (NPA) and its alleged front groups.

Thus claimed Major Gen. Raul Farnacio, commanding general of the 8th Infantry Division.

He was reacting to a report that about 42 families, consisting of 132 individuals of which 51 were children, said to have fled their village of Hagbay in San Jose de Buan last March 17, 10 days after government troops belonging to the 87th Infantry Battalion engaged NPA members in a firefight.

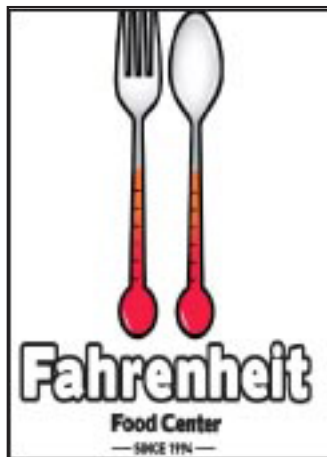
Visayas, on its social media post, said that village officials issued a warning of another encounter between the military and NPA members as more soldiers were deployed in the village.

"The main reason behind this dirty tactics being used by the terrorists is

to discredit the peace and development efforts of the CSP Team in helping conflict affected communities to progress and develop," Farnacio, in a statement, said.

Farnacio added that the mass evacuation was the same strategy being em-

# Leyte board member Villasin withdraws congressional bid to defend sister from legal woes

TACLOBAN CITY- Outgoing board member Niccolo Villasin of Leyte's second district, withdrew his congressional bid on Friday (March 22).

In a hastily called press conference after he withdrew his candidacy at the provincial office of the Commission on Elections, Villasin said that his decision was more on a 'personal reason.'

According to Villasin, he was not pressured by anyone in withdrawing from the congressional race.

The board member, who is a lawyer by profession, said that his action stemmed from his decision to defend his sister, Tacloban city councilor Ressa Villasin, who was

slapped with two counts of perjury.

Councilor Villasin, who is seeking to take the post of her brother at the provincial board, is facing perjury filed by her opponents citing discrepancy of the entry of her certificate of candidacy she filed at the provincial Comelec office.

With his decision to withdraw from the congressional post, reelectionist Rep. Henry Ong would now have to face lawyer Alberto Hidalgo and neophyte Karen Javier as his opponents. (LIZBETH ANN A. ABELLA)

## Tacloban village has a new evacuation center built under the Pacific Partnership program

TACLOBAN CITY- A newly- built evacuation facility located in Barangay 107, Santa Elena, this city, built under the Pacific Partnership was formally turnover on March 22 to the villagers .

According to Capt. Randy Van Rossum, mission commander for Pacific Partnership 2019, the facility is one of the many examples of multilateral efforts for a common good and in fostering friendship and collaboration between the US and the Philippines.

The collaboration of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) and US Armed Forces exemplified what Pacific Partnership came to do, he added.

"Learn from one another, working complete collaboration, and to live their combined mark in profoundly positive way.

The impact of disaster emergency transcend corners and requires comprehensive preparation and coordination among nations for effective disaster response," Van Rossum said in his speech.

"Like this facility, the impact of Pacific Partnership 2019 will last long after the mission ends here today. This morning, I'm happy to celebrate this lasting impact with all of you," he added.

The two-storey evacuation center, which could also serve as a multi- purpose center, was built at a cost of about \$98,000 or P5 million(at P52 against a dollar) that could accommodate 60 persons

"We humbly thank you for a very memorable gift to our people that can be used by our children and the next generation to come,"

Letecia Olino, barangay chairman of Santa Elena, said in her speech.

"The Philippine-American friendship is always cherished by us and the partnership has always been welcome. Thank you, not only for your support, but also for the humanitarianism effort you had served us here in Santa Elena. Thank you very much," Olino added.

The ribbon-cutting ceremony was led by the US Major General Arthur Logan, Mission Cmdr. Capt. Rossum, Col. Tan, and Honorable Olino.

## Task force formed to remove unlawful campaign materials

MAASIN CITY- The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) field office here is bracing for the removal of prohibited campaign materials in compliance to the Commission on Election (Comelec) rules.

District Engineer Ma. Margarita Junia said their office will deploy nine teams with at least four members on March 29 that will join Comelec and the Philippine National Police (PNP) in the lawful campaign drive.

The poll body has set the rules for campaigning through Comelec Resolution No. 10488 or the "Implementing Rules and Regulations of the Fair Elections Act of May 2019 elections."

"The Comelec will spearhead the activity to determine whether these campaign paraphernalia are legal and posted on designated ar-

eas or not. DPWH will provide the manpower for the removal of campaign materials while PNP will provide security personnel," said Junia.

DPWH Southern Leyte will meet with Comelec and PNP officials to discuss plans and preparations for the synchronized "Operation Baklas" program in Southern Leyte on March 25.

