The typhoon made three landfalls in the region

“Jolina” kills 12; agri sector losses close to P80 million

TACLOBAN CITY- Typhoon ‘Jolina’ has turned out to be a deadly storm to hit the region this year, killing 12 people and damage to agriculture initially pegged close to P80 million.

The dead persons were mostly fishermen who were caught the fury of Jolina while they were at the seas.

Most of the dead were recovered at the shores of Santo Niño, an island town in Samar province where Jolina made its third and last landfall in the region.

The storm, which had a maximum sustained winds of 120 kms/hour and with a gustiness of 180 km/hour also made its first landfall

in Hernani, Eastern Samar at around 10 pm on Monday (Sept.6), then in Daram, Samar at around 2 am the following day and at Santo Niño which occurred at around 3:40 am.

The local police there recovered the dead bodies of Alejandro Solayao, 55; Sonny Boy Ibayon, 39; Joseph Emnas; and Benedicto de Paz.

Amid increase of suicide cases among minors, youth group in Samar to put up ‘purple desk’

TACLOBAN CITY- As suicide cases are on the rise involving minors in Samar province, a youth organization will be launching a ‘purple desk’ that aims to prevent suicide involving the target group.

The purple desk will provide a venue for the youths who are facing mental health problems to have

a place where they can have someone to talk with and share their problem and in the process, give them advice, John Michael Cristobal, provincial information officer said.

The purple desk will be spearheaded by the Sirak Kabataan and is targeting to establish 951 purple desks in all towns and cities in Samar

province.

“Its purpose is to give a safe space for teenagers or youth to share their stories because gathered information by our organizing team during membership caravan, their common problem(s) reflected at the registration is family problem

3-month baby among EV's latest COVID-19 patient to die due to the infection

TACLOBAN CITY- A three-month old baby boy is the latest person in Eastern Visayas to have succumbed to the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) infection.

The baby, who was from the town of Tolosa in Leyte, died on Sunday (Sept.5) while being confined for an undisclosed ailment at the Eastern Visayas Medical Center (EVMC), this city.

The baby's parents, as close contacts, were swabbed on Tuesday (Sept.7), Dr. Lyn Benitez, health officer of Tolosa town.

The baby, the town's 14th and youngest fatality due to COVID-19 complications, was immediately buried.

With the death of the baby due to dreaded virus, Benitez said that they are further intensifying their campaign against COVID-19 in their town which has already logged 486 cases with more than 20 active cases.

"We are asking our people to strictly follow all the health protocols like wearing of face masks even inside their homes," she said.

The Department of Health (DOH) on Friday (Sept.10) announced of 241 new

COVID-19 cases of the region, pushing its total cases to 43,515 since the pandemic started March of last year.

Its total recoveries stand at 41,125 and active cases of 1918. Its number of deaths due to COVID-19 complications is now at 472.

The DOH has earlier announced of 17 new

Delta variants and one Beta variant in the region which were cited by the DOH as among possible reasons why Eastern Visayas is experiencing a spike of COVID-19 for the past days now.

"Following the detection of cases with variants of concern, it is of essence that the

intensified implementation of the prevention, detection, isolation, treatment, reintegration strategies across all settings, stricter border control, and proper adherence to the minimum health standards must be observed," the DOH said in a statement.

Non-users of StaySafe application will be barred entry at the PNP-8 headquarter

TACLOBAN CITY – The regional headquarter of the Philippine National Police (PNP) will now strictly implement the use of StaySafe.ph application beginning this week.

With this, those who will visit the regional headquarters have to register first to StaySafe.PH before they would be allow entry to the premises of the camp.

Lt.Col. Ma. Bella Rentuaya, spokesperson of the PNP-8, said that the implementation is based on a memorandum issued by the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG).

The StaySafe application is a contact tracing mobile

application introduced by the DILG and the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Disease and approved by the Department of Health (DOH).

