In the wake of ambush incidents

M/Gen. De Leon welcomes NTF-ELCAC retention

TACLOBAN CITY-The Army leadership here in the region has welcomed the decision to continue the implementation of the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-ELCAC).

Major General Edgardo de Leon, the commanding officer of the 8th Infantry Division, said that the continuation of the ELCAC would ensure that more members of the armed wing of the communist group in the country will return to the folds of the law.

de Leon said that since the ELCAC was enforced in 2019, 418 regular members of the New People's Army (NPA) have surrendered to government authorities.

"And this number could be higher considering that this figure was of May 3 of

this year. (That is why) we are happy that the ELCAC will still continue as this will pave the way for more surrender (of the NPAs)," he said.

Sec. Clarita Carlos, the national security adviser of President Ferdinand 'Bong-bong' Marcos, Jr. who sits as the vice chair of the NTF-ELCAC, earlier said that she is for the continuation of the said program and even offered an amnesty program for the rebels.

Eastern Visayas is among the remaining regions in the country where

there is still a presence of the communist armed group.

For the past few days now, skirmishes between government personnel and NPA members have occurred, the latest of which was last Tuesday which resulted in the death of a soldier and the wounding of five others in Catubig town, Northern Samar.

The NTF-ELCAC is a task force organized under the administration of President Rodrigo Duterte using

PSA announces 2021 annual provincial labor force statistics

In 2021, Eastern Visayas registered a Labor Force Participation Rate (LFPR) of 63.2 percent. This was 5.0 percentage points higher than the 58.2 percent LFPR reported in 2020, and the highest in the past four (4) years since 2018. The 63.2 percent LFPR corresponds to around 2.02 million total population 15 years old and over who were either employed or unemployed during the period in review (Table 1).

Of the six (6) provinces in the region, Samar registered the highest LFPR at 70.6 percent, corresponding to 381 thousand labor force during the year in review. This was followed by Biliran, Northern Samar and Eastern Samar with 68.2 percent, 66.5 percent and 65.1 percent, respectively. Leyte posted the lowest LFPR at 58.7 percent. Tacloban City, the lone Highly Urbanized City (HUC) in the region, had 58.9 percent LFPR in 2021.

There were about 1.88 million employed persons out of the estimated 2.02 million labor force in 2021. This placed the region's employment rate at 93.4 percent, higher by 1.4 percentage points than the 92.0 percent employment rate in 2020. However, this was lower by 2.4 percentage points and 2.2 percentage points compared with the 95.8 percent and 95.6 percent employment rates in 2018

and 2019, respectively.

Meanwhile, among provinces in the region, Samar posted the highest employment rate in Eastern Visayas at 96.1 percent. Eastern Samar was next with 95.0 percent employment rate, followed by Biliran at 92.9 percent employment rate. The lowest employment rate was reported in Northern Samar at 91.5 percent, trailed by Leyte and Southern Leyte at 92.4 percent and 92.5 percent, respectively. Tacloban City recorded 93.5 percent employment rate during the year in review.

Eastern Visayas posted a 6.6 percent unemployment rate in 2021. This means that there were around 134 thousand persons unemployed out of the 2.02 million persons in the labor force in 2021. This showed an improvement from the 8.0 percent unemployment rate in 2020. This rate, however, was still higher compared with the unemployment rates in 2018 and 2019 at 4.2 percent and 4.4 percent, respectively.

Among the provinces in Region 8, Northern Samar reported the highest unemployment rate at 8.5 percent, followed by Leyte, Southern Leyte and Biliran at 7.6 percent, 7.5 percent and 7.1 percent, respectively. The rest of the provinces posted lower unemployment than the 6.6 percent unemployment rate in Region 8 with Samar recording the lowest unemployment rate at 3.9 percent, followed by East-

ern Samar at 5.0 percent. Meanwhile, Tacloban City posted 6.5 percent unemployment rate in 2021.