The poll body has allowed the following sizes for the materials in common poster areas: 12 feet x 16 feet, (for political parties and party-list groups), 4 feet and 6 feet, (for independent candidate), and 2 feet x 3 feet (for individual posters).

During public rallies and meetings, considered as lawful are streamers not exceeding 3 feet by 8 feet in size displayed at the site and on the occasion of a public meeting or rally.

According to Comelec rules, said streamers maybe displayed five

days before the date of the meeting or rally and should be removed within 24 hours after said meeting or rally.

Candidates may not put up campaign materials at highways, bridges, center islands, flyover, sky walks, under pass, trees and other public places not designated as common poster areas.

Display or exhibit of any election campaign or propaganda material outside of authorized common poster areas, in public places, or in private properties without the consent of the owner is deemed illegal.

In headquarters or residence of candidates, only lawful campaign paraphernalia may be displayed.

The election period for candidates running for national positions has started on February 12. For local candidates, the campaign period will kick off on March 29. (PR)

## In Eastern Samar P10-M agri-tech building softly opens in Balangiga town

BORONGAN CITY- Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Director General Isidro Lapeña led in the soft opening of an agri-technology building in Balangiga town on March 15.

The P10 million worth of building is at the Balangiga National Agricultural School (BANAS), a TESDA technology institution.

Lapeña said the building is the realization of their expansion program to accommodate more

clients.

"With the new agri-tech building, more students in animal production and agricultural crops production will enroll," Lapeña told the small crowd of TESDA employees, school employees, students, and

parents who attended the simple program.

"With the expansion of TESDA programs, we hope to contribute to address the poverty incidence in this area," he added,

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# Police capable of responding cybercrimes; issues safety guide to netizens

TACLOBAN CITY- Cybercrime is a “massive” global problem but the Philippine National Police (PNP) is ready to respond to it.

Police Superintendent Ma Bella Rentuaya, spokesperson of the Police Regional Office (PRO) in the region, said this following their continued information drive on Republic Act (RA) 10175 also known as “Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012.”

Rentuaya said that their Regional Anti-Cybercrime Unit (RACU) is ready to assist those who are victimized by various crimes through a computer or internet.

Cybercrimes include identity theft, bullying, il-

legal recruitment, human trafficking, pornography, fraud, scam, estafa, libel, threats, extortions, robbery, and terrorism, among others.

Police Chief Inspector Romenito Mondoñedo, head of RACU in the region, told the public to report any cybercrime incident through their hotline 0998-5988-113.

In a statement, he said the RACU can respond to cybercrimes through computer network log analysis and forensic examination of the computer, video, cell-phone/mobile, and others.

To prevent from being victimized by cybercriminals, the police has issued “do’s and don’ts” to the public in accessing or engaging social media.

Important safety tips to consider in using social media are:

Change the Facebook (FB) password every month with a minimum of 12 special characters; do not accept friend invitations without scrutinizing the profile of the requester; be cautious in opening/clicking websites as it may contain viruses or may compromise your account; when placing an order through online shopping, make sure it is cash upon delivery (COD) and no advance payment should be made; only transact business with trusted sellers and do not deal with online networking; and social media accounts should not be publicized.

## Popcom continues mandate under NEDA supervision

TACLOBAN CITY- “Population program is not only aimed at population control. It is focused mainly on population policies, plans and programs in the pursuit of socio-economic development reforms,” Commission on Population (POP-COM) Undersecretary Juan Antonio Perez III said.

During the Regional Population Executive Board (RPEB) meeting held recently at the Sal’s Restaurant in this city, POPCOM-related concerns were discussed, particularly the Executive Order (EO) 71, an Order Renaming the Popcom as Commission on Population and Development, and reverting its attachment from the Department of Health (DOH) to the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA).

According to Perez, “Although there is a change in agency’s name, it does not mean that the programs will stop. The implementation of the population programs will continue.”

The Popcom chief also clarified and reiterated the provision of the said Executive Order.

“With the said order aimed to strengthen the development and implementation by the Popcom of population-related policies and programs, there is a need to enhance its coordination with NEDA, considering that NEDA is the authority primarily responsible in formulating continuing, coordinated and fully integrated social and economic policies, plans and programs,” he said.

Perez added that the renaming of the POP-COM is also one way to enlighten us with the view that population and development is based on rights and matters that relate not only to the health of women, but also their rights and the right to the development of countries.

To recall, Presidential Decree No. 79, otherwise known as the Revised Population Act of the Philippines created the Commission on Population under the Office of the President primarily aimed to formulate and adopt coherent, integrated and comprehensive long-term plans, programs and recommendations on population policies geared towards

economic and social development.

PD 79 includes undertaking a national program for family planning involving both public and private sectors which respect religious beliefs and values of our citizens. However, the said agency was attached to the Department of Health (DOH) per Executive Order 188, series of 2003.