The move of the PNP headquarters to use the mobile application is in the wake of continuing surge of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in the region with the DOH reporting on the existence of the Delta variant which is now eyed as the most common variant of COVID-19 in the country and as reason why the spike of cases of the dreaded virus.

and depression," Cristobal said.

Based on police records, suicide cases involving minors in Samar have shown a remarkable increase in 2020 compared to 2019.

At least 17 suicide cases were reported by the police in 2020, higher by eight incidents in 2019.

For this year, from January to June, at least three cases were recorded by the police.

Suicide incidents is linked by experts to mental health problem, which become one of the health issues during this pandemic caused by coronavirus disease (COVID-19).

If not properly addressed this poses higher risk for those who are experiencing family

problem that could to depression, alcohol and substance abuse or even suicide.

Cristobal said that since there is still no physical structure yet for the Sirak Kabataan in villages in the province except in Calbayog and Catbalogan cities, they will be training the youths as peer counselors.

At least 30 youths have been chosen to be part of the training who will then cascade what they have learned to the ground by training other youths in cities and towns of the province.

Cristobal added that there are also experts who will handle cases that will be referred by peer counsellors if they found during the assessment that the youth need assistance from a professional.

In Maasin City Delta patients now recovered, says mayor

TACLOBAN CITY- The two patients in Maasin City earlier reported to have been infected of the Delta variant of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) have fully recovered.

This was announced by Mayor Naccional Mercado who, however, said that one of these patients were still tested positive for COVID-19.

He was quick to say that he was informed by the Department of Health(DOH) that despite the patient was still tested positive, the virus detected from his patient was just a 'remnant' of his previous virus load.

Thus, he said, the said patient could now go out and resume to work again.

Mayor Mercado said that he was informed by

the regional epidemiology and surveillance unit of the DOH that patients having the Delta virus could still be detected to be positive of the virus up to 90 days.

"This is just a remnant (virus) and is no longer infectious or contagious. Thus, he could now go back to work. So please don't panic and don't discriminate (the person).He

is already fully recovered. Our two patients detected earlier to have the Delta variant are now fully recovered," he said.

It was learned from Mercado that out of the 107 swab samples submitted by the City Health Office last Monday, 39 of them were tested positive for COVID-19.

And one of the samples that turned out negative

was his sample, the city mayor said.

His father, Rep. Roger Mercado, was earlier tested to have been infected of the deadly virus that has already claimed 36 lives in Maasin City.

Maasin has 1,273 total COVID-19 cases of which 1,140 of them were considered to have recovered and with 99 active cases.

3-day police operations lead to the arrest of 202 suspects of various crimes in the region

TACLOBAN CITY- At least 202 suspects of different crimes were arrested by police authorities across the region during its three-day operations under its simultaneous anti-criminality law enforcement operation (Sacleo).

B/Gen. Rommel Bernardo Cabagnet, police regional director, said that the arrest of these suspects were the result of his directive for his men to intensify their operations against individuals who have outstanding warrants.

"Despite the pandemic that we are all facing, there

are still criminalities and illegal activities that transpire," he said in a statement.

Cabagnet said that the PNP is aggressively conducting police operations to address the criminality

50 fishermen rescued by the local police *Police officials praises heroic act of Santo Nino police*

TACLOBAN CITY- Colonel Peter Limbauan, director of Samar Police Provincial Office, lauded the personnel of Sto. Nino Municipal Police Station for their successful search, rescue and retrieval operation after they brought some 50

fishermen to safety amid the onslaught of typhoon 'Jolina' from September 7 to 8, 2021.

"In behalf of Police Regional Office 8 through Samar Police Provincial Office, we are greatly indebted with the unified effort of the

advocacy groups and force multipliers of Sto. Niño Municipal Police Station who immediately provided assistance during this time of calamity," he said.

"(The) swift and timely response of the police officers in this situation saved

the lives of these fishermen and they made it possible for them to return to their families safely," the police provincial director added.

