After recording 19 new cases in a single day

DOH alarmed over COVID-19 surge in the region

TACLOBAN CITY- Eastern Visayas' continue to see its coronavirus disease 2019(COVID-19) increasing, a rate described by the Department of Health in the region as 'alarming.'

As of Thursday (June 11), the region has now 76 COVID-19 cases with the surge noted after individuals who availed the national government initiated 'Balik Probinsiya' program and returning overseas workers and those considered locally stranded individuals started to return to their respective hometowns in the region.

"In a way, it is alarming. Before, our highest number of cases in a single day was eight and we were only focused in one area which is Tarangnan where there is a local transmission," Dr. Minerva Molon, the regional director of the DOH, said.

Tarangan was then considered to be the epicenter of COVID-19 in region with the health authorities declaring of a local transmission in the said town which has about 29 cases

out the 33 cases of the entire Samar province.

Molon said that they are projecting new cases as more people are to return to their respective hometowns in the region.

"It's just a matter of time

especially now that we have open our gates. We have this program of our government. But what is good is that our local government units are ready with

48.5K rice farmers in Eastern Visayas get gov't cash aid

TACLOBAN CITY – Some 48,528 rice farmers in Eastern Visayas have received P5,000 cash assistance from the government amid the global health crisis.

The Department of Agriculture (DA), through the Land Bank of the Philippines, has started the payout of the Financial Subsidy to Rice Farmers (FSRF) on May 18, said DA Eastern Visayas Director Angel Enriquez in a statement on Monday.

"The financial assistance for small rice farmers who plant one hectare or less can be used to buy farm inputs or other priority needs like food or anything to alleviate their sufferings while still under community quarantine and social restrictions," she said.

Out of 55,938 target beneficiaries in the region,

a total of 30,461 farmers have received the cash aid in Leyte and Biliran, and 18,067 in Samar.

"We won't stop until we complete the cash payout

to our target beneficiaries. The disruptions caused by Typhoon Ambo and other challenges met by our team are but natural challenges. Somehow, this slightly af-

fected our timeline in the distribution since our field personnel shifts their focus on damage assessment as part of our quick response see 48.5K/page 2 ...

Move meant to contain spread of virus

Northern Samar mayor places town under lockdown due to six COVID-19 patients

TACLOBAN CITY-The mayor of San Isidro in Northern Samar has placed under lockdown a village where the town's first cases of COVID-19 resides.

Mayor Ferdinand Avila said that he placed Barangay Mabuhay under lockdown to ensure that the virus would not spread.

The town of San Isidro logged its first COVID-19 cases involving six returning locally stranded individuals on May 28.

"I have already placed under lockdown the entire barangay of Mabuhay to ensure that the virus would not spread and for purposes of contact tracing. But they are all asymptomatic," Avila said.

He said that the six were part of the 19 construction workers who returned to San Isidro on May 28 and who were stranded in Metro Manila after the metropolis was placed under lockdown last March.

The swab results of these returning construction workers were released on Wednesday (June 9).

Mayor Avila said that the local government unit will be providing food assistance to the more than 800 residents of Mabuhay, located just outside the town center.

He admitted that the people of San Isidro, with

a population of more than 27,000 spread on its 14 barangays, went into panic when they learned of COVID-19 cases on their town.

But the town mayor assured them that the concerned individuals could not infect others as they are now in isolation facility.

"I have also made a request before the Regional and Provincial Inter-Agency Task Force to place our town under general community quarantine and enhanced community quarantine for Mabuhay," the town mayor said.

Mayor of rebel-infested Samar town backs anti-terror bill

TACLOBAN CITY -The mayor of the remote town of Matuguinao, Samar has called on critics to look into the plight of villagers in provinces affected by armed struggle before maligning the proposed Anti-Terrorism Act of 2020.

Mayor Aran Boller said in a phone interview on Tuesday that families in farflung communities, who have been suffering from terroristic activities of the New People's Army (NPA), stand to benefit from the passage of House Bill 6875.

"People who are against the bill do not know the real situation on the ground. Protesters have never experienced what the people here have gone through because of illegal activities of NPA rebels in our town," Boller told the Philippine News Agency (PNA).

The mayor recalled that several residents have been victims of extortion, recruitment of minors, indoctrination, deprived of basic education, and distracted economic activities due to the presence of rebels.

In the past, the NPA launched several attacks against government forces, displacing hundreds of

He appealed to critics to stop spreading false information that the bill seeks to silence critics since there are existing laws that protect those expressing dissent against the government and conducting peaceful demonstrations.