“President Duterte acknowledged the continuing importance of Presidential Decree 79, as its implementing policies relates to economic and social development. But since the policy is not just a health policy but likewise has a socio-economic implication, talking on the socio-economic agenda of the Philippine Development Plan,” he said adding that reverting its attachment to the NEDA finds it more appropriate.

EO 71, which was signed on December 13, 2018, is also one of the identified strategies under the Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022 with the goal to increase the country’s potential economic growth. (LDL/GTTabao/PIA-8 Leyte)

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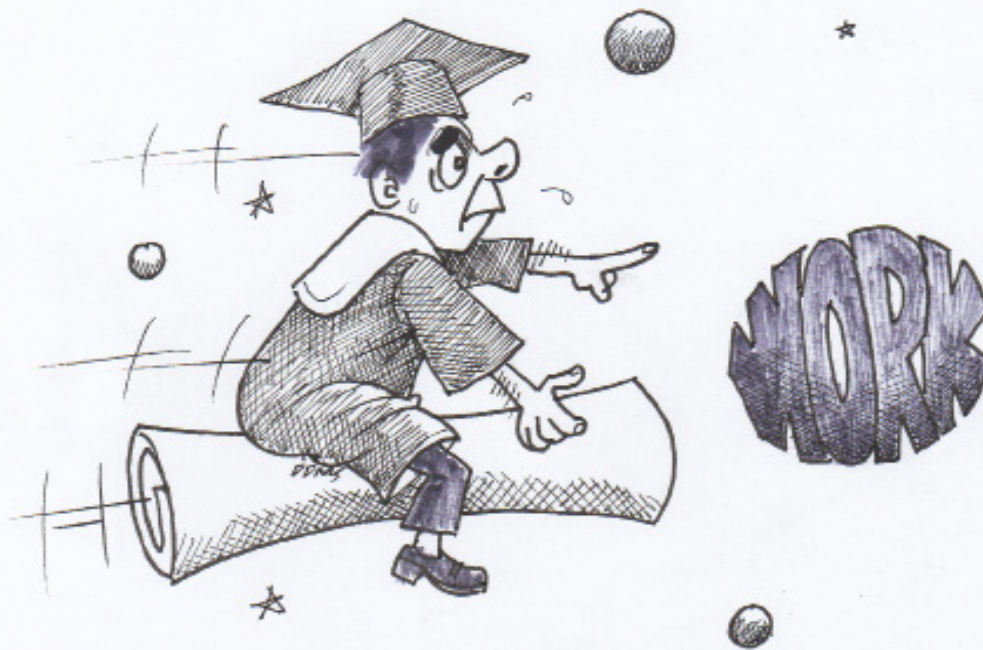
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## It's graduation time

### Prepare for the worst scenario

IF we are truly smart and clever, which is what Christ himself told us when he said, “Be wise as serpents and innocent as doves,” (Mt 10,16) we would be preparing for the worst scenario every time we plan or launch a project, a business, an enterprise.  
This is simply because despite our best efforts to plan these projects well, there is always the possibility that the exact opposite of what we expect would happen. Preparing for the worst scenario may mean that we come out with various alternative plans so that we can move on. This is always commendable. But we have to remember that the most important way to prepare



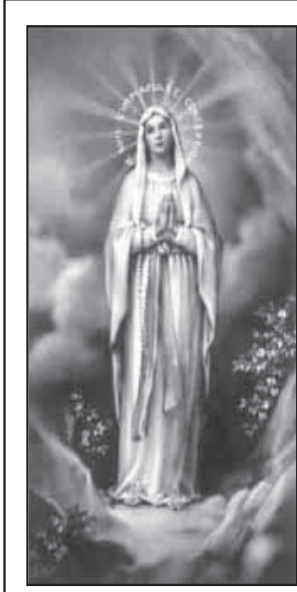

### Judges in Narcolist

Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) Chief Aaron Aquino divulged that 13 Judges and 10 Prosecutors are included in President Duterte’s list of personalities allegedly involved in the illegal drug trade – but the PDEA has no plan yet to release their names.  
The PDEA had some frustrations in dealing with the judiciary especially when there are drug cases dismissed and suspects are acquitted. There was one instance when PDEA was even accused of planting evidence that led to the acquittal of the daughter of a convicted drug trafficker in Manila.  
The PDEA is frustrated that their efforts are wasted with the dismissal of cases they have filed. Drug money is big money and some members of the judiciary might be unable to resist

payoffs large enough bigger than their retirement pay. Corruption in the judiciary is surely a factor behind the readiness of the policemen to resort to extrajudicial means of neutralizing illegal drug people.  
However, the Constitu-

tion guarantee the presumption of innocence. Evidence must be presented and strong cases built against the judges and prosecutors. The government must make sure it will win the legal battle.  
The involvement of judges and prosecutors is probable because of money involved but government must ensure that there is proof beyond reasonable doubt in pinning down the crooks and spare the innocent to avoid destroying their names and reputations. Baseless and malicious accusations can cause irreparable damage to a person’s reputation. It will damage not only the person but his whole family.

