TACLOBAN CITY- More than 1.27 million students are expected to troop to their schools across the region on Monday (June 3) as the Department of Education (DepEd) said that it is strictly implementing the no collection policy.

Ramir Uytico, DepEd regional director, said that students should expect that their classes will start on Monday as all teachers are ready to start their classes.

Tacloban City gov't to kick-off Sangyaw Festivities on June 1

TACLOBAN CITY- Preparations are underway for the month-long Sangyaw Festivities which is due to start this coming Saturday, June 1, 2019, with a motorcade that will pass through the city's main thoroughfares at around 4 pm.

At least 40 vehicles will join the convoy that will signal the formal opening of the annual celebration in honor of Senor Sto. Niño.

The Grand Opening Program at the Sangyawan Grounds (Balyu-an Grounds) will follow shortly at 6 pm with the concert of popular Rock Band Razorback.

Several programs of activities are being prepared for the festival by the city government of Tacloban

through the leadership of Mayor Cristina G. Romualdez in part-

nership with the different religious and civic sectors in Tacloban.

Among the main events of this year's festivities themed "Happiest Fiesta" is the Sangyaw Parade of Lights on June 29.

The Parade of Lights features creatively decorated and brightly lighted floats and dance contingents performing ritual dance routines.

Other highlights are the

Miss Tacloban Coronation Night on June 22, the Sangyaw Foundation Ball and Balik Tacloban Night on June 26, among others.

Nightly performances at the Sangyawan Music Festival featuring local and Manila-based bands, along with a number of Variety Shows will be starting at 6 pm on June 1.

Gov't to spend P500 million relative to the 500th First Mass anniversary in 2021

MAASIN CITY – The infrastructure project intended for the celebration of the 500 years of the First Easter Mass in Asia will need around P200 million.

This was disclosed by Southern Leyte Governor Damian Mercado who said that the funding will come from the national government, particularly from the Department of Tourism.

“The provincial government will have a counterpart of P30 million or 15 percent of the budget,” Gov. Mercado said.

The 500th year of the First Mass will be held in 2021.

Infrastructure projects for the 500 years celebration includes the construction of 30 feet cross overlooking Limasawa Island that will have restaurant and a café, a shrine and a chapel.

“Some residents are to

be relocated because their houses are located in the area where these projects are to be built,” Mercado said.

“The provincial government had already bought a lot where they will be relocated and we also bought the properties within the project site so that when it begins the national government will not face any problem,” Mercado added.

The province bought the property for P7 million.

Last week, the provincial government with DOT8 Regional Director Karina Rosa Tiopes, Limasawa Mayor Melchor Petracorta, Diocese of Maasin as represented by Fr. Dennis Cagant and the event technical team met to talk for updates for this monumental event in Philippine history and to Christian faith.

“Most of our discussion was focused on the updates,” Mercado said.

DOT8 heads the committee for the fifth centennial celebration of the First Mass, with the provincial government as co-chair, while members were the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) and the local government unit of Limasawa.

In its earlier full council meeting in June this year, the RDC issued Resolution No. 32 which endorsed the request for support and funding requirements of the 500th celebration to concerned agencies.

Aside from the DOT, the Department of Transportation also implemented a project in Limasawa Island to ease travel of tourists and guest who will be visiting the town in 2021 by constructing a new port in the eastern part of the island closer to Barangay Magallanes where the major activities are to be held.

PhilMech launches Regional Technology Management and Demo Center in E. Visayas

ABUYOG, Leyte—Many years ago no one even imagine that a one-stop shop Technology Management and Demo Center that will feature various farm equipment and machineries (of all sizes and shapes) could be set up right here in Eastern Visayas or Region 8.

But today, local farmers here couldn't believe that the impossible suddenly became possible. All because something very significant happened inside the Abuyog Experiment Station in Balinsasayao, Abuyog, Leyte.

Unknown to many, the Philippine Center for Postharvest Dev't and Mechanization (PhilMech), an attached agency of the Department of Agriculture, was silently constructing its own satellite office inside the DA Research Station in this part of Region 8.