Underemployed population is the proportion of employed population who expresses the desire to have additional hours of work in their present job, or an additional job, or to have a new job with longer working hours. The underemployment rate in Eastern Visayas in the past four years has been double-digit, fluctuating slightly from 21.4 percent in 2018 to 20.9 percent in 2021.

The region's 20.9 percent underemployment rate in 2021 translates to about 394 thousand underemployed persons out of the estimated 1.88 million employed population recorded during the said year. All provinces reported double-digit underemployment rates except Eastern Samar where underemployment rate was 9.1 percent. Northern Samar posted the highest at 29.7 percent, Southern

Leyte ranked second at 27.2 percent, Biliran at 25.0 percent, Leyte at 24.9 percent, then Samar at 10.6 percent. Tacloban City had 18.1 percent underemployment rate. (PR)

DOLE, Japan NGO ink partnership for Limasawa housing project

TACLOBAN CITY- The Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) here in the region has partnered with SDG Promise Japan, and the local government unit of Limasawa in Southern Leyte for a housing project to benefit the victims of Typhoon ‘Odette’.

SDG Promise Japan, an international non-governmental organization, facilitated the selection of the recipients of the 38 houses that will be constructed in the island town.

Yuki Sano Akasaka and Hinako Ohno, representatives from SDG Promise Japan, said the construction of 38 houses is targeted to be finished on August 15, 2022.

The regional labor office said that the priority beneficiaries of the housing project are the indigents, solo parents, and other typhoon Odette victims who remained homeless.

DOLE- Southern Leyte Field Office head Eden Ligaya Golong said that

the DOLE's counterpart would be the implementation of Tupad program in partnership with LGU-Limasawa through Mayor Melchor Petracor-ta.

“A total of 174 Tupad workers from Limasawa will be deployed and they shall do the clearing of project sites, loading, and unloading of materials and other related light works,” said Golong.

Aside from their wages from Tupad program, each worker “will also receive P150 daily as meal allowance to be funded by the SDG Promise Japan.”

Over 90 percent of the houses in Limasawa were reportedly damaged by Odette when it hit the province on December 16, 2021.

Soldier killed in an ambush in Northern Samar received tribute, honors

CAMP DOWNES, Ormoc City- In recognition of the heroism of the late Sgt. Gleen C Amado, the 802nd Infantry (Peerless) Brigade and 93rd Infantry (Bantay Kapayapaan) Battalion led by Brigade Commander Colonel Noel A Vestuir “Heroes Honors” was offered to his remains at the municipal hall of Jaro, Leyte on July 20, 2022.

Sgt. Amado, a resident of Jaro, Leyte and a member of the 20th Infantry Battalion assigned to Northern Samar was killed when he and his colleagues were attacked by the communist rebel group last March 5, 2022 while they were conducting a Community Support Program (CSP) in Sitio Canunghan, Palapag, Northern Samar where he was hit by a bullet in the neck.

He was immediately taken to the AFP Medical Center, on Victoriano Luna Road in Quezon City, Metro Manila, but unfortunately, he also passed away on July 7, 2022.

The CSP is a government program under the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (NTF-

ELCAC) to identify and address the needs of citizens and communities. Along with this, the CSP also aims to raise the standard of living of every Filipino, make the communities peaceful and prosperous especially the areas far from civilization or Geographically Isolated Disadvantage Areas (GIDAs).

The death of the late Sgt. Amado can be considered a heroic one because he ignored the imminent danger and threat of the CPP-NPA terrorists, only to perform his duty in the said barangay.

According to Jaro Mayor Jassie Tañala, they are saddened by the loss of a brave son of Jaro, but his heroism shows courage and loyalty to his duty, even in exchange

DPWH Northern Samar First DEO completes P25.66M asphalt overlay project



CATARMAN, Northern Samar- the Department of Public Works and Highways Northern Samar First District Engineering Office (DPWH-NSFDEO) has recently completed the asphalt overlay project along the secondary road in Catarman Northern Samar.

District Engineer Mario D. Villena said, that previ-

ously the road section has rough pavement posing risk to the motorists. It was also observed that some pavements were deteriorated and with surface failure. Hence, road preventive maintenance is necessary.