On June 8, he issued a statement to the National Task Force on Ending Local Communist Armed Conflict in response to protests against the passage of the

"I was compelled to issue the statement after I heard that some member of the House of Representatives withdrew their support to the passage of the bill due to pressures from those against the bill. Why we should be scared? We are the legitimate government," the mayor added.

For several decades, Matuguinao has known as a hotbed of NPA fighters due to its poor road access. It was only in 2018 when the town got connected to Samar's main highway after the completion of 21-kilometer Gandara-Matuguinao funded by the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process' Payapa at Masaganang Pamayanan (Pamana).

Of the 20 villages, five far-flung areas are still threatened by sightings of about 20 NPA fighters crossing the boundaries of Samar and Northern Samar provinces.

Ending insurgency has been the priority of the local government as they believe that armed struggle hampered the town's economic development for decades.

Since the launch of its strong campaign against insurgents, 33 active NPA fighters and 96 die-hard supporters from Matuguinao town have surrendered to the local government and the Philippine Army, Boller said.

The mayor said the passage of the enactment of the landmark legislation that seeks to prevent, prohibit and penalize terrorism, is a big boost to their campaign against insurgency.

The bill introduces provisions imposing life imprisonment without parole on those who will participate in the planning, training, preparation, and facilitation of a terrorist act; possess objects connected with the preparation for

Baybay City marks Independence Day with clean-up drive to combat COVID-19, dengue

TACLOBAN CITY- Instead of the yearly parades and festivities, the celebration of the 122nd Philippine Independence Day in Baybay City was marked with a simultaneous clean-up drive to combat COVID-19 and dengue, an existing problem in the city.

This was learned from City Mayor Jose Carlos Cari who said that the clean-up drive, which started at 6 am, involved in the cleaning of barangays, homes and business establishments.

Baybay so far have eight coronavirus disease 2019(COVID-19) with the patients said to be asymptomatic and are currently at the city's Ligtas COVID-19 Center.

Mayor Cari said that Department of Health Regional director Minerva Molon assured the public that these are not local transmissions.

Cari said that upon arrival of these patients in the region, they were immediately quarantined so there is no chance for them to be in contact with the general

Cari urged the residents of Baybay to continue to fol-

low government protocols, observe social distancing

and wear face mask. Meantime, Mayor Cari expressed gratitude to all frontliners in the city for their service and all Baybayanos for their support and cooperation.

Former Eastern Samar mayor alleged to have breached health protocols by not following quarantine rule

TACLOBAN CITY- A former town mayor and his son councilor in Taft, Eastern Samar are in hot water after they were accused to have allegedly breach health protocols for returning individuals.

Former town mayor Diego Lim, his wife Elsa and son Marvin, serving on his first term as a councilor, were said to have violated the health protocols by not proceeding to a quarantine facility established by the municipal government of

Instead, they went straight to a resort they owned.

Town Mayor Gina Ty, in a phone interview, said that Lim and his family would be charged, among others, for violation of an executive order she issued on June 1 mandating for all returnees coming from areas where there are confirmed coronavirus disease 2019(COVID-19) to undergo a quarantine at their designated facility and not at their respective homes.

"We are now readying our complaint against them," she said.

The town mayor said that sometimes last month, upon the request of the former mayor, she agreed that once they returned from Marikina, they could have go straight to their

home for their mandatory quarantine as they have not established any quarantine facilities at that time.

"But on June 1, I signed Executive Order 21 directing that all individuals who come from COVID areas have to quarantine in our designated facilities and not at their homes," Ty said.

The family of Lim arrived past 7 pm on Monday

Ty said that there is also an executive order issued by Governor Ben Evardone also mandating all returnees to stay at their quarantine facilities.

According to Evardone, the act of Lim and his family was a display of 'arrogance and defiance of lawful orders' and also put in danger the health and safety of the people of Taft and the rest of the province.

He also said that he was disappointed with the action of Councilor Lim by not submitting themselves to the quarantine facility.

"He should have showed decency and role model as an honorable person by following lawful orders, and ensuring the safety of his own constituents," Gov. Evardone said

But Lim, who served as mayor of the town briefly in 2005 and 2012, decried the allegation saying before they left from Marikina, he asked the town's health of-

ficer, Dr. Imelda Abenio, if they can be allowed to just use their private resort where they would remain in isolation for 14 days as part of the health proto-

"She agreed and prior to our travel to our hometown, we have prepared the needed documents like travel authority, health clearance from our barangay in Marikina and had a swab test which turned out to be negative," he said.

The former town mayor also said that he preferred to be isolated at their resort and not at the municipal quarantine facility because he is physically disabled.