In close collaboration with DA-RFO 8, PhilMech started a big leap by way of building a P3 million-worth of Technology Management and

Demonstration Center fully furnished and equipped with various kinds of farm machineries that any progressive farmer right away wants to possess or use as his or her own.

Earlier today, said infrastructure project, including a wide range of farm machineries have been inaugurated or launch as part of the annual observance of Farmers' and Fisherfolk's Month Celebration.

The launch has been spearheaded by a team of agricultural engineers of PhilMech led by its Deputy Director Raul R. Paz, who incidentally hails from Carigara, Leyte.

Accordingly, said facility will afford farmers the opportunity to gain access to information and technology services, with the ultimate end of commercializing PhilMech-invented postharvest and farm processing equipment or machineries.

On the part of the DA-RFO8, Farmer Director Inocencio Morallos who

PSA says EV's inflation rate decreased by 0.1 percent on April

TACLOBAN CITY—The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) reported that the region's inflation rate last month stood at 2 percent.

The latest inflation rate is relatively lower compared to previous month's 2.1 percent inflation rate, Wilma Perante, PSA regional director said.

The decline of the regional inflation rate was due to the decrease of prices of basic commodities like rice, she added.

The April inflation rate of Eastern Visayas is said to be the third lowest among the country's regions.

Among the provinces, Leyte posted the fastest increase on prices of goods and services at 3.5 percent, followed by Southern Leyte, 2.0 percent, Eastern Samar, 1.8 percent and Northern Samar at 1.6 percent.

DepEd allots P35M for repair of quake-damaged schools

BORONGAN CITY- The Department of Education (DepEd) has allotted P35 million for the repair of damaged school buildings in San Julian town, Easter Samar.

It can be recalled that on April 23, 2019, a strong earthquake with 6.5 magnitude rocked Eastern Visayas with San Julian town as the epicenter.

Engineers noticed cracks in some bridges and roads right after the quake.

Personnel from the Department of Public Works and Highways immediately repaired the roads.

In the schools, a team of DepEd engineers assessed the school buildings.

They have identified classrooms in San Julian Central School, San Ju-

lian National High School, Libas Elementary School, Pagbabangnan Elementary School, and Nena National High School as defective and needed repair.

As to the start of the repair, Montallana said, "Repairs will be done immediately once the Special Allotment Release Order (SARO) comes in, I think this June."

Old site declared as prone to landslide by MGB Tag-abaca Elementary School in Leyte town relocated to safer location

Tag-abaca Elementary School (TES) is a multi-grade school located in the far-flung barangay of Tag-abaca in the municipality of Leyte, Leyte.

In the year 2014 after the typhoon 'Henry', the school grounds and buildings developed some cracked and erosions due to heavy rains.

The school head requested the local government unit and Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) to conduct ocular inspection of the said school.

Based upon the findings of the MGB, the school site of TES is prone to landslide. The MGB with the implementation of the 2nd phase of the National Geohazard Mapping and Assessment Program aimed at disaster risk reduction had conducted field assessment for landslide and flood hazard sometimes June 18-26, 2014.

Field assessment showed that Brgy. Tag-abaca is one of the villages in Leyte town that are prone to landslides reason for the immediate transfer of the school to safer location.

Consequently, after a month of survey by the MGB, heavy rains occurred which resulted to major

ground cracks evidently observed at the site of the school which affected the structural integrity of its buildings.

Presidential Decree 1096 otherwise known as the National Building Code of the Philippine specifically under section 215 provides that when any building or structure found to be dangerous, building officials shall order its repair, vacation, or demolition, depending upon the degree of danger to life, health or safety.

In the case of structures within the school of TES in Brgy. Tag-abaca declared by Municipal Engr. May Wen Beth P. Sabite that buildings to be unsafe for occupancy and immediate transfer of the structures was highly recommended.

The teacher-in-charge of TES, Mrs. Marilou N. Go, initiated in looking/soliciting land donor for the new site for the school for its immediate relocation.

Fortunately, the heirs of Muertegui families donated one hectare for the new school site of TES last 2015.

Finally, last January 2015, TES transferred/relocated to the new site with the help of barangay offi-

cial.