In her report to District Engineer Mario D. Villena, Project Engineer Corona Daryl G. Uy said that asphalt over-

lay was implemented along Brgy. Cawayan to UEP Campus Section, Catarman-Laoang Road (K0745+883-K0747+000, K0747+570-K0748+000).

A total of P25.66 million was allotted for the said project, which involves re-blocking and asphalt overlay of 3.094 lane kilometer Main Carriage Way (80mm thk and 50mm thk), which

also includes application of yellow and white thermoplastic pavement markings.

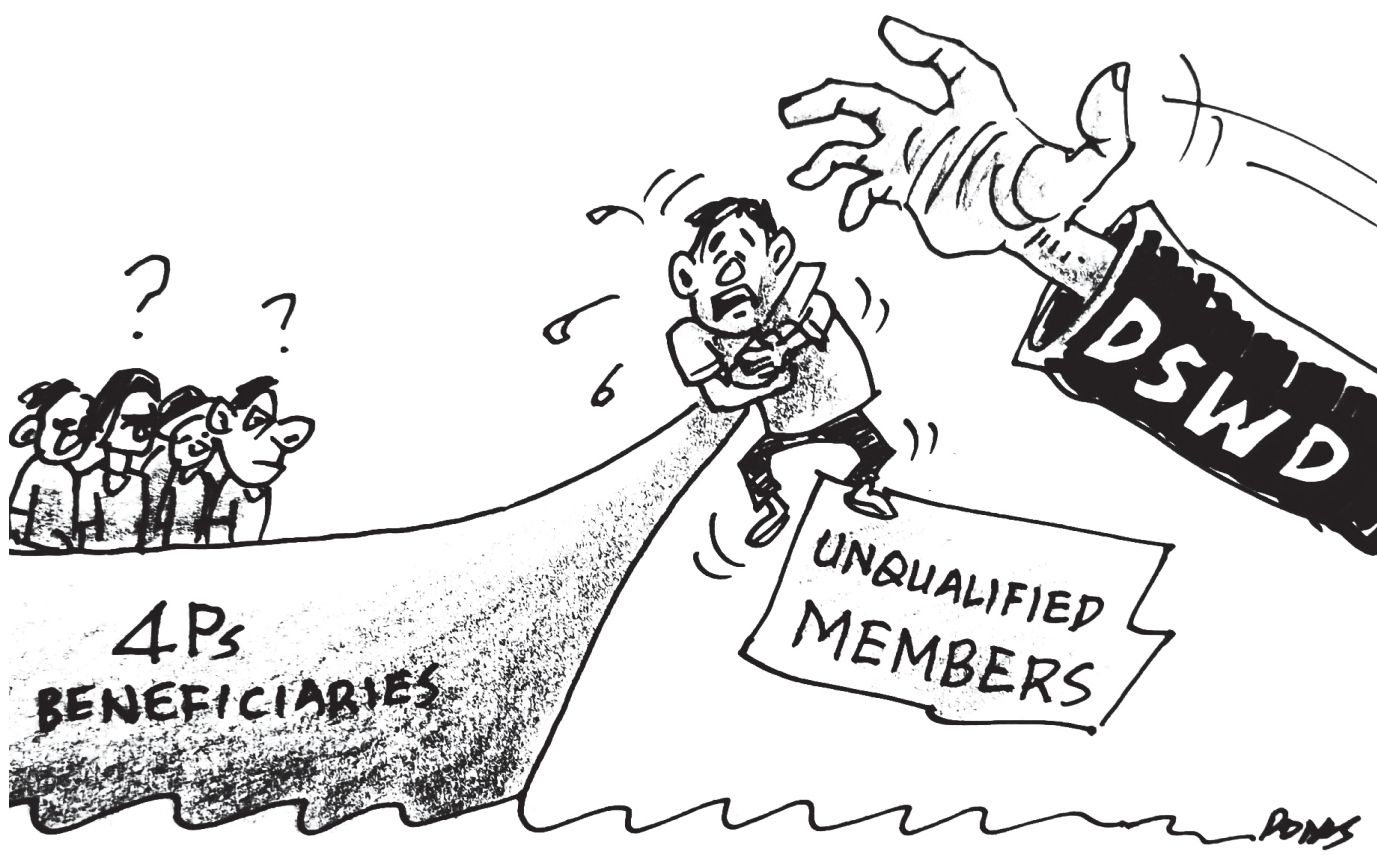

Soon to be removed

Those unqualified 4Ps beneficiaries nationwide that made it to this program through tricky means should now brace for their "judgment day" as plans to remove them on orders of the president are now in place.

Not all those who will be removed are unqualified; the rest will simply be delisted for having "graduated" from extreme poverty. This was revealed by Secretary Erwin Tulfo of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) during their third Cabinet meeting with President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.

It's quite a big reduction, this delisting—more than 25% of the 4.4 million beneficiaries. In fact, it is said to free up to P15 billion for those who are truly qualified: the poorest of the poor, knowing that this poverty reduction program provides cash assistance to them. The move of the DSWD was prompted by the president's "marching order" to review this program due to numerous reports about unqualified beneficiaries.

Indeed, observations have it that there are families whose income is insufficient to feed their household members but are not included among the recipients. On the other hand, however, there are those who are not that poor based on DSWD criteria but are instead receiving cash assistance, thus defeating the program's purpose.

Abuses of said assistance are rampant that, after these funds are released, parents and guardians could be seen shopping in the malls, visiting the parlors, or enjoying with drinking buddies instead of using the cash for the education and health of their children. As a result, students would come to school without school materials or allowances for their fares and snacks.

We commend this move of DSWD; it's high time that this form of corruption and anomaly be checked and resolved, once and for all. If necessary, slap those violators with necessary fines or charges in court to hold them accountable for their irregularities.

Are we taking God’s word seriously?