"I have a stainless placed at my back and I need to have a good rest reason why I chose to stay at our resort instead at their quarantine facility," he said.

The former mayor also said that while at their resort, they would be observing health guidelines like less contact with other people.

'My wife is a nurse and I have three sisters who are all doctors whom I can get for advice. And I am not exhibiting any symptoms of the disease," he said.

Lim said that he would face any charges that the municipal government would be filing against his family. (JOEY A. GABIETA)

Parents decide on schooling of children, says DepEd-Maasin City official

MAASIN CITY- Amid legitimate concerns on health during these uncertain times when infection to coronavirus disease is widespread, parents have the final say on whether or not they will send their children to school.

City Schools Division Superintendent Genis Murallos of the Department of Education (DepEd) here made this point clear even as preparations for new normal ways of learning are being considered for School Year 2020-2021, with August 24 as the target date of school opening.

Having said that, however, Murallos encouraged parents to continue the education in whatever mode this shall be undertaken within his schools division.

"If they (parents) value education, they take the risk. We are all fighting something invisible," Murallos said during the media forum/Kapihan sa PIA last Wednesday.

Murallos said the city schools division considered the distance learning method of teaching, not online, because not all learners have gadgets and access to internet, wifi signal, besides the slow speed.

Distance learning involves the printing of learning modules using risographs, and these printed materials would be delivered by class advisers to the homes of their remotely

enrolled students in coordination with barangay officials, Murallos explained.

Budget for printing as well as purchase of risograph machines, including ink, newsprints, and other accessories would be sourced from the sports development fund, in which the amount of P3.2 million supposedly for the division's participation in regional and national sports events, would be utilized, Murallos shared.

He reported that there are about 16,000 learners under the city schools division, and he would be okay if those who filled-up the learning enrollment and survey form can reach 20 percent of this number.

On Friday, the city division office released the partial result of the remote enrollment that covered 29 percent of the expected total enrollment, comprising of the following: Kinder - 266, elementary - 2,958, junior high school - 1,071, senior high school - 221, and ALS - 78, for a total of 4,594 students.

The data covered public schools only, as private schools have their own learning continuity plan, Murallos stated.

"It is during this COVID crisis that the creativity, the passion of teachers can be seen," Murallos said.

Told that President Duterte was not in favor on resumption of classes unless a vaccine shall be publicly available, Murallos clarified that this referred more on face-toface classroom instruction. (IdI/mmp/PIA8-southern Leyte)



"My full name is Eugenio Gabriel La'O Lopez III. "I am presently the holder of an American (United States of America) passport and that I am an American citizen under US laws by virtue of my being born in Boston, Massachusetts on August 13, 1952."

He also stated that both his parents were Filipino citizens.

Natural citizen

A cable of US Ambassador to Manila William Sullivan to the Secretary of State in September 1975 - when Lopez was 23 - reported that he (Lopez) was already an American citizen at that time.

This was information the US Embassy, of course, could easily get and had to be certain about, since Lopez could ask the US Embassy for its assistance and intervention as a US citizen.

Lopez could have acquired American citizenship only through "naturalization" after he reached the age of 18, and had been a permanent resident of the US for five years, and formally renounced his Filipino citizenship and pledged his allegiance to the United States.

Again, this Manila Times reporter asked "What kind of nation are we that we allowed an American citizen to run one of the biggest media firms in the country, one that has arguably been molding the minds of our citizens, even if the Constitution unambiguously forbids this? What kind of Congress would allow him to continue?

"He should have acquired Filipino citizenship when he left his mediocre clerical job at a bank in San Francisco in companies in the country surfaced.

Under Article XVI, Section 11 of the 1987 Constitution, "the ownership and management of mass media shall be limited to citizens of the Philippines, or to corporations, cooperatives or associations, wholly-owned and managed by such citizens."

"Undeniably Gabby Lopez is a natural-born citizen but he's also an American citizen by virtue of a jus soli principle applied in American law. Ang tanong ho (The question is), whether a dual citizen can own a mass media company," said Garbin.

50-50 Citizenship?

The controversial topic that roamed around congress was the definition of "dual citizenship."

Garbin, who is a lawyer by profession said that this is not the case. There is no such thing as 50% American and 50% Filipino.

At 12noon, the Joint Hearing of the House Committee on Legislative Franchising and the House Committee on Good Government & Public Accountability was suspended; and shall resume on Monday, 8 June 2020.

Scared to death

Just a few days ago, somebody sent me a forwarded message through messenger and, after reading it, I came to realize its wisdom. I don't really mind much of sent messages, especially now when fake news items are rampant. But when I see that something makes sense, then I somehow consider it.