Personnel of Sto. Nino Municipal Police Station, headed by Lieutenant Manuel Ricalde, rescued the

fishermen while they were floating for several hours in the seawaters during the onslaught of Typhoon Jolina.

The police and the local government unit also

TACLOBAN CITY - The city government of Borongan has now its own pharmacy where its residents could have their needed medical supplies for free.

The opening of the city's drugstore was opened on Sept.8, coinciding with its fiesta celebration.

The establishment of the pharmacy is part of the 'Libre Medisina' program of the city government under Mayor Jose Ivan Dayan Agda.

The establishment of the said drug store, which is just located at the ground floor of the city hall building, is a fulfillment of the earlier promised of Agda to provide free medicines to the poor residents of the city.

Mayor Agda, in his message, said that those who need medicine and antibiotic will no longer have to worry because there are available free medicines at the city pharmacy.

TACLOBAN CITY - The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) reported on Thursday that 10,825 family food packs (FFPs) will be distributed to victims of Typhoon 'Jolina' in Eastern Visayas.

The production of food packs in different warehouses is ongoing as the DSWD activated its quick response team tasked to monitor the typhoon's impact in Leyte and Samar provinces.

"The local government is the first to respond to disasters. DSWD may come in when they need additional personnel or relief items," the DSWD said in a statement.

The FFPs have been prepositioned in warehouses in Catarman, Northern Samar; Allen, Northern Samar; Canavina, Eastern Samar; Catbalogan City, Samar; Naval,

Biliran; and Maasin City, Southern Leyte.

The bulk of the food packs is stored at the DSWD Regional Resource Operations Cen-

ter warehouse in Palo, Leyte.

Each food pack consists of rice, canned goods, and coffee, packed in a small box for one

family.

"We are stepping up our coordination with local government units (LGUs) to gather critical information regarding

the effect of Typhoon Jolina. We are ready to extend assistance to LGUs," the DSWD added.

Among its assistance is the relief augmentation, ensuring that the protection of rights of people who left their homes due to the storm, and camp coordination and camp management, where the DSWD helps local governments on how to manage evacuation centers.

'Jolina' left a trail of destruction as it crossed Samar Island on Sept. 6 and 7.

The storm made five landfalls in Samar with the first in Hernani, Eastern Samar on the night of Sept. 6.

It also made landfalls in the towns of Daram, Santo Niño, Almagro, and Tagapul-an, Samar.

How we perspired sipping the hot *sabaw* of *tinola* come lunchtime. Why, it was so *malagsim* for having freshly-caught fishes in them! How we consumed so much rice with this vi-and. We would always end up full, our bellies bloated, after the eating spree.

It's really different when, sometimes, we would happen to have a spoiled fish already. This usually occurred when any young man from the house would accidentally buy such a fish out of ignorance, for then, it was only our mama who could perfectly determine whether the fish was still fresh or not. The fish albeit cooked was smelly. And

