"For Yolanda's anniversary, it will be a very simple commemoration. We'll just have some Masses, perhaps at the mass grave and at the shipwreck," the city mayor said Friday (Oct.6).

The sites Romualdez referred were the mass burial site located in Barangay Basper where more than 2,200 people who died due to the massive typhoon were buried, and the Yolanda Shipwreck Memorial Park located in Brgy. 68(Anibong District)where commercial cargo M/V Jocelyn was washed inland due to the storm surge generated by Yolanda.

He also said that while mass gathering is strictly prohibited during this time of quarantine, he might just allowed entry at the mass burial ground.

Social distancing and other health protocols should always be observed during the visit, the city mayor said.

measure to stop any possible spread of the virus.

Romualdez said that while this year's seventh anniversary of Yolanda's onslaught will be simple due to COVID-19 restrictions, those who perished will still be remembered.

The city mayor added that the people should not forget one of the lessons learned due to Yolanda-to evacuate once there is a typhoon.

"I ask the residents not to forget Yolanda. If there is a super storm, evacuate immediately," Romualdez said.

The city mayor said that the simple ceremony of Yolanda's onslaught is mainly due to COVID-19 which has already claimed 15 lives in the city.

Tacloban has 950 total COVID-19 cases of which 869 of them have recovered from the deadly virus.

Other areas in the region also affected by Yolanda have also cancelled their annual commemorative programs due to COVID-19 pandemic.

The laptop units, with memory capacity of 1 TB HDD and runs an Intel Core i3-1005G1 Processor, will help the students attend synchronous classes, execute their class assignments and do research for their class requisites.

Moreover, each student beneficiary of the laptops also received one unit of pocket wifi from EDC to enable them to connect to the internet and have hassle-free remote learning access and

In Northern Samar Palapag town mayor dies due to COVID-19 complications

TACLOBAN CITY-The mayor of Palapag town in Northern Samar, Manuel Aoyang, was confirmed to have died due complications of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) on early morning Friday (Oct.6).

This was confirmed by the town's health officer Dr.Delia Chy who said that the 68-year old mayor died while confined in one of the private hospitals here in Tacloban City at around 1:30 am.

Aoyang, who was serving his third and last term as mayor of Palapag (with more than 38,000 people spread on its 33 barangays), has been on a dialysis for two years now.

"(The entire) town is in mourning. The flag (at the municipal building) is now at half-mast to show our respect to our mayor," Chy said in a phone interview.

As a rule of succession, Vice Mayor Marlon Agno will assumed the post of mayor of the town.

Chy said that Mayor Aoyang was brought to the hospital last October 27

and as part of the protocol, was swabbed the following day, Oct.28.

The positive result of the swab test came out on Oct.29.

Also tested was his son, who turned positive, and his wife, whose result turned negative. Both served as guardians of the mayor while he was confined at the hospital.

Chy said that as part on the protocol on the managing of a dead person due to COVID-19, the mayor would be buried today (Oct.6) at the town's catholic cemetery.

At present, the town has 35 cases.

Aoyang is the first incumbent official in Eastern Visayas to have died due to COVID-19.

Meantime, the regional office of the Department of Health (DOH) reported on Thursday night of 100 new COVID-19 cases, bringing the region's total cases to 7,147.

The new cases were from Leyte,37; Samar,33; Northern Samar, 25; and Eastern Samar, 5. (JOEY A. GABIETA)

But because of the mangrove forest along the shore in their village in Barangay 83(Paraiso), the more than 2,800 residents were saved from the storm surge that comes with the massive typhoon.

However, 23 residents of the village died due to Yolanda which generated a deadly 20-feet storm surge coming from Cancabato Bay which rings San Jose district, considered the worst-hit area of the city due to the world's strongest typhoon to hit inland.

"Our mangroves saved our lives. Without them, the storm surge could prove to be more deadly. The mangroves helped slow down the gushing of the water down to our houses,"Cahindo, who was a village councilor at that time, said.

Unfortunately, the mangroves that saved the lives of the villagers, could not withstood the powerful storm surge as many of these trees were damaged, even beyond rehabilitation.

But the villagers, knowing the benefit of the mangroves during the Nov.8,2013 catastrophe, decided to rehabilitate their mangrove forest by planting again sometimes in 2015.

"We are thankful to these mangroves and there is no way for us not to rehabilitate our mangrove forest knowing that these will save us again from a natural calamity like typhoon," Cahindo said.

And now five years later, the more than seven hectares mangrove cover of Brgy.51 appears to have been completely restored and in full life and now thriving with fishes and crabs.

Cahindo said that the rehabilitation of their natural barrier against flooding or storm surge composed of more than 70,000 mangroves trees mostly of 'meyapi' variety, is their



way of helping the environment and as part of their risk reduction management during a calamity situation.

"Our people here in the village are aware on the usefulness of our mangrove forest. That it is not only for our protection from a typhoon but even in preserving our marine lives like fish and crabs which now thrives there," he said.

Girlie Obillo,43 and mother to seven children, said that she too was thankful that their village have mangrove cover that helped them during the onslaught of Yolanda and in the succeeding typhoons. "While we're hit by the storm surge, its impact was not that strong because the mangroves protected us. They helped slow down the rush of the water from the sea," she said.