This has to do with the global panic that the corona virus brought along with it. As a result, so much media hype has been given to it, governments overacting in their responses, companies closing shops, workers by the millions losing their jobs, families going hungry, and the world plunged into chaos. Some skeptics had put together their counter-reactions about all this, and they have some good points to say.

Consider the number

of deaths in the first two months of 2020 throughout the world-14,687: Corona virus, 69,602: Common 140,584: Malaria, 153,696: Suicide, 193,479: Road accidents, 240,950: HIV cases, 358,471: Alcohol, 716,498: Smoking, 1,177,141: Cancer. You will notice, in these figures, that coronavirus has the lowest number of deaths compared to other causes although this can be easily dismissed with the fact that COVID 19 is just getting started and is still spreading.

But it is beginning to appear some people are behind this pandemic. We are just wondering why. Is it to settle the trade war between China and America? Is it to prepare financial markets for mergers? Is it to sell US Treasury bonds to cover the fiscal deficit in them?

Or is it a panic created by pharma companies to sell their products like sanitizers, masks, medicine, etc.? These are some of the questions asked by skeptics to this pandemic.

In the first two months of this year, 338,724 people got sick of coronavirus, of which 81,093 were in China with a population of over 1 billion. Meaning, if you are not in or haven't recently visited China, this should banish 94% of your concern. Even if you do contract the virus, it is still not a cause for panic according to critics because 81% of the cases are mild, 14% are moderate, and only 5% are critical, which implies that even if you get sick of the virus, you are most likely to recover.

But some are saying, this is worse than SARS! Well, SARS had a fatality rate of 10% while COVID 19 has only 2%. Moreover, the death rate of the people under 50 years of age is only 0.2%. On the 10th day of February, when 108 people died of coronavirus in China, thousands of people likewise died on that same day. 26,283 peo-

EVHRDC conducts virtual meetings to ensure implementation of programs

TACLOBAN CITY-To ensure continuity of programs and services amid COVID-19 pandemic, the Eastern Visayas Health Research and Development Consortium (EVHRDC) has started the conduct of meetings among its member institutions during the months of April and May.

The activities are part of the consortium's commitment in pursuit to produce research outputs and other related concerns that would help improve the health conditions of the region's populace.

Considering that the organization is composed of different committees whose members from various institutions all over the region, regular sharing of insights, plans and other concerns were mostly done through virtual meetings.

This is among the precautionary measures imposed to avoid transmission of the disease while the country is currently experiencing the health crisis and community quarantine being implemented in the different localities.

The EVHRDC, as spearheaded by the Department of Health (DOH) and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), is an organization that serves as a venue for inter-agency efforts geared towards health advancement and stability.

The consortium is composed of five working committees namely: Ethics Review Committee (ERC); Research Management Committee (RMC); Capacity Building Committee (CBC); Research Utilization Committee (RUC); and the Structure, Organization, Monitoring, and Evaluation Committee (SOME).

For the Ethics Review Committee, it has checked during the meeting on the five (5) new and continuing research protocols that required ethical clearance for the conduct of the study. The committee has also identified activities that either need to

cancelled based on the current COVID-19 situation, among others.

The Research Management Committee on the other hand has tackled possible strategies in conducting the identified activities given the current status. It has also reviewed three capsule proposals and seven terminal reports on completed funded proj-

While the Capacity Building Committee has discussed the revised Work and Financial Plan, it has also dealt with the list of collaborative projects for submission to the Philippine Center for Health Research and Development or PCHRD. These include the trainings on Critiquing of Proposals for Trainer on Basic Research Methods, Basic Research Methods Training (Phase 2), and the Writeshop on the Finalization of Terminal Reports for completed research projects.

WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) issued Memoandum Circular No. 2020 - 071 enjoining local government units to enact local Ordinance elative to intervention against COVID-19;

NOW THEREFORE, for the purpose of preventing COVID-19 in the Municipality, and upon motion of Hon. Leandro R. Quinsayas and seconded in mass BE IT ORDAINED BY THIS SANGGUNIANG BAYAN IN SESSION ASSEMBLED. that:

SECTION 1: COVERAGE. All persons who are found within the territorial of San Julian, Eastern Samar

in violation of this Ordinance, to wit:

SECTION 4. DISPOSITION OF FINES/PENALTY. The proceeds from the fines/penalty shall be distributed in the following manner:

WHEREAS, the Provincial Governor issued Executive Order No. BFE 05-030. Series of 2020, "An Executive Order Placing Eastern Samar Under Modification General Community

WHEREAS, the Local Chief Executive through Executive Order No. DPE-2020-34, Series of 2020 extended the effectivity of the modified General Community Quarantine in the entire municipality.

