CATBALOGAN CITY- An ambitious and multi-billion peso economic district is being envisioned to be established in the city and is aimed to create thousands of employment and provide economic activities.

The Samar Business District (SBD), covering 70 hectares encompassing six barangays of this city, is being pushed by the provincial government in close coordination with the city government.

Governor Reynolds Michael Tan, who is behind this project, says that the proposed SBD is projected to cost P4 billion and is expected to be completed in four year's time.

"With the (establishment) of the Samar Business District, we envision that Catbalogan City and the rest of the province will become the center of trade and commerce on Samar Island," he said.

The 70 hectare of land to be used for the establishment of the SBD will involve reclaimed lots from the sea as Catbalogan is lacking of needed space, Tan said. And this early, the Sa-

Part of the mobile vaccination roll-out of the city gov't Women inmates at the Tacloban city jail receive jabs

TACLOBAN CITY-At least 42 women inmates in a jail facility here were administered with vaccine against coronavirus disease (COVID-19) on Thursday (August 12).

The vaccination among women inmates was part of the mobile vaccination roll-out of the city government under Mayor Alfred Romualdez to ensure that more qualified residents of the city would receive the jabs.

Dr. Joedina Gumagay, chief of hospital of the Tacloban City Hospital who led in the vaccination at

the Tacloban City Jail, said that inmates should be given priority in the vaccination drive to ensure that COVID-19 would not spread inside the facility.

"God forbid, if one of them will get the infection, it will be easy and fast for COVID-19 to spread that is why, we have to prioritize them in the vaccination," she said.

Mayor Romualdez, joined by his son, Raymund, witnessed the vaccination inside the jail facility. The said vaccination is considered to be a first in

DOH reports 100 percent vaccination of region's health workers

TACLOBAN CITY- All health workers here in the region have been inoculated as the Department of Health (DOH)-lead vaccination campaign continues targeting other groups.

Dr. Marc Steven Capungcol, head of the epidemiology and surveillance unit of the Department of Health (DOH-8), said that all 82,047 identified health workers across the region have already been vaccinated.

He said that among the priority groups, health workers in the region were the first to achieve a 100 percent vaccination.

Health workers are considered under the A1 category.

Capungcol describes as 'good news' on the complete vaccination of health workers in the region, especially now that several variants of coronavirus



been detected by the DOH.

"We will ensure that we will strengthen further our vaccination roll-out now that there are presence of several variants of concerns here in the region," he said in an online press conference on Wednesday (August 11).

Meantime, Capungcol said that out of the 447,306 senior citizens identified, 106,644 of them have so far received the jabs while those with comorbidities, 83,365 out of 292, 606 have been inoculated.

He also said that of those who have received the vaccines against COVID-19,

disease (COVID-19) have only 3,714 of them reported to have developed some adverse effects which includes fever, headache, increase of blood pressure, and swelling at the injection site.

> Capungcol disclosed that based on the 214 samples that they have sent to Philippine Genome Center for sequencing, variants of concern and under investigation were detected among these samples.

The samples detected were three Alpha cases; seven Beta cases and seven variant under investigation. The DOH has earlier confirmed on the presence of 10 Delta variants in the region. Capungcol admitted

that the presence of these variants contributed to the spike of COVID-19 cases in the region.

He, however, said that the loosening up of some protocols like border controls and the continued violation by some people on protocols like mass gatherings contributed to the increase of COVID-19 in the region.

On Friday (August 13), the DOH reported of 147 new cases, pushing the region's total COVID-19 cases to 38,059.

Its recoveries were logged at 36,444 with 1,184 active cases.

Tacloban city gov't starts rollout of Moderna vaccine

TACLOBAN CITY- The city government here has conducted on Wednesday (August 11) the pilot implementation of the first batch of Moderna vaccine in the region.

The vaccination process, both held at the two Robinsons shopping mall branches, was able to provide jabs to 2,700 individuals who belong to the priority groups involving health workers, seniors, and those with comorbidities.

Those who belong to A4 or belonging to economic sectors were also provided with the Moderna vaccine.

Personnel from the Department of Health (DOH) in the region were present during the roll-out to assist the vaccination teams from the City Health Office for the inoculation and proper handling of the vials.

Based on the DOH records, more than 48,500 residents of the city have received the first dose of which 32,046 of them done with the second dose.

Meantime, the DOH urges the public to have themselves vaccinated regardless of the brand.

It said that while the vaccines would not guarantee that one could not get the dreaded infection, the effects would not be severe.