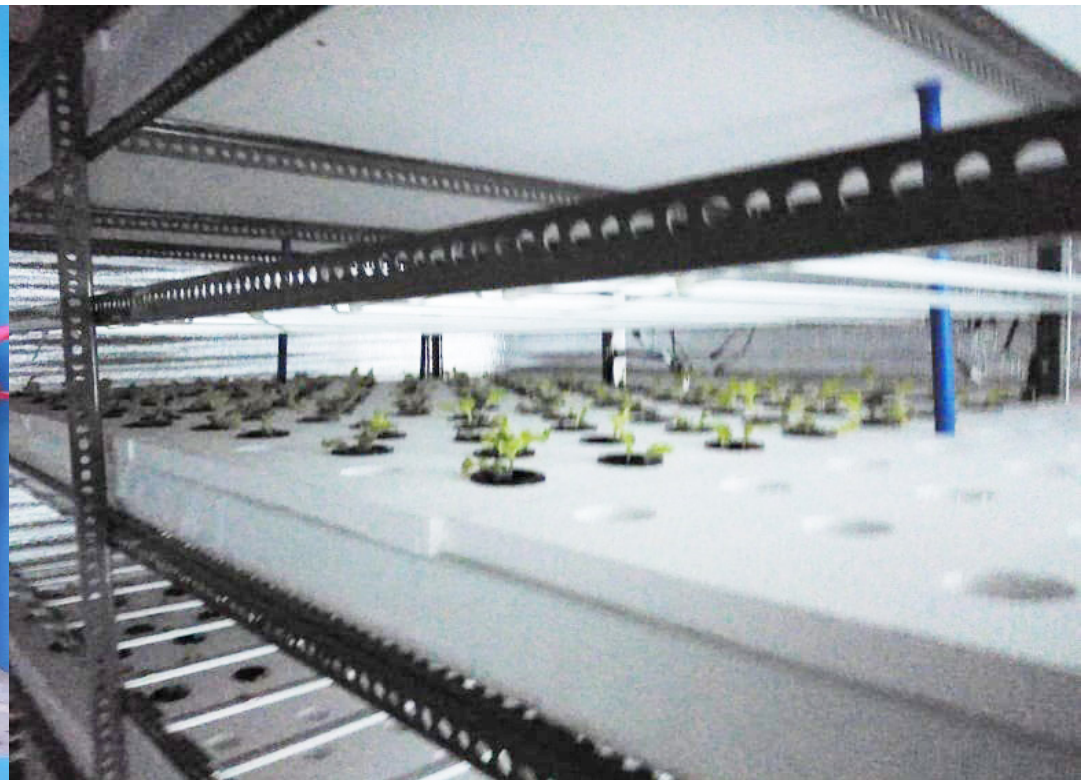

relations officer of the Santo Nino police station, in a phone interview, said that the fishermen were part of a group of fishers who were

on board of a fishing boat from Tacloban City which was caught by strong winds and heavy rains spawned by Jolina.

"They were in the same fishing boat which cap-

sized due to the battering of strong winds and heavy rains spawned by Jolina," Cabiling said.

At least 50 fishermen whose addresses were from the cities of Tacloban and Catbalogan, and from the towns of Zumarraga, Sta. Margarita, and Daram, all in Samar province, were by rescued along the shores of Santo Niño, he added.

"All rescued fishermen were brought to the municipal hall where they were provided assistance by the municipal government," Cabiling said.

The other deaths of the region due to Jolina were Marcelo Lolo, 22 from Maa-sin City, Southern Leyte who was drowned after he tried to rescue a floating cottage; Ryan Jerusalem, 23, a fisherman from Tarangan town, Samar; Roy Carcellar, 52 and Mark Jhun Nierras, 23, both fishermen from the town of Daram, also in Samar; and Bienvenido Marquez, 65 from Catbalogan City, Samar, who was on his way home to Brgy. Bulu-an, when his boat capsized off the waters of Sierra Island, also in Catbalogan City.

The dead bodies of the fishermen who were earlier declared as missing were recovered on Thursday (Sept. 8): Nathaniel Ripalda, 18, of Tanauan, Leyte whose body was recovered by local authorities at 9:17 am along Binahaan River, also in the same town and Elvis Catienza, 37, whose body was recovered at around 8 am in Brgy. San Roque, Culaba town, Biliran.

Meantime, another still unidentified body was recovered at the shoreline in Brgy. Manraya, San Antonio, Northern Samar at about 6:30 am, also on Thursday. Villagers have decided to

bury the dead body of the man, already bloating and in the state of decomposition, at the town's public cemetery.

The man is suspected to have been drowned during the fury of Jolina.

The other fishermen, Rolly Oledan, 43 of Zumarraga, Samar and Rolly Reguero, 72 of Kawayan, Biliran, are still both reported to be missing as of press time.

Meantime, close to P80 millions of agriculture products and livestock were damaged due to the onslaught of Jolina which also resulted to power outage in major parts of the region.