WHEREAS, an ordinance has to be enacted providing for the strict implementation thereof as one of the preventive measures against COVID-19, complimentary to social distancing, wearing of face mask, proper hygiene and other existing responsive mechanism already in place:

NOW THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Leandro R. Quinsayas, duly seconded by Hon to M. Acol. **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Sangguniang Bayan in session assembled, that: SECTION 1. COVERAGE. This ordinance shall cover all persons within the territorial jurisdiction of San Julian, Eastern Samar

SECTION 2. PROHIBITION.

A) Curfew Hours. The strict implementation of curfew hours is hereby mandated for all persons from 8:00 PM to 4:00 AM. Individual tasked to carry out medical, emergncy, and peace and order functions are exempted from the curfew.

(a) All persons coming to San Julian, Eastern Samar from places with confirmed cases of COVID-19 and Locally Stranded Individuals (LSI) shall undergo a health check upon entry and immediate mandatory quarantine at the designated quarantine facility for a period of

(b) Strictly no visitors shall be allowed inside the facility.

(c) Unauthorized going out of quarantine facility shall be strictly prohibited. SECTION 3. PENAL PROVISIONS. There shall be imposed penalties for persons found

fined of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) and another Twenty-One (21) days quarantine period in address to the remaining days of the previous quarantine pe

SECTION 4. DISPOSITION OF FINES. The proceeds from the fines on Section 2(A) shall be distributed in the following manner:

a) 30% shall accrue to the municipal government

b) 70% shall accrue to the barangay where the apprehension took place.

For Section 2(B), fines collected shall all accrue to the municipal government. SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTATION. The PNP/Municipal Police Office of this municipality shall lead the implementation thereof in coordination with the municipal and baranga

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If for any reason, any section or provision of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, all other sections or provisions not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

PREFATORY STATEMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, it is the policy of the State to maintain peace and order and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article III of the 1987 Philippine Constitution, Section I provides that every person has the right to life iberty, security of person and privacy and the right to be free from discrimination. Furthermore, under Section II thereof, the State values the dignity of every person and guarantees full respect for human rights;

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, President Rodrigo Roa Duterte issued Proclamation No. 922, declaring a State of Public Health mergency throughout the Philippines due to the Corona Virus Disease 2019 (Covid-19) and the Code Alert System for Covid-19 was Force for Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF). Further, Presidential Proclamation No. 929, Series 2020 was issued declaring a State of Calamity throughout the Philippines due to Covid-19.

WHEREAS, since the emergence of COVID-19 we have seen instances of public stigmatization among persons who have con racted the disease including Probable and Suspect, and the rise of harmful stereotypes. This means that people are being labelled stereotyped, separated and/or experience loss of status and discrimination because of a potential negative affiliation with the disease Stigmatization could drive people to hide the illness to avoid discrimitation or prevent people from seeking health care immediately and discourage them from adopting healthy behaviors:

WHEREAS, the Department of Health (DOH) recently warned the public against discrimination against persons reported to have contracted COVID-19 as well as Probable, Suspect, including health workers and emergency workers who are among those in the front with a virus with little information known, it is human to be afraid. But we must not allow hysteria and paranoia to result in irrationa

WHEREAS, there have been several reported incidents of people being evicted out of their residences or after having recovered rom the illness were prevented from returning back to their residences, while some were even doused with water and were refused sei vices in eateries and even their own barangays and homes. Several false and inaccurate social media posts even circulated online spead ng names of people alleged to have been infected with COVID-19 and urging the recipients to check if they had contact with those listed;

WHEREAS, considering the gravity of the situation, there is an urgent need to combat this pervasive stigmatization on the basis of ne's medical condition. There is a need for the LGUs to bring normalcy and order amidst the crisis, and protect its constituency from unjust discrimination brought on by fear and panic by public;
WHEREAS, it is at these trying times, families who are affected by this pandemic suffer

Hence, it is the policy of the City of Tacloban to act as *parens patria* during this trying time by showing compassion, empathy and tolerance towards its affected constituents as this virus can inflict any person regardless of race, age, sex or social standing. Only through a unified front, strengthened by our religious conviction can we fight and end this pandemic:

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Tacloban in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. TITLE - This Ordinance for brevity shall be known and cited as "Anti COVID-19 Discrimination Ordinance of 2020" of

SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF TERMS

B. Recovered Person - a person who was either a confirmed COVID-19 patient or a Probable who has made a recovery, and who

subsequently discharged from the public or private hospital clinic, or center by the attending physician C. Health Workers - are those who deliver care and services to the sick and ailing, either directly or indirectly. Health worker

D. Frontliners - include officers and member of the PNP, AFP and instrumentalities of the government rendering emergency front ers services, border control and other critical services. Front liners also include service workers who are working in private estab lishments providing basic necessities and such activities related to food and medicine production, e.g. public markets, supermarkets, groceries, convenience stores, hospitals, medical clinics, pharmacies and drug stores, foor preparation and delivery services, water refilling stations, manufacturing and processing plants of basic food products and medicines, banks, money transfer services, power energy, telecommunications and water supplies and other related facilities.