They reiterated that the vaccines are safe and that vaccines work and it is the most effective way to end the pandemic. (LIZBETH ANN A. ABELLA)

quick vaccination system PALO, Leyte- The QVac (quick vaccination) system that is being implemented by this town is a big help in making sure of a smooth implementation of the vaccination against coronavi-

> rus disease (COVID-19). The QVac is an automated system that serves as a database and QR code generator to all vaccine recipients and would-be recipients from this town making it more comprehensive to track down vaccination data.

> The system also features an automated manner of informing the schedule of vaccinees through text messaging, aside from posting

the schedule at the official social media account of the municipal government.

Palo Mayor Frances Ann Petilla said that although the system is not yet 100 percent perfect, this has helped her town implement the vaccination program orderly and with no complaints from residents.


The town has also around 80 people who are members of the local vaccination team.

Rebel surrenders to police authorities in Eastern Samar

TACLOBAN CITY-An alleged member of the New People's Army (NPA) has surrendered to police authorities on Tuesday (August 10).

The rebel, identified only as 'Ka Raven,' 40, was said to be part of the pier-3/front 3 sub-regional committee Arctic of the Eastern Visayas Regional Party Committee.

The former rebel surrendered before Police Lt. Col. Joy Leanza, officer-in-charge of the 1st Eastern Samar Provincial Mobile Force Company which is headquartered in Dolores town, Eastern Samar.

Ka Raven, said to be a resident of the said town, also surrendered one unit of 9mm sub-machine gun rifle and ten live ammunitions.

He is now under the custody of 1st ESPMFC and is now facilitating for his application for him to avail the Enhanced Comprehensive Livelihood Integration Program (ECLIP) benefits accorded to former rebels.

Police B/Gen. Rommel Bernardo Cabagnot, the regional police director, welcomed the decision of the former rebel to surrender and return to the folds of the law.

"(His) return to the fold of the government is the outcome of our relentless campaigns in addressing social issues that lured him in joining the armed struggle, so we must persist and continue what we have started," he said.

Cabagnot, who just assumed his post last August 4, has directed his police personnel in the region to also help address the problem on insurgency. (JOEY A. GABIETA)

BFP-8, LGU Balangkayan break grounds for P7.1 million fire station

BORONGAN CITY-The Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) - Regional Office 8, and the Local Government Unit of Balangkayan, Eastern Samar on Monday, August 9, held a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of the Balangkayan Municipal Fire Station building.

The groundbreaking was led by S/Supt. Rodulfo Denaga, BFP-8 regional director and Mayor Allan Contado of Balangkayan.

According to Jimmy C. Pasague, BFP acting provincial fire director, the lot was donated by LGU-Balangkayan while the construction of the Municipal Fire Station building is funded by the BFP Central Office with a budget amounting to P7.1 million.

"The said building is part of the modernization program of BFP," Pasague said.

Pasague added that the new fire station building will be a two-storey building with enough space for their fire trucks and a comfortable area for the

firefighters and other personnel.

The acting Provincial Fire Director said that as of now there are four BFP Municipal Fire Station (MFS) buildings that are under construction. These are located in Balangkayan, San Policarpo, Dolores, and Gen. MacArthur.

In San Policarpo and Gen. MacArthur, Phase 1 construction were already done and they are waiting for additional funding for the Phase 2 construction.

In Dolores town, the construction of the MFS is already 50% complete with funding from the Office of Congresswoman Ma. Fe R. Abunda through the General Appropriations Act (GAA).

Pasague further said that in Eastern Samar, there are five municipalities that are waiting for funding such as Arteche, Sulat, Hernani, Lawa-an, and Salcedo.

The municipalities of Maydolong, San-Julian, Mercedes, and Llorente, have no MFS yet while the towns of Maslog, Jipapad, see 5,000 cops /page 16 ...

<u>With cases of COVID-19 cases still continues</u> Gov. Petilla, Mayor Romualdez welcome coming of tourists but stressed they must follow all the mandatory protocols

TACLOBAN CITY -Tourists are welcome to visit the region for as long as they will strictly follow all health protocols.

Thus said by Tacloban City Mayor Alfred Romualdez and Leyte Governor Leopoldo Dominico Petilla who both appeared at the recently-held 7th Regional Travel Fair hosted by the Department of Tourism and organized by the Tourism Promotion Board.

Romualdez said that the region is blessed with beautiful natural attractions and destinations where tourists can do various activities such as surfing, caving, and island hopping, then swimming in beautiful beaches or even boating.

But Romualdez said that while he is open to welcoming tourists again, they must strictly follow all the mandatory health protocols as coronavirus disease (COVID-19) continues.