WE are reminded of that question in the parable of the sower and the seed. (cfr. Mt 9,1-13) Yes, in that parable we are encouraged also to do a lot of sowing of God’s word, a responsibility that is incumbent on all of us. But we would not be a good and generous sower of God’s word if we don’t take God’s word seriously. We have to be a rich soil on which the seed of God’s word can flower a hundredfold.

Aside from the usual problems we have in this regard, like being lazy to study God’s word, treating God’s word in a routine and superficial manner, etc., we now have to contend with the danger of making our other man-made words coming from our philosophies, ideologies, sciences and technologies take precedence over God’s word or even replacing God’s word completely.

We have to protect ourselves from the thought that our man-made word is better, is more effective, or is more practical than God’s word. Nothing can be farther than the truth than that thought, but many of us actually succumb to it.

We need to understand that God’s word gives us the ultimate spiritual knowledge we need to return to God, from whom we came and to whom we go and spend our life in eternity. This character of God’s word is described in the following words in the Letter to the Hebrews:

“For the word of God

is living and effectual, and more piercing than any two-edged sword, and reaching unto the division of the soul and the spirit, of the joints also and the marrow, and is a discernor of the thoughts and intents of the heart.” (4,12)

Its purely eternal, spiritual, sacred and transcendent nature is now subjected to the conditions of time, culture, history, etc., in view of how we are. But we should not forget that it is primarily purely eternal, spiritual, sacred and transcendent, which with our spiritual powers plus God’s grace we can manage to abstract from its temporal, material, mundane and prosaic condition.

Let’s remember that God became man. With his incarnation, the divine word assumes the nature of a human word. And just as God became man to bring man back to God, his divine word becomes human word to bring and reconcile us with God.

Since God’s word is God himself and God is everything to us, we have to understand that it contains everything for our needs, especially our ultimate need to be with God. All things true, good and beautiful are contained in the word of God.

Thus, insofar as our philosophies, ideologies, sciences, arts and technologies contain truths, goodness and beauty, no matter how technical they are, we have to conclude that they also come from God’s word and belong there also.