E. Juridical Persons - an entity (as a partnership or corporation) that is given rights and responsibilities

SECTION 3. UNLAWFUL ACTS

A. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether natural or juridical, to commit any act or make utterances which cause or tend to to COVID-19, health worker or frontliner as defined under this Ordinance.

B. If any public officer refuses or fails to give assistance to a person infected, probable or suspect due to Covid-19, health worker or frontliner who intends to return to his place of residence or domicile, after obtaining clearance of the Covid-19 infection from the proper health officials, he/she shall be equally liable under this Section.

C. Any person who shall publicly claim, post on social media, spread or announce that a person is infected, is probable or suspect due to Covid-19 whether or not the same has been confirmed or validated from the list given by authorized proper health officials, agency or department, shall be liable under this section. If the person violating is a public officer, the penalty imposed shall be its naximum and can also be a ground for filing of an administrative case against said public officer. Except when the patient concerne waived his/her right to privacy and for purposes of contact tracing and other medical purposes.

SECTION 4. PENALTY CLAUSE - Any person caught in violation of Section 3 hereof shall be fined of not more than Two Thousand

Five Hundred Pesos (P2,500.00) or an imprisonment of not more than six (6) months or both at the discretion of the court. If the vioator is a public officer, the maximum penalty herein shall be imposed.

Juridical Person - If committed by a juridical person, the President, General Manager, Corporate Secretary or a person with related

nterest in the Corporation or Partnership or Association shall be held liable or penalized accordingly.

The violator may opt to pay an Administrative Fine, in lieu of filing the case before any court of competent jurisdiction, in the mount of One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) to the Office of the City Treasurer of Tacloban.

SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE - All previous ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations and other issuances or parts thereof hare inconstant with this Ordinance are hereby revoked, amended or modified accordingly. SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE - If for any reason, any provision or part of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional

valid, other parts or provision hereof which are not affected thereby, shall continue to be in full force and effect SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE - This Ordinance shall take effect upon its publication and approval and after due compliance with all the requirements provided under Republic Act 7160. The regulation prescribed in this Ordinance shall be deemed suspended. once the Sate of National Emergency on Public Health is lifted by the President of the Republic of the Philippines

the commission of terrorism; or collect or make documents connected with the preparation of terrorism.

Under the bill, any person who will threaten to commit terrorism will suffer the penalty of 12 years. The same jail term will be meted against those who will propose any terroristic acts or incite others to commit terrorism.

Any person who will voluntarily and knowingly join any organization, association, or group of persons knowing that such is a terrorist organization, will suffer imprisonment of 12 years.

Under the bill, the number of days a suspected person can be detained without a warrant of arrest is 14 calendar days, extendable by 10 days. (SARWELL Q. MÉNIANO/

Northern Samar cops arrest five wanted persons in a day

More than one in six young people out of work due to COVID-19

The International Labor Organization's (ILO) latest analysis of the labour market impact of COVID-19 exposes the devastating and disproportionate effect on young workers, and analyses measures being taken to create a safe return to work environ-

More than one in six young people have stopped working since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic while those who remain employed have their working hours cut by 23 per cent, says the International Labour Organization (ILO).

According to the ILO COVID-19 Monitor: and the world of work. 4th edition ,youth are being disproportionately affected by the pandemic, and the substantial and rapid increase in unemployment seen since February is affecting young women more than young men.

The pandemic is inflicting a triple shock on young people. Not only is it destroying their employment, but it is also disrupting education and training, and placing major obstacles in the way of those seeking to enter the labour market or to move between jobs.

At 13.6 per cent, the unemployment rate in 2019 was already higher than for any other group. There were around 267 million young people not in employment, education or training (NEET) worldwide. Those 15-24 year olds who were employed were also more likely to be in forms of work that leave them vulnerable, such as low paid informal occupations, sector work, or as migrant

"The COVID-19 economic crisis is hitting young people – especially women – harder and faster than any other group. If we do not take significant and immediate action to improve their situation, the legacy of the virus could be with us for decades. If their talent and energy is side-lined by a lack of opportunity or skills it will damage all our futures and make it much more difficult to re-build a better, post-COVID economy," said Director-General,

Guy Ryder. The Monitor calls for

urgent, large-scale and targeted policy responses to support youth, including broad-based employment/training guarantee programmes in developed countries, and employment-intensive programmes and guarantees in low- and middle-income economies.