At present, TES has a total of 167 pupils, offering Kinder to Grade 6 respectively. The government has a mission to deliver quality and equitable basic education to all Filipino children.

But this government's vision could not be realized due to lack of conducive classroom buildings for the learners as there are still schools which uses makeshift classrooms.

This shortage of classrooms could be addressed by seeking donations either from government agencies like the Department of Education, local government unit or nongovernment organization.

In the case of TES, the AGAPP Foundation donated one unit two-classrooms and school supplies of the learners.

At the moment, TES has an ongoing two-storey with classroom school building from the Department of Education.

TES is the first recipient school of a two-storey building in the municipality of Leyte.

DPWH Samar II employees, salute to a clean flag of the Philippines

CATBALOGAN CITY- All employees and some field personnel of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)- Samar II joined the simultaneous flag ceremonies synchronized with all government agencies, ground owned and control corporation, and LGUs nationwide during the National Flag Day Celebration.

Emilio Aguinaldo to signify victory over Spanish colonialism in a historic battle of Alapan in Imus Cavite.

"Stop and Salute" is the present campaign of Salute to a Clean Flag movement - a non-political citizen's initiative that aims to reignite patriotism through the abundant and proper display of the Philippine Flag.

This movement aims to spark renewed respect and love for the Philippine flag, through the re-education of the private sector in proper and visible flag management.

This celebration is the year's project of National Historical Commission of the Philippines (NHCP) and Pronov Tai International Property Consultants.

The DPWH issued a memorandum dated May 16, 2019 signed by

B. Elizabeth Yap, Assistant Secretary for Support Services, directing all Undersecretaries, Asst. Secretaries, Bureau Directors, Regional Directors, Heads of UPMOs, and District Engineers to actively take part of the said national celebration.

During the flag ceremony, Creole Montallana, Administrative Officer (AO) thanked the DPWH Samar II management and to all employees for showing their respect to the one flag of the country which symbolizes victory and unity of every Filipino.

"I think we succeeded, we were united as one. There was no color, no height, and no odor. At least we are one Filipino saluting to one flag and that is the flag of the Republic of the Philippines", he said.

safe and comfortable homes to live in and other gadgets in our house for our entertainment; television, radio, air conditioning or at least electric fans – for comfort.


We work to earn money for use of the above needs. A good number seek employment in public and private establishments. Others go into their own income-generating activities to earn money.

Atty. Glenn Chong a Senatorial candidate has bravely exposed the alleged cheating by SMARTMATIC by scrap-


ping his name in the vote counting machines. He mentioned several provinces that did it. He claimed he had all the evidence to prove his point.

We are not God's puppets


We understand that freedom as the freedom of

Confirmed?

Some sectors viewed the order of the president to Comelec to dispose Smartmatic as an implied confirmation that there was fraud in the vote counting. The president reportedly issued the order in his meeting with the Filipino community during his visit to Japan, saying "I would like to advise Comelec now, I won't delay this: Dispose of that Smartmatic and look for a new one that is free of fraud". The instruction for Comelec to look for a new entity that is free of fraud is a subtle statement that Smartmatic's system is tainted with fraud. The statement came after the recent midterm elections where glitches in the automated counting had caused serious doubts on the integrity and honesty of the elections.

Notwithstanding the multifarious complaints raised from various quarters, mainly on the circumstances that transpired

during the hours that transmission of canvass was halted due to reasons beyond the knowledge and understanding of the electorate. It appears that the issues had remained unexplained by Smartmatic to satisfy all doubts lingering in the public mind. Results of the national canvas was declared complete and winners were proclaimed pending resolution of the issues.

All clouds hovering over the credibility of the midterm elections remained as doubts as doubters have yet to gather evidences in support of their allegations. The sectors questioning the canvass of votes deduced their conclusions on reports emanating from the precinct level. There were calls for manual counting in the precincts where there were failure in the transmission of results and from the counting machines with defective secured disk cards. The process could be a good way to dispel all doubts and

DILG urges governors, mayors to create Local Governance Transition Teams

TACLOBAN CITY-The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) through Director Artemio B. Caneja urged Local Chief Executives (LCEs) in Eastern Visayas especially those outgoing officials to initiate the creation of the Local Governance Transition Team.