Anyone who does not acknowledge this truth

about the human sources of our knowledge can be considered ungrateful and presumptuous. We need to overcome the dichotomy that detaches our sciences, arts and technologies from God’s word.

Our sciences, arts and technologies can only articulate the more mundane aspects of the Word of God. They should lead us to God. They should make us achieve a more intimate relationship with God, with everybody else and everything else in the whole universe.

We should make God’s word the primary and constant source of our knowledge! Everything else has to be animated by it.

Sen. C. Villar sponsors new laws to up fisheries catch

During the 18th Congress Senator Cynthia Villar sponsored 11 local bills believed to boost fisheries productivity. The bills are geared to establish multi-species marine hatcheries in select areas of the country. Sen. Villar hopes

that the enactment of the local bills will address the high agriculture poverty incidence in the fisheries sector. She (Villar) was quoted saying “The productivity of our marine fisheries resources has been declining because of environmental degradation and ineffective natural resources management.”

Her (Villar) observation on low fish catch triggered the food sufficiency state of the country and reduction of income of fisherfolks. The need to put up hatcheries in select areas/provinces of the archipelago is a well-thought of plan, late it may seem! A hatchery is necessary for fish and shellfish a structure where they could

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. **2022-02**
Series of **2022**

AN ORDINANCE REVISING AND UPDATING THE COMPREHENSIVE COASTAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SALCEDO, EASTERN SAMAR.

Section 1. **TITLE** – This ordinance shall be known as the **“BASIC FISHERY ORDINANCE OF 2022”**

Rule 1.1. **Purpose.** – These Rules are promulgated to prescribe the guidelines and procedures for the implementation of the Basic Fishery Ordinance of the Municipality of Salcedo, E. Samar.

ARTICLE I

DECLARATION OF POLICY AND DEFINITION OF TERMS:

ARTICLE II

UTILIZATION, MANAGEMENT, DEVELOPMENT AND CONSERVATION OF COASTAL AND FISHERY RESOURCES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SALCEDO, EASTERN SAMAR:

Section 6. **REGULATION OF FISHERY ACTIVITIES** - Fishery activities are subject to the regulation of the LGU. No person, cooperative, partnership, firm or corporation shall exploit, occupy, produce, breed, culture, capture or gather fish, fry or fingerlings of any species, and other coastal and fishery resources, or engage in any commercial fishing activity in the municipal waters without a license, lease, or permit secured from the municipality and in consonance with R.A. 8550 as amended by R.A. 10654. Provided however, the Office of the Municipal Agricultural Services shall establish a **Database or Information on Sustenance/Subsistence Fishers and sports/leisure fishers.**

The Municipal Government of Salcedo can implement measures through enacting ordinances, Executive Orders and other measures to regulate or prohibit fishing activities in an area, whenever it is determined by the Municipal Government of Salcedo, in consultation with the MFARMC, **A7 for ICZM and other stakeholders**, that a specific area in the municipal waters is over fished or in danger of being overfished based on available data or information, and that there is a need to regenerate the coastal and fishery resources in that area. Additionally, the Municipal Government of Salcedo may also enact an ordinance to regulate the fishery activities in an area or the entire municipal waters such as, but not limited to the regulation of buying and selling of certain fishery and marine products upon recommendations of the MFARMC, A7 for ICZM and other stakeholders.

Section 7. **ZONING OF THE MUNICIPAL WATERS** - The municipal waters shall be delineated according to the following priority coastal zones. Identification of the appropriate area(s) within the municipal waters shall be done within the assistance of concerned Government Organizations and MFARMC, NGOs and Fisherfolk Organizations **and A7 for ICZM.**

Zone 1 – Ecotourism Zone – these shall be areas with high ecotourism potential such as excellent coral cover, wrecks, migration path of migratory fishes, caves and drops, etc.

Zone 2 – No Take Zone – these shall refer to Marine Sanctuaries where fishing and other extractive activities are strictly prohibited. Human activities such as research and recreation are regulated.

Zone 3 – Multiple-Use Zone – area(s) where certain legal and non- destructive activities can be done.