Testing and tracing

The 4th edition of the Monitor also looks at measures to create a safe environment for returning to work. It says that rigorous testing and tracing (TT) of COVID-19 infections, "is strongly re lated to lower labour market disruption... [and] substantially smaller social disruptions than confinement and lockdown measures."

In countries strong testing and tracing, the average fall in working hours is reduced by as much as 50 per cent. There are three reasons for this: TT reduces reliance on strict confinement measures; promotes public confidence and so encourages consumption and supports employment; and helps minimize operational dis-

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING CURFEW FOR NON-WORKERS IN THE CITY OF TACLOBAN BETWEEN EIGHT O'CLOCK IN THE EVENING (8:00 P.M.) ING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, IT A DECLARED POLICY OF THE State to uphold the people's constitutional rights to life, safety, and property and to promoti the general welfare of its people at all times;

WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte has issued Proclamation No. 922, dated March 8, 2020 declaring the Philippines to be under State of Public Health Emergency due to the Corona Virus Disease (COVID-19) WHEREAS, President Rodrigo R. Duterte has issued Executive Order No. 112 dated April 30, 2020 imposing an Enhanced Com

antine (ECQ) in high-risk geographic areas of the Philippines and General Community Quarantine (GCQ) in the rest of the country from May 01 to 15, 2020, and adopting the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines of the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Infectious Diseases (IATF) through Resolution No. (s.2020) dated April 29, 2020. WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines issued by the IATF

enjoined the LGUs to enact the necessary ordinances to enforce curfew for non-workers in jurisdictions placed under GCQ and to penalize in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people as provided under the Omnibus Guidelines WHEREAS, this measure is necessary for the duration of the imposition of the General Community Quarantine ordered by the President

and as an exercise of the powers expressly granted and those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for the promotion of the general welfare, and the protection of the right of the people to life, health, safety and property;

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Tacloban in session assembled, that; SECTION 1. Short Title – This Ordinance shall be known as "The GCQ CURFEW ORDINANCE OF TACLOBAN CITY."

SECTION 2. IMPOSITION OF CURFEW HOURS – There is hereby imposed curfew hours for all non-workers within the territorial jurisdiction of Tacloban City between Eight O'clock in the evening (8:00 P.M.) to Five O'clock in the morning (5:00 A.M.) during the effectivity of General Community Quarantine imposed by the National Government.

SECTION 3. EXCEPTIONS- During curfew hours, no person shall be allowed in the streets, commercial establishment, recreation centers malls or any other areas outside the immediate vicinity of their residence, except in cases of emergency or for the purpose of purchase of food and essential basic necessities and prime commodities and work related travels

The movement of cargoes within the City of Tacloban shall be unhampered. SECTION 4. IMPLEMENTATION – This Ordinance shall be strictly enforced by the Office of the City Mayor and its deputies, agents or repre

sentatives, the Punong Barangays and their Barangay Councils, Barangay Public Safety Officers (BSPO), and the City PNP. SECTION 5. PENALTY – Any person found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be penalized as follows

1st Offense - One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) fine, or its equivalent community service;

2nd Offense - Three Thousand Pesos (Php 3,000.00) fine, or its equivalent community service

3rd and Succeeding Offenses- Five Thousand Pesos (Php 5,000.00) fine, or its equivalent community service, and/or six (6) month imprisonment, at the discretion of the Court;

For every fine imposed and actually collected by the Barangay, 50% thereof shall be retained and shall accrue to the barangay to form part of their Barangay Funds. The other 50% shall accrue in favor of the City Government of Tacloban. SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE- If any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or inoperative, the other provisions no

so declared shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 7. REPEALING CLAUSE- All laws, decrees, orders, issuances, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the Act or the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto are hereby repealed and amended accordingly

City remains to be COVID-19 free

Maasin city mayor appeals returning residents to strictly follow all health protocols

TACLOBAN CITY – The mayor of Maasin City reiterated his appeal for the returning individuals from the city to follow all the requirements and observe health protocols laid down by the city government to ensure that the city would remain free from coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

So far, only Maasin City and Borongan City remain to be COVID-19 free among the cities in the region.