Cutting of mangroves is illegal in the country unless one secures a permit from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Danilo Elias, 62, who was one of the residents of the village who helped plant more than 500 propagules back in the 1990s covering around four hectares, said that they are thankful that the villagers

Leyte maintains MGCQ status for November

ue to fight the spread of clubs, religious activities, PALO, Leyte -The

province of Leyte has maintained the modified general community quarantine (MGCQ) implementation for this month of November.

Levte Governor Leopoldo Dominico Petilla told reporters in an interview that he has signed Executive Order (EO) number 11-02-2020 maintaining the MGCQ status for the province for the whole month of November.

Petilla, however, clarified that the MGCQ status "may be shortened or extended depending on the recommendation of the Provincial IATF

COVID-19, without prejudice to declaration of localized Enhanced Community Quarantine in local areas."

What the province has done for the MGCQ implementation last month will just be carried out for this month, he added. The province of Leyte was under the MGCQ implementation for the month of October. The governor added that the mechanisms that had been in place by the local government before will ensure that the economic activities will not be hampered while our authorities contin-

COVID-19.

He added that the less stringent quarantine measures will allow the unrestricted delivery of goods and services to the public like the unhindered movement of farm products to the market or consumers. Petilla said that as in previous MGCQ implementations, the activities that will remain prohibited include the groupings or by nature attract the mass gathering of people. This includes among others the carnivals, concerts, sports tournaments, trade fairs, fiestas, theaters, cultural shows,

retreats, and workshops and other business gatherings which may include conventions and conferences.

Business establishments may continue with their operations on conditions that they will comply with the requirements as stipulated in the health protocols. In the transportation business like the public utility vehicles (PUVs), the owner or operator should comply with the safety measures and standards required by the Department of Transportation, Petilla said. (RESTITUTO A. CAYUBIT)

Obillo said that she and the rest of the families living close to the mangrove forest are aware on the usefulness of the mangrove forest.

Thus, she said, no one dare cut the mangroves. "We know it is illegal to do. And why would we destroy



Elderly plants 10,000 mangroves to protect his house, community from rise of water

TACLOBAN CITY - A resident of Matalom town, Leyte has planted mangroves to protect his house from any possible storm surge or rise of water.

Gary Dabasol, 65, has planted 10,000 mangroves along the coast of their village in Punong for eight years now.

The mangroves that he planted were of meyapi, pagatpat and bakawan varieties.

Dabasol said that he decided to plant mangroves because their house is located in a coastal area which is prone to destruction of big waves during bad weather like typhoon.

He added that mangroves can also help increase the catch of the fishermen because it is also a spooning area for fish, crabs, and shrimps and other sea marine life.

"I'm glad that I was able to inspire people.I hope that they will also follow what I am doing," Dabasol said.

The story of Dabasol was discovered by netizen Dan Niez from Hilongos

Caray Dabasol, 65, planted 10,000 mangroves for the last eight years at their coastal village of Punong, Matalom in Leyte province as a natural barrier against storm surge or rise of water during a typhoon.

Borongan bishop urges Catholics to follow Pope Francis' call for 'ecological conversion'

TACLOBAN CITY-The bishop of the Diocese of Borongan has urged the faithful to heed the call of Pope Francis for "ecological conversion" following the calamities and pandemic that hit the country.

"Many of the calamities we face are pointed out by scientists and experts as related to climate change and global warming. Our planet and our poor cry for our attention and right action to save our common home and our more vulnerable brethren in the human family," said Bishop Crispin Varquez.

"We must move away from the sins of environmental abuse and neglect to environmental and social justice to show that we are truly returning to the Lord," the bishop added.

In his pastoral letter to mark the seventh anniversary of Super Typhoon 'Yolanda' on Sunday (November 8), Varquez also called on the Catholics to "remember God's love and mercy for our people."

"It has been seven years since Super Typhoon Haiyan or Yolanda came our way. Despite the pandemic we are going through, we still have fresh memories of the horrors we went through," said Varquez.

While the bishop recalled the "goodness and compassion" of those who helped the Yolanda victims, he said that Catholics "must be thankful to the Lord that we have risen from the horrible destruction."

"The fact that most of that is now only a painful memory testifies to God's saving acts at work in our own history," he said, calling those who helped the storm survivors as "agents of God's mighty hand."

"We pray for those dear ones who lost their lives during and shortly after Yolanda's wrath. We continually entrust them to the Father of mercy in our Masses and prayers," the bishop said.

"As we face a tense present and an uncertain future, let us continue to pray for our deliverance from any and all calamities, both natural and manmade, physical or spiritual, particularly Covid-19 and other vagaries of the weather, health, political, social and economic situations," he added.

are given to the community where they can use them as fire woods or turned into charcoal which they could even sold.

The DENR, noting the multi-purpose of mangrove are encouraging local government units to have their own communal mangrove forest, especially in 'mangrove-endowed municipalities or cities.'

Several scientists and experts have claimed that Yolanda was a climate change-induced typhoon that claimed more than 6,000 lives, affecting 4.1 million residents, and damaging more than one million homes, mostly from Eastern Visayas.

In Tacloban alone, considered as ground zero of the mammoth typhoon, more than 2,200 people were confirmed to have died, turning the once bustling city into a deserted and God-forsaken area.

In Guiuan town, where Yolanda made its first landfall before Yolanda, packing a wind of 295 kph and gusts as 360 kph, before it barreled its way to Tacloban City, the people there have learned their hard lesson, Mayor Annaliza Gonzales Kwan said.

The town mayor said that this kind of attitude was evident when Super Typhoon 'Rolly' threatened Eastern Visayas. The super typhoon struck Bicol Region.