Zone 4 – Fishery Management Zone – area(s) with distinct characteristic features suitable for specific fishery activity.

Zone 5 – Trade and Navigational Zone – area(s) for navigation. No structures or activities that can cause obstructions of navigation shall be allowed in this area.

Zone 6 – Cultural Zone – area(s) traditionally used for social, cultural and religious activities shall be designated for said purposes.

Zone 7 - Marine Reserve Zone – a designated area within the municipal water where fishing activities are strictly regulated.

Zone 8 – Mangrove Zone – area(s) designated for rehabilitation, protection and conservation for all known mangrove species

Zone 9- Mari culture Zone- it is defined as the cultivation, management, and harvesting of marine organisms in their natural environment (including estuarine, brackish, coastal, and offshore waters) or enclosures such as pens, tanks, or channels.

Provided, however, that this zonation does not preclude the conduct and management of other activities as appropriate within these priority zones.

Section 8. USE OF MUNICIPAL WATERS -

Section 9. USERS OF MUNICIPAL WATERS - Utilization of the coastal resources by the constituents of the Municipality of Salcedo, E. Samar and the A7 municipalities, shall be subject to existing laws and regulations. Preferential rights shall be granted to duly accredited fisherfolk organizations.

However, Municipal fishers from other municipalities not included in A7 municipalities maybe allowed to use the municipal waters: *Provided,* they will comply the following:

1. They must be registered municipal fishers and/or registered boat (s) and fishing gear(s) owners in their respective municipalities.
2. Secure the necessary fishery license from the Municipal Government concerned.
3. That they shall pay double of the amount of the prescribed regulatory fees for the fishery permits and licenses for the use of municipal waters and its coastal resources:
4. That the number of municipal fishers from the adjacent municipalities shall not be more than ten (10) percent of the total number of registered resident municipal fishers of Salcedo, E. Samar:
5. That the license issued to the municipal fishers from the adjacent municipalities shall be effective within the fiscal year and may be renewed subject to existing rules and regulations:
6. That no commercial fishing vessel/activities will be allowed to operate within the municipal waters:
7. That they shall abide by all ordinances and executive orders pertaining to the use and management of the municipal waters and its coastal resources.

Section 10. ACCESS TO COASTAL AND FISHERY RESOURCES - The number of licenses, leases or permits to be granted by the LGU should take into consideration the principle maximum sustainable yield (MSY) of the resources and other generally accepted indicators of the health of the coastal and aquatic resources. Resident municipal fishers of the municipality, including member alliance of the Seven (7) Municipalities and registered organizations or cooperatives of the LGU shall have priority to utilize and exploit municipal

and demarcated fishery areas in the municipal waters. The *Sangguniang Bayan* shall set the optimum number of fishing privileges to be awarded in consultation with technical experts and MFARMC.

Section 11. REGISTRY OF COASTAL AND AQUATIC RESOURCE USERS - The LGU, through its CRM office shall maintain a registry of coastal and aquatic resource users for the purpose of determining priorities for the regulated/limited areas in the municipal waters as well as for monitoring fishing activities. The registry shall be regularly updated and on recommendation from the MFARMC, the LGU may exclude fishers from the registry for valid reasons.

The CRM office with the assistance of the MFARMC shall also maintain a registry of municipal fishing vessels, type of gears and other boat and fishing particulars. The LGU shall conduct an annual review of the registry of fisherfolk together with the CRM office of municipality and the MFARMC.

The alliance shall assign a color code of fishing boats for every Municipality subject for approval of the municipality concerned. Assigned color shall be dominant by more than fifty (50) percent of the outer side of the boat. Registry code number shall be painted at the bow on both sides of the fishing vessel with a size of six (6) inches in height and one (1) inch width letter to identify fishing boats registered in the municipality.