Regional Director Caneja revealed that it is imperative to prepare for an effective turnover of responsibility as part of ensuring continuity in local governance, as enunciated by Secretary Eduardo Año.

Pursuant to Memorandum Circular 2019-39, the team is responsible in conducting an inventory of the properties of their respective LGUs. These include the immovable properties such as the land, buildings, infrastructure facilities and its improvements, and machineries made immovable as well as the movable

properties like the vehicles, office equipment, furniture, fixtures, and office supply stocks, among others.

Director Caneja said all official documents and/or records of LGU official transactions such as, but not limited to, Governance Assessment Report (CY 2018) and Commission on Audit Report (CY 2018) should be gathered, secured, and preserved by the newly elected and reelected officials.

Furthermore, the officials are directed to conduct turnover of accountabilities using the prescribed forms. They should as well organize a turnover ceremony that will include briefing on the Governance Assessment Report and key challenges to incoming set of officials to ensure a smooth local governance transition.

The DILG8 chief likewise encouraged them to accomplish and submit the Elective Local Official Per-

sonal Data Sheet (ELOPDS) not later than July 8 to their respective Human Resource Management Offices, Sanggunian, and DILG city/municipal office.

The newly-elected and reelected officials will also undergo the Program for Newly-Elected Officials (NEO) led by the Local Government Academy (LGA) which will train them on how to become effective leaders.

The NEO Program has five major components which shall be open to all elected local officials. The five components of the program are: (1) Ensuring Smooth Transition; (2) Jumpstarting Local Governance; (3) Creating the Roadmap for LGU Development; (4) Sharpening the Competencies of NEOs and Functionalities; and (5) LGU Performance Management. Earthquake safety at school

It's good to be prepared always, thus the need to strengthen the capacity of schools to enable them to respond in the event of disasters and emergencies to save more lives and ensure resilience.

Recently, the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) has warned of a possible strong earthquake in Leyte as the Philippine Fault in the province never had significant shaking in more than 100 years.

Aiming for disaster resilience, Gov. E. Jaro Elementary School (GEJES) in Babatngon II District has initiated its disaster risk reduction (DRR) programs that prepare students and teachers for different disasters.

According to Head Valentin C. Trapela, the school regularly conducts earthquake drills.

"All students and teachers participate in the regular drills, where they pass through the designated routes to evacuate," Trapela said.

Trapela emphasized the importance of preparing for earthquakes through regular drills, as the province of Leyte is prone to earthquakes, and earthquakes are more difficult to predict.

Barangay Gov. E. Jaro, where the school is located is also prone to flood, being located near Bagahupi River.

But Trapela said it is easier to predict floods. "We can see it coming, and people can make announce-

ment (June 9), barangay day (June 12), government employees' night (June 14), market vendors night (June 17), socio-civic organizations night (June 18), business night (June 19), and educators night (June 21). (RONALD O. REYES)

ments right away. Unlike with earthquakes, there aren't announcements for that, except when it actually happens, then that's when you respond. That's why we focus on having earthquake drills," Trapela said.

Aside from strengthening the capacity of the school, GEJES has also bolstered its partnership with different agencies for the promotion of volunteerism, humanitarian values, and culture of safety and health through trainings on life saving and first aid.

The local Philippine National Police (PNP) and Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) and the local government unit have been active partners for activities and programs involving disaster risk reduction. These technical assistance strengthens the capacity of the school and help minimize and efficiently respond to the impact of disasters.

This also becomes an opportunity for the school officials to ask the PNP and BFP for evaluations and recommendations, either written or oral, and uses then to improve the program.

"We study the evaluations. Whatever they point as weaknesses, that's what we keep in mind for improvement. What they point out as okay, that's what we maintain," Trapela

said.

Every year, GEJES boosts the disaster awareness and preparedness through the conduct of quarterly nationwide simultaneous earthquake drills (NSED).