"You can visit our region. We are not that strict but you have to follow the health protocols like wearing of face masks, and face shields if you are in close proximity with other when in public place," the city mayor said.

"If you will follow these protocols, then you can enjoy all the beautiful sights that our region offers. Most of these are open spaces and provide healthy and delicious foods," Romualdez added.

Travelers who wanted to visit Tacloban only needs to present their vaccination card instead of a negative RT-PCR test if they are fully vaccinated, an acceptance letter and the Tacloban QR code.

But for those who are yet fully vaccinated must present a negative RT-PCR test along with other important documents such as valid identification card.

Gov. Petilla, for his part, said that although tourism is one of the worst affected by COVID-19, the region's tourism industry appears to be thriving, showing resiliency by fighting the effects protocols, and look for new of the pandemic.

"I think our tourism in Region-8 is not totally down, in fact we can still see resiliency. For tourists who wanted to come, they are very much welcome," the governor said.

He added the province has relax some protocols to allow tourism-related facilities like hotels to reopen and restart their operation.

"The sooner we defeat COVID-19, the better for our tourism sector because our tourism sector is one if Northern Samar. not the worst hit industry by the pandemic. That is why, here in the province of Levte we try to relax some of our protocols to allow businesses like hotels to resume operations," Petilla said.

"We try to loosen the

ways to lessen the spread and to prevent hospitalization and death of those who will get infected with COVID-19," he added.

Tourism Regional Director Karina Rosa Tiopes, cities and provinces that are open to domestic tourists or tourists who comes from other regions of the country are the cities of Tacloban, Maasin, and Catbalogan, and the provinces of Southern Leyte, Samar, Eastern Samar and

million infections and more than 29,000 deaths in the Philippines alone.

In case we are wondering just how many 29,000 is, someone suggested we imagine two full Mall of Asia Arenas. That accordingly is how many Filipinos have succumbed to COVID-19 already, which is a huge crowd and a big number of people, indeed.

The rising number of COVID-19 cases, particularly due to the Delta variant in the past month alone, had prompted the government to impose lockdowns again, with the strictest enhanced community quarantine (ECQ) being imposed in Metro Manila, Laguna, Bataan, Iloilo City, and Cagayan de Oro. Government action needed against plastic pollution woes

`It took a recent foreign report for three (3) Philippine Environmental Health groups to urge the Philippine government to take immediate action against plastic pollution caused by "waste management schemes such as incineration by limiting the production of plastic."

The three Philippine environmental groups namely: EcoWaste Coalition (EWC), Interfacing Development Interventions for Sustainability (IDIS), AND Mother Earth Foundation (MEF), issued a joint statement emphasizing the need to limit "the manufacture of plastic to essential uses and eliminating toxic chemicals in plastic production to halt the swelling problem of plastic waste in the environment, including the world's oceans."

The aforementioned foreign report entitled "Plastic Waste Management Waste-to-Ener-Hazards gy, Chemical Recycling and Plastic Fuels" by Ja-International pan-based Pellet Watch (IPW) and Sweden-based International Pollutants Elimination Network (IPEN). The same report "showed that chemical recycling plastic-to-fuel and incineration to manage plastic waste is generating highly hazardous waste and toxic emissions." Lee Bell, author of the report, mentioned that "No current management method for plastic waste is capable of alleviating the world's

Bell's report was corroborated by Shige Takada's findings that "plastic's toxic chemicals have been found across the world's oceans, coastlines and in the isolated polar region." Thus, fish and seabirds swallow plastic waste contaminated by these toxic UV sabilisers, and it builds up in the food chain." International scientists suggests that governments (the Philippines included), must manage existing stockpiles of plastic waste in an environmentally sound manner and encourage industry to develop an environmentally sound, sustainable system for any plastic produce in the future."

On the issue about plastic waste deposited in marine waters, the Philippine government has a big role to play, considering that the country has been tagged as

DOH reports of Alpha, Beta, Delta, P.3 variants in the region

TACLOBAN **CITY-Variants** of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) ranging from Alpha, Beta, Delta to variant under investigation P.3 have been detected across the region, the Department of Health (DOH-8) announced Thursday (August 12).

And the DOH said investigation is still ongoing as to how these variants could have entered the region considering patients detected to have the variants have no history of travel outside the region.

"All cases are considered to have been transmitted locally due to absence of any travel history outside the region amongst the individuals with the detected cases,"Dr. Marc Steven Capungcol, head of the surveillance and epidemiology unit, said during a virtual press conference Wednesday(August last 11).