The damage report, however, may change as validation still continues, Francis Rosaroso, regional information officer of the Department of Agriculture (DA), said.

"These are still raw data that we have received from our partner local government units affected by the typhoon. This will still be validated. It could either increase or decrease depending on the results of field validation," he said.

But based on the report received by the DA regional office as of Friday (August 9),

damage to agriculture, to include palay, is at P79.96 million.

The same report said that the damage to palay sector had a cost of P38 million followed by root crops valued at P32 million.

But Rosaroso said that the damage of palay due to the typhoon would not affect their projected output for this year of 973,450 metric tons.

This is because, he said, only 50 hectares were totally damaged as the remaining 467 hectares were only damaged partially.

"Meaning, farmers of these (partially damaged hectares) still have chance to recover," Rosaroso said.

The report also include damaged to corn (P230, 500), bananas (P4.0 million), vegetables (P2.43 million), fruit trees (P2.7 million), and livestock (P380, 000).

The typhoon has also affected 2,765 farmers involving 517 hectares of agricultural lands.

Of the affected provinces, Eastern Samar reported of the biggest loss of its agriculture sector amounting to P71.51 million. At least 2,059 farmers lost

their farm products covering 72 hectares.

The province of Biliran, meanwhile, reported of P5.80 million damage, affecting 225 farmers involving 191 hectares.

Samar province loss of agriculture products due to Jolina was pegged at P1.29 million. At least 353 of its farmers were also affected involving 139 hectares.

The province of Leyte reported of 116 farmers covering 110 hectares were affected with a cost of P1.19 million.

The least affected was the province of Southern Leyte which claimed to have a damage to its agriculture in the amount of just more than P154, 000 with 12 farmers covering five hectares as damaged due to the typhoon.

Only the province of Northern Samar has not yet reported of damage of its agriculture.

Local government units across the region were also forced to suspend their works and classes and even their scheduled vaccination program due to the storm.

We send also letter to each barangay to intensify the campaign by announcing the message through public address which is very common already in most of the barangay under Patoc National High School.

From this strategy the whole community of the barangay will have an awake mind regarding the incoming opening of classes because the message reverberates over and over into their ears by the time announcement were made.

The Patoc National High School upholds the guidelines and very determine to carry out its mission to bring out quality education even to the very least and impoverished learners.

ORDER
On April 26, 2021, plain-tiffs, through counsel, filed a Motion for Substituted Ser-vice of Summons through Publication as to Defendant Edgar Daga because alleged-ly he is already residing abroad. The Court, however, in its Order dated May 21, 2021 denied the Motion be-cause there was no Affidavit of the plaintiffs setting forth the grounds for the summons for publication. On June 29, 2021, plaintiffs filed a second Motion for Leave of Court for Substituted Service of Sum-mons through Publication, this time with the Affidavit of Erlinda Narido and Lilia Va-leriano, representatives of the plaintiffs in this case, stating therein the grounds for the application for summons for publication.

After a careful evaluation of the Motion, the Court re-solves to GRANT the same.

Section 17, Rule 14 of the Revised Rules of Court pro-vides:

“**Section 17.** Extraterri-torial service. - *When the de-fendant does not reside and is not found in the Philippines, and the action affects the per-sonal status of the plaintiff o-relates to, or the subject of which is, property within the Philippines, in which the de-fendant has or claims a lien or interest, actual or contin-gent, or in which the relief demanded consists, wholly or in part, in excluding the defendant has been attached within the Philippines, ser-vice may, by leave of court, be effected out of the Philippines by personal service as under Section 5; or as provided for in international conventions to which the Philippines is a party; or by publication in a newspaper of general cir-culation in such places and for such time as the court may order, in which case a copy of the summons and order of the court shall be sent by reg-istered mail to the last known address of the defendant, or in any other manner the court may deem sufficient. Any or-der granting such leave shall speficy a reasonable time, which shall not be less than sixty (60) calendar days after notice, within which the de-fendant must answer.*”

WHEREFORE, in view of the foregoing, the Motion for Publication under *Section 17, Rule 14 of the Revised*

Rules of Court is **GRANTED**.