Trapela meanwhile hoped that GEJES' DRR programs will equip all members of the GEJES community with the knowledge and skills to prepare for any kind of disaster.

"We urge our students to take earthquake drills seriously so they would know what to do when a strong tremor happens. We also asked them to share what they learned in the drills to their families," Trapela said.

The Leyte Island fault line is part of the 1,200 kilometer-long Philippine fault zone, a major tectonic feature that transects the while Philippine archipelago from northwestern Luzon to southeastern Mindanao.

The presence of active fault zone have put some areas in Eastern Visayas as high risk to earthquakes.

"As they say, it's good to be prepared," he said.

Authorities seized hot lumbers in Ormoc City

ORMOC CITY- Authorities in Ormoc City retrieved about 2,000 board feet of illegally cut lumbers in Barangay Cabintan, this city, on Thursday (May 30).

Mayor Richard Gomez and police operatives including personnel from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources lead the team who confiscated the abandoned lumber of Lawaan and Nato tree species.

Lawaan is a popular material in making cabinet, furniture and guitar while Nato is a strong wood that is usually used for making guitar neck.

"These are taken from the mountainous part of the city because these are far from the authorities and they have plenty of time to cut," Gomez said.

But some residents in upland communities are providing information to authorities that resulted to confiscation of these hot lumbers, the city mayor said.

"Eventually they are caught because residents are giving information to authorities if they noticed that there are illegal cutting activities in their area," Gomez said.

The recent incident, however, did not result to

the arrest of suspects.

Authorities will be conducting investigation to determine the identities of the suspects so they could file a case against them for violating PD 705 otherwise known as the "Revised Forestry Code of the Philippines."

The confiscated lumber are now in the custody of the Ormoc City Police Office.

"If there are people who owned a tree and wanted it to be cut, they should seek permit from the DENR, but if they will cut it illegally these will be confiscated," Gomez said.

Philippines struggle to check its growing population

TACLOBAN CITY- Jason and his wife Nilda (names withheld upon their request) don't really want to have another child.

"The original plan is my wife will have ligation. But it didn't push through because she felt afraid. So we decided to use pills, then after three years she got pregnant. We were caught by surprise," said Jason, 41.

His wife, 39, is now three months pregnant of their fifth child.

"I did not know that my wife was taking the pills on and off. For our first three children, we used rhythm method, followed by pills," said the father of four children ages 14, 9, 4, and 3.

Jason, however, said that they were not able to consult a health professional on what kind of contraceptive that is suited for

them.

"We've decided to consult a doctor when we found out that she's already pregnant," Jason said.

Undersecretary Juan Antonio Perez III, executive director of the Commission on Population and Development (Popcom), said the national government is aiming to bring down the fertility rate of the Filipino women and lessen the prevalence of unwanted pregnancy.

From the current 2.7 fertility rate, the government is working on lowering it to just 2.1.

"Filipino women only wanted to have two children but they end up having almost three," said Perez as he went around the country to push for the National Program on Family Planning Towards Better Health

Outcome, Poverty Reduction and Socio Economic Development in line with the Philippine Development Plan for 2017-2022 under the administration of President Rodrigo Duterte.

However, this goal of the government limiting the number of children has meet objections from the Church.

"Setting a kind of quota of how many children married couples should have is simply ridiculous. What is needed is to encourage everyone to be generous, faithful, and responsible in begetting children," said Fr. Roy Cimagala from Cebu City as he opposed the plan.

While the government continues to hurdle the challenges in implementing its Reproductive Health Law, Cimagala said that "it is just fortuitous that

the government cannot effectively implement that unjust law that is clearly against human rights and God's will."

Usec. Perez said that family and population management as critical component and strategy of the socio-economic agenda of the national government.

As this developed, Duterte threw his strong political support to the Philippine Population Management Program and placed the Popcom as new attachment to the National Economic

Development Authority (NEDA) to “carry out the full and intensified implementation of the national program on population and family planning.”

The plan has targeted outcome of zero unmet need for modern family planning method, modern contraceptive prevalence rate of 65 percent, increase use of Family Planning method among males, zero gap between actual and wanted fertility, and adolescent birthrate of 40 per 1,000 adolescent women (15-19 years old).