The cases include three of the Alpha variant or B.1.1.7 first identified in variant cases in the region the UK, seven cases of the Beta variant or B.1.351 first identified in South Africa, one more case of the Delta variant or the B.1.6.1.7 lineage first identified in India, and seven cases of variant under investigation P.3 first detected in the Philippines.

Capungcol said that all these cases are still from the same set of 214 samples sent to the Philippine Genome Center for sequencing between June and July.

The three Alpha variant cases are from the cities of Ormoc, and Tacloban, and Eastern Samar while the seven Beta variant cases are from Samar (3), Eastern Samar (2), Northern Samar (1), and Biliran (1). With the initial 10 re-

ported cases of the Delta variant in the region, the agency's Surveillance and Epidemiology Unit received another case detection of the said variant of concern in Borongan City bringing the total Delta

to 11.

Meanwhile, the seven confirmed cases for the variant under investigation (P.3) are from Samar (2), Eastern Samar (2), Tacloban (1), and Ormoc (2).

The DOH stressed the importance of active case monitoring, surveillance, and contact tracing up to the third generation of all confirmed cases to control and contain any possible further transmission.

"This is imperative as the hospital utilization rate of the hospitals in the region is affected by the salient surge of COVID-19 cases," Capungcol said.

"Currently, the hospital utilization rate of Ormoc is at a high risk level, moderate risk for Tacloban, and Samar, and the rest are still at a low risk level," he added.

The regional health department called on the public and local leaders to observe the intensified implementation of the prevention, detection,

isolation, treatment, reintegration strategies across all settings, stricter border control, and proper adherence to the minimum public health standards.

Capungcol maintained that "whole genome sequencing, or the comprehensive method used to determine other variants of concern, is conducted to guide the overall response strategies of the government and to determine if variants are causing spike in cases, and thus should not be used as point-ofcare strategies."

"Regardless of the presence of a variant of concern, the management and interventions for these cases remain the same," Capungcol said.

As this developed, the regional health stressed the importance of vaccinating priority groups A2 (senior citizens) and A3 (persons with underlying conditions) since they are at high risk for severe Covid-19 cases and death. "Vaccines are effective

in reducing morbidity and mortality due to Covid-19, which will be very instrumental in the institution's primary goal of saving lives," it said.

As of Friday, Eastern Visayas logged 147 new COVID-19 cases, bringing the region's total number of cases at 38,059 with total recoveries at 36,444 266, total deaths at 431 and total active cases at 1,184.





... from Page 1 no marine lives would be affected for this ambitious project.

The detail of the project like its master plan, however, is still under study, Tan said.

But he said that the area of the proposed SBD was chosen as it is here where a tide embankment is being constructed which aim to address the perennial flooding problem of the city.

"We actually chose the location as we just took advantage of the tide embankment project there. And part of the project is the construction of some pumping stations to address any possible flooding incident," Tan said.

According to Tan, for the project to materialized, they need at least P4 billion of which the governor has yet to divulge where the provincial government will source its funding.

But Gov. Tan did not to the people and to the province.



Agencies, LGUs need to align transition plans for devolution

TACLOBAN CITY -The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) has called on national government agencies and local government units (LGUs) in Eastern Visayas to strengthen its coordination to prepare for the Supreme Court ruling that will give more functions to local governments starting 2022.

DBM Eastern Visayas regional director Imelda Laceras said during a virtual orientation on Thursday(August 12) that all departments and agencies of the national government should continue reviewing their respective priorities, strategic plans, and functions to reflect the progressive operationalization of the full devolution of basic services and facilities.

Laceras said several national government agencies (NGAs) already have transition plans that include identifying devolved functions and services, service delivery standards, capacity development strategies for LGUs, a framework for monitoring and performance assessment of LGUs, and organizational effectiveness proposal.

"Some LGUs are now starting their transition plans. They have been asked to prepare their transition plans in close coor-

TACLOBAN CITY _ The Regional Development Council (RDC) in Eastern Visayas on Wednesday (August 11) reported that some 29,422 housing units for victims of Super Typhoon Yolanda are already occupied while 11,266 are ready for occupancy out of the 64,696 target units.

"The remaining 1,279 units still lack electricity and water supply and are not yet ready to be occupied," the RDC regional project monitoring committee stated in a report posted on the website of the National Economic Development Authority in Eastern Visayas.

After more than seven years, challenges remain in the completion of the post-Yolanda housing projects, according to the region's highest policymaking body.

"These include delays due to unfavorable weather conditions, lack of manpower and resources deployed on-site, additional works to suit actual field conditions, delayed issuances of permits and licenses from the local governments and other agencies, among many others," the RDC added.

The council also reported that the Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA) recorded a 96 percent completion on the Tacloban North