Accordingly, let service of summons by publication be made upon defendant Edgar Daga through a newspaper of general circulation in the locality of Tacloban City, in-cluding the provinces of Leyte and Samar, and in another newspaper of general cir-culation in the Philippines. The summons by publication is to be published once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in both newspapers. Plaintiffs are directed to furnish a copy of this Order as well as the corresponding Summons and copy of the Complaint at his address in Singapore, through the Department of Foreign Affairs, all at the expense of plaintiffs. Within sixty (60) calendar days upon receipt of such notice, defendant Edgar Daga is hereby directed to file his Answer in connection with this case.

and other illegal activities in the region.

“We are appealing to the public to take their part as peace and order is everybody’s concern,” the police regional director said.

The September 6 to 8 operations resulted to the arrest of 39 personalities involved in illegal fishing; 19 in illegal logging; 46 in

illegal gambling; and nine drug suspects.

Of the arrested, 89 of them have outstanding warrants.

On the illegal drug operations, police authorities seized methamphetamine hydrochloride or sha-bu with a total estimated street value of P 116, 800.

In anti-illegal gambling, bet money amounting to P 2,923 was confiscated while under the anti-ille-

gal logging operations, an estimated total of P523,251 worth of lumber was seized.

A total of P324,890 worth of fish and fishing paraphernalia were confiscated from anti-illegal fishing operations while 22 different firearms were turned-over from ‘kontra boga’ operations.

ORDINANCE NO. 06
Series of 2021

**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING BENEFITS AND INCENTIVES TO
BARANGAY HEALTH WORKERS (BHWs) OF NORTHERN SAMAR
AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled:

Section 1. TITLE. This ordinance shall be known as the North-
ern Samar Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) Benefits and Incen-
tive Ordinance, and for other purpose.

Sec. 2. DECLARATION OF POLICIES. It shall be the policy of
the province to provide quality standard of health services, thus
adheres to the declared policy of the state as provided in Sec-
tion 2 of RA No. 7883, otherwise known as the Barangay Health
Workers (BHWs) Benefit and Incentives Act of 1995.

It shall likewise be declared Policy that the Province of North-
ern Samar recognizes the work and services of the Barangay
Health Workers (BHWs) as frontliners/partners of health pro-
grams implementation in the Barangays.

Sec. 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS.

a. Barangay Health Worker (BHW) - refers to a person who
has undergone DOH basic health training course for Barangay
Health Workers (BHWs) conducted by an accredited government
agency or reputable NGO and who voluntarily renders primary
health care services in the community.

b. Registered Barangay Health Worker (BHW) - refers to a
person who renders voluntary primary health care services in
his/her community for at least one (1) year and is registered in
their respective Municipal Health Board.

c. Accredited Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) - In addition
to its definition found in a and b of this section refers to a person
who rendered primary health services voluntarily in his/her com-
munity for at least 3 years registered with the Municipal Health
Board and is accredited by the Department of Health/Provincial
Health Office (DOH-PHO).

d. Primary Health Care Services (as directed by their Muni-
cipal Health Officer (MHO) - are essential health care services such
as:

i. education on prevailing health problems, the methods of
preventing and controlling them;

- ii. promotion of adequate supply of water;
- iii. promotion of maternal and child care including family plan-
ning and immunization against major infectious deceases;
- iv. education on basic environmental sanitation;
- v. prevention and control of locally endemic deceases;
- vi. appropriate treatment of common diseases and injuries;
- vii. promotion of mental health awareness;
- viii. prevention of oral-dental deceases and promotion of den-
tal health;
- ix. provision and proper use of essential drugs and herbal med-
icines;
- x. promotion of access and utilization of hospital cares and rural
health centers as center of wellness.