Perez admitted that the poorest among Filipinos are those who have more children, saying that Filipinos have 4.3 children when

they only want 2.9 children.

The Popcom official said that the challenges being faced by the government in the implementation of its population program include low acceptance and accessibility of family planning services particularly among poor couples and individuals, inadequate budgetary support, low coverage of promotional and demand generation activities, inadequate commodities and family planning service providers and workers especially in the rural and remote areas and slow impact to social, economic and development.

In its April 2019 report, the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) said the country's population increased by 1.6% annually from 2010 to 2019.

The average annual rate is faster than India with 1.2%, China with 0.5%, and even the United States with 0.7%.

“Despite remarkable achievements in the past five decades, much more must be done to break the barriers that prevent women, men and couples from fully exercising their reproductive rights and choices,” the UNFPA said.

While the world youth population (ages 15 to 24) is projected to rise to 1.4 billion in 2050 from the current 1.2 billion, the commission is also challenged in educating young Filipino people on the government's population program.

“Teenage pregnancy in the Philippines is on the rise, in fact, the data derived from the certificates of live births submitted by the Local Civil Registry of-

office from 2011 to 2014 show that about one in every 10 women of child-bearing age was a teenager, and there were 24 babies born every hour by teenage mother,” said Reyhan Arinto, Information Officer of the commission in Eastern Visayas region.

“Thus, we bring the orientation and the information drive directly to our schools where many teenagers already start to engage into sexual activities and prevent them from doing such and in one way or another delay their sexual debut,” he added.

The youth population comprised of about 20.1 million, half of which are adolescents aged 15-19 sailing for adulthood in the next few years, the commission said.

how to pray, we also provide lessons on rights awareness and health issues,” said Lieutenant Colonel Ma. Bella Rentuaya, the police regional spokesperson.

Police patrolwoman Florlyn Gapul, who is assisting the children inside the chapel, said the holding of Flores de Mayo inside the camp “is not something new.”

The Santacruzán, a novena procession culminating the Flores de Mayo, is participated by selected beautiful young ladies and children wearing extravagant costumes, bedecked with accessories and escorted by well-chosen fine young men in every neighborhood.

The center of attraction during the Santacruzán are those that will act the role of Reyna Elena, in honor of St. Helena, and Constantine,

usually a young man clutching a crucifix to symbolize the finding of the “True Cross in Jerusalem.”

Flores de Mayo in the Philippines, with its long Catholic tradition of devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, said to start in 1854 after the proclamation of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

“Most of the police are Catholics. We really observe tradition, Catholic rites,” she said.

While Gapul admitted that she noticed the apparent “gap” on the perception of the public to the police amid the brutal drug war campaign of President Rodrigo Duterte, she however said that they are doing the Catholic tradition for children every month of May “to bridge the gap.”

Gapul she said that the holding of Flores de Mayo brings out the “soft side” of the police.

“We are also human, we have hearts. Even though we are in the authority, we also believed that Jesus Christ is the real authority. We are led by God. In my case, I feel I cannot really do what other rogue police were doing because I am guided by God,” said Gapul.

Michelle (name withheld to protect her identity), a mother, said she is also sending her children inside the camp to attend the religious activity despite that her husband was caught and imprisoned due to alleged drug activity for two years now.

“I am happy that they are holding Flores de Mayo at the same time, sponsoring snacks to the children. Good thing that they are giving free snacks because I cannot give at all times for my children,” said the 35-year-old mother who is now working alone as dressmaker to support their

four children. “I looked at policemen as good people,” said Michelle.

“The case of my husband is still in the court now,” she said.

The administration of President Rodrigo Duterte is waging a controversial and brutal war against illegal drugs which drew strong condemnation from the Church and human rights groups, both here and abroad.

While the police vowed to continue their Catholic tradition for children, Duterte also pledged that his drug war will persist until he will step outside Malacañang in 2022.

“It will be as relentless and chilling as on the day it began,” said the firebrand president during his State of the Nation Address in July 2018.