# Scientists work to curb PH's plastic waste problem

TACLOBAN CITY -- The National Academy of Science and Technology (NAST) has been gathering ideas from scientists and researchers nationwide to put an end to plastic pollution in the country.

At the end of the two-day Visayas Regional Scientific Meeting held at the Summit Hotel here Friday, NAST president Rhodora Azanza said plastic pollution has become a major concern being a central feature in modern living.

Azanza said they have been holding meetings in the country's three island groups to learn from one another, share opinions, and produce significant recommendations to curb plastic pollution.

"If we decide as a group, we will recommend to appropriate bodies. We need everybody's help to campaign against plastic use," he told reporters.

The city is the host of the Visayas regional scientific meeting on March 20-21. The gathering is anchored on the theme, "Caring for our country's carrying capacity".

This is the first scientific

meeting this year. Other gatherings will be held in Alaminos, Pangasinan in April for Luzon and in General Santos City, South Cotabato in May for Mindanao.

NAST is eyeing to synthesize all recommendations in an annual meeting July. The output will be presented to the House of Representatives, Senate, and Cabinet officials.

Fabian Dayrit, NAST academician and professor of Ateneo de Manila University, said about 15 percent of solid waste in the country is made up of plastic materials and the volume is consistently rising due to increasing demand.

"The management of plastic waste must be based on an understanding of the physic-chemical nature of the various plastics, in particular, their polymer composition and properties. Strategies to minimize plastic pollution should consider the different types of plastic pollution: macro pollutants, microplastics, microfibers, and chemical additives," Dayrit said.

The waste management strategy of 3Rs -- reduce, re-use, and recycle -- must

be augmented with a fourth strategy: redesign, according to Dayrit.

"New management strategies for plastics now advocate for a circular economy, which includes the conversion of waste plastic into raw materials and the development of new polymers and plastic materials," he added.

The scientific meetings decided to make plastic pollution as the main topic after plastics were found in the digestive systems of dead dolphins and whales.

NAST said the Philippines had been identified by Ocean Conservatory in its 2015 report as a significant contributor to the plastic found in the world's oceans.

Citing studies, NAST revealed that the country generates some 2.7 million metric tons of plastic waste with more than 50 percent find its way to bodies of water.

NAST is an attached agency of the Department of Science and Technology mandated by law to advise the President and Cabinet on matters related to science and technology.

“There will be 54,000 blood units that will be collected from 4Ps families based on the 20 percent target,” Gorgonia said adding that this was based on the 270,000 4Ps families in the region.

If this will be materialized, he said, this will be more than the required one percent blood donor

collection target based on the total population in the region of over 4.79 million in 2018.

Based on the DOH data on the 2018 Distribution of Whole Blood Donation in Eastern Visayas, the total blood donation was only 31,724 or only 67 percent.

Blood donations from the local government units had the biggest share with 14,953, DOH with 11,631, Philippine Red Cross with 4,365 and 775 from the private donors.

Gorgonia proposed to the regional blood council to advocate to 4Ps families

to donate blood on a voluntary basis during their regular family development sessions (FDS) in their respective communities. He also proposed that 4Ps Municipal Links to be the blood donor recruitment officers.

The members of the council are mulling for the drafting of a memorandum of agreement (MOA) from concerned national government agencies like the Department of Social Welfare and Development, DOH and the EVRMC for the said purpose. **(LDL/RSV/PIA-8, Biliran)**

# SSU, EVSU to vie for EVCAA crown

TACLOBAN CITY- Samar State University (SSU) and Eastern Visayas State University (EVSU) posted hard-earned victories against their respective foes in the semifinals of the Eastern Visayas Collegiate Athletic Association (EVCAA) Men's Basketball on March 23, 2019 at the Tacloban City Convention Center.

The SSU Sharks outlasted the hard-fighting Biliran Province State University (BiPSU) Tigers, 100-92, while the EVSU Eagles tamed the never say die University of Eastern Philippines (UEP) Bulls, 95-85.

In the first semis duel, the Sharks and the Tigers engaged in a nip and tuck affair as they literally exchanged baskets in a fast-paced game until the final minutes of the ballgame.

The change of complexion came with four minutes left in the game and the Tigers on top by two, 89-87, when the Sharks leaned on the late-game heroics of Elmer Abanag to seal the triumph and for them to punch a ticket to the finals.

Abanag scored seven points in the dying minutes of the match capped by a dagger 3-pointer that dashed the hopes of the Biliranons who seemed to have lost steam when the game matters most.