"I'm asking our locally stranded individuals (LSIs) and returning Overseas Filipino Workers (ROF's) to please coordinate and not ignore and bypass the basic health protocols that is being enforced by our City Health Services Office personnel's to maintain our COVID-19 free status," Mayor Naccional Mercado said.

The local government had set protocols for returning residents to comply before arriving in the city which includes submitting online of travel documents such as medical certificates and COVID shield documents for LSI for their travel back home should be coordinated.

LSIs who returned to the city are subjected to rapid test, whether the result is reactive or not, they still have to comply with the 14-day mandatory quarantine in the city's quarantine facility.

The LGU also subjected some returning OFWs

for swab sample gathering among which are as co-passengers with positive COVID-19 patient from Tacloban City.

These samples were sent to the Eastern Visayas COVID-19 Testing Center (EVRCTC).

The said returnees are now isolated at the city's isolation facility for close monitoring.

"With this development, we would like to appeal to the public to verify the information from reliable sources only. Also, please coordinate with the proper authorities for us to be able to facilitate and strictly adhere to the mandated protocols and policies," Mercado said.

TACLOBAN CITY – The mayor of Tarangnan town in Samar province said that the negative result of a swab test of a close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 patient is a welcome development.

Still despite of this development, the town proper and Barangay Palencia will remain under enhanced community quarantine (ECQ) until June 15, Mayor Arnel Tan said.

Tarangnan has become the epicenter of the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the region where there is a local transmission of the virus.

The town has now a total of 27 confirmed COVID-19 infected individuals where 26 of which are locally acquired while one is a locally stranded individual who arrived from Cebu City.

On April 7, the town recorded its first two confirmed COVID-19 infected persons both personnel of the Tarangnan Community Hospital who were both exposed by a doctor from Calbayog City who had a travel history to Metro Manila.

GSIS extends APIR deadline to 30 June 2020

President and General Manager of the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) Rolando Ledesma Macasaet today announced that the pension fund is again extending the deadline for the Annual Pensioners' Information Revalidation (APIR) to 30 June 2020.

"Old-age and survivorship pensioners born in March, April and May need not go to GSIS branches to renew their active status for the time being. We advise them to postpone visiting our branches. They can do their APIR at a later date through our GWAPS kiosks located in large government offices, provincial capitols, city and municipal offices, selected SM and Robinsons malls and GSIS offices. Anyway, they have until 30 June 2020 to do their APIR," Macasaet explained.

APIR requires all oldage and survivorship pensioners to personally appear before GSIS offices during their birth months as a prerequisite to continue receiving their pensions.


However, due to the continued threat of the COVID-19 virus, GSIS announced that the deadline

for pensioners' APIR was moved for the second time in a row, from 15 May 2020 to 30 June 2020, in order to safeguard the well-being of its elderly pensioners who are the most vulnerable to the virus.

ruption at the workplace. In addition, testing and tracing can itself create new jobs, even if temporary, which can be targeted towards youth and other priority groups.

The Monitor highlights the importance of managing data privacy concerns. Cost is also a factor, but the benefit-to-cost ratio of TT is "highly favourable".

"Creating an employment-rich recovery that also promotes equity and sustainability means getting people and enterprises working again as soon as possible, in safe conditions," said Ryder. "Testing and tracing can be an important part of the policy package if we are to fight fear, reduce risk and get our economies and societies moving again quickly."

Loss of working hours The Monitor also updates the estimate for the decline in working hours in the first and second

quarters of 2020, compared with the fourth quarter of 2019. An estimated 4.8 per cent of working hours were lost during Q1 2020 (equivalent to approximately 135 million full-time jobs, assuming a 48-hour working week). This represents a slight upward revision of around 7 million jobs since the third edition of the Monitor. The estimated number of jobs lost in Q2 remain unchanged at 305 million.

From a regional perspective, the Americas (13.1 per cent), and Europe and Central Asia (12.9 per cent) present the largest losses in hours worked in Q2.

The Monitor reiterates its call for immediate and urgent measures to support workers and enterprises along the ILO's four-pillar strategy: stimulating the economy and employment; supporting enterprises, jobs and incomes; protecting workers in the workplace; relying on social dialogue for solutions. "It is clearly stipulated in the guidelines that our role is assistorial. I'm now making it clear that DOLE and DTI will not use the term inspection but rather monitoring. We will exhaust every opportunity to help these establishments through our technical assistance or services", said Centi.

A virtual orientation will be conducted on June 10 for the different concerned groups such as the Regional Tripartite Industrial Peace Council (RTIPC), Chambers of Commerce and Provincial Producers Association. The actual monitoring of establishments will officially commence on June 19, 2020.