Section 4. COVERAGE. This ordinance shall cover all Registered
and Accredited Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) in the Province
of Northern Samar who voluntarily rendered primary basic health
services for at least three (3) years in his/her community, except
those BHWs who are holding permanent/plantilla positions and
those who are elected and appointed Barangay Officials. Provided
the following qualifications are met:

- a. At least 18 years old and not more than 65 years old
- b. Elementary graduate
- c. A permanent resident of the Barangay for at least 3 years
- d. Must be physically and mentally fit
- e. With good moral character

PROVIDED FURTHER; that after having met the requirements
found in (a) to (c), BHWs must undergo basic health training course
conducted by Government Agency or reputable Non-Government
Organization (NGO) accredited by Department of Health (DOH) in
order for him/her to attain accredited status.

Sec. 5. INCENTIVE and BENEFITS. In recognition of their ser-
vices, all Registered and Accredited Barangay Health Workers
(BHWs) who are actively and regularly performing their duties as
certified by the Local Health Board, as referred to in section 4 here-
of shall be entitled to the benefits and incentives as follows:

a. Financial Assistance - Accredited and Registered Barangay
Health Workers (BHWs) except those mentioned in section 4 here-
with shall receive financial assistance of not less than P6,000/year
(P500/month) from the Provincial Government, the specific date,
time and place to receive the incentive shall be upon the discretion
of the Governor.

b. Loyalty Incentive - Accredited and registered Barangay
Health Workers (BHWs) who have rendered cumulative services for
the following number of years shall be correspondingly entitled to
certificate of recognition, duly signed by the Governor and mone-
tary incentives as follows:

- 1. 10-15 years ----- P1,000.00 and Certificate of
Recognition
- 2. 15-30 years ----- P1,500.00 and Certificate of
Recognition
- 3. more than 30 years ----- P2,000 and Certificate of Recognition

This loyalty benefits shall be given every five (5) years from
the time this ordinance is approved. The length of cumulative ser-
vice shall be reckoned from the time the Barangay Health Work-
ers (BHWs) was accredited by the Department of Health (DOH) as
certified by the Municipal Health Office (MHO) as volunteer in the
Barangays.

This particular benefit shall be given by the Governor or his duly
authorized representative.

c. Medical and Dental Assistance - medical and dental examina-
tions including hospitalization at Northern Samar Provincial Hos-
pital (NSPH) or any district hospital shall be Free of charge to all
accredited BHWs’

d. Educational Assistance for BHW - BHWs who have volun-
teered and is registered for three (3) consecutive years in the LGUs
thru the Municipal Health Board shall be entitled for a basic health
care training course conducted by DOH/PHO or any authorized
NGO and shall likewise receive a numbered certificate for his/her
accreditation;

e. Educational Assistance for BHWs Dependent - a dependent
of each BHW shall be automatically be entitled to a one child
scholar assistance in the Eskolar ng Probinsya without undergo-
ing regular process conducted for the said scholarship program.
Should the BHW have more than one child, other dependents
shall undergo the screening process for them to qualify with the
scholarship.

Sec. 6. APPROPRIATION. The amount necessary to carry out
the provisions of this Ordinance, following its enactment, shall
be included in the ensuing appropriation ordinance embodying
the amount or through a supplemental budget and every year
thereafter the same shall be included in the annual budget of the
Provincial Government.

Sec. 7. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this ordi-
nance is declared invalid, the remainder or any provisions hereof
not affected thereby shall remain enforce and effect.

Sec. 8. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances, executive order,
issuances including rules and regulations inconsistent with this
ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

Sec. 9. EFFECTIVITY. This ordinance shall take effect imme-
diately.



Catbalogan City receives over 1,000 doses of Pfizer

TACLOBAN CITY – A total of 1,195 residents of Catbalogan City has received their first dose of Pfizer vaccines, according to the city government.