Section 12. FISHERFOLK ORGANIZATION AND/OR COOPERATIVES - Fisherfolk organizations and cooperatives, whose members are listed in the registry of municipal fishers, may be granted use of demarcated fishery areas to engage in fish capture, coastal aquaculture and/or fish farming. Provided, however, that an organization/cooperative member whose household is already in possession of a fishery privilege other than fish capture can no longer enjoy the fishery privilege granted to an organization or cooperative.

Section 13. DEMARCATED FISHERY PRIVILEGES - The LGU may grant demarcated fishery privileges to fishery organizations or cooperatives for Mari-culture operations in demarcated areas stipulated in this ordinance pursuant to Section 22 of R.A. 8550, as amended by R.A. 10654. The Sangguniang Bayan may, upon the recommendation of the concerned agencies and departments, demarcate additional sub-zones as deemed necessary.

Section 14. ENHANCEMENT OF PUBLIC AWARENESS AND PARTICIPATION –

Section 15. RECOGNITION OF SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL BASIS OF TRADITIONAL/LOCAL AND CRITICAL KNOWLEDGE AND TECHNOLOGIES – The

Section 16. ARTIFICIAL REEFS AND OTHER FISH AGGREGATING DEVICES (FADS) - The construction, installation and deployment of artificial reefs and other fish aggregating devices in the municipal waters shall be subject to existing laws, rules and regulations, and shall not unduly affect the sustained productivity nor decrease the biodiversity of the natural environment through their use or misuse. *Provided, however,* that before the artificial reef and other aggregating devices are installed and/or constructed in the municipal waters, there should be an assessment of the proposed site, a monitoring program and management plan. *Provided further,* that artificial reefs and other fish aggregating devices shall not be installed within one kilometer distance from coral reefs. The LGU, through the CRM office, shall seek advice from fishery experts regarding the construction/deployment of FADS in the municipal waters before any permit to deploy is granted.

Section 17. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT (EIA) SYSTEM - All proposed projects and undertakings by agencies and institutions of the government, including government- owned and controlled corporations, as well as private corporations, firms and entities which may significantly affect the quality of the environment shall be guided by the **Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)** system. The preparation of the EIS shall form an integral part of the entire planning process. No person, natural or juridical, shall undertake any development project without first securing an *Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC)* from the concerned agency of the government as provided by law. The LGU and its officials shall not issue a Mayor’s permit to any development project without an ECC.

Section 18. PROTECTION OF RARE, THREATENED AND ENDANGERED SPECIES –

Section 19. PROTECTION OF SPAWNERS OR BREEDERS –

Section 20. SUPPORT TO MUNICIPAL FISHERIES –

Section 21. MONITORING, CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT –

ARTICLE III
EXCLUSIVE FISHERY PRIVILEGES:

Section 22. GRANT OF EXCLUSIVE FISHERY PRIVILEGES IN MUNICIPAL WATERS - The Sangguniang Bayan may grant exclusive fishery privileges such as, but not limited to, the establishment of fish corrals, oyster, mussel or aquatic beds or bangus fry areas, in designated areas in the municipal waters, pursuant to Section 149 of the Local Government Code of 1991. *Provided, however,* that such privileges do not run counter to the coastal zoning of the municipal waters and other policies set by the LGU. *Provided further,* that pursuant to Section 53 of R.A. 8550, as amended by R.A. 10654, no new concessions, licenses, permits, leases and similar privileges for the establishment or operation of fisheries in the municipal areas shall be granted except to municipal fisherfolk and their organizations from the alliance of Seven (7) municipalities.

Section 23. PREFERENCE IN GRANTING EXCLUSIVE FISHERY PRIVILEGES IN MUNICIPAL WATERS -

Section 24. PROCEDURES IN GRANTING EXCLUSIVE FISHERY PRIVILEGES - The Municipality of Salcedo shall observe the following procedures in the granting of exclusive fishery privileges, which shall only be good for five (5) years, renewable thereafter and shall comply the following:

1. Brgy. Clearance or a Certification from the MPDC, in case no Barangay Clearance is issued, that no Barangay Development Plan in the area that is being applied for.
2. Certificate of Inspection from the Office of the Municipal Agricultural Services (OMAS) or MENRO in the area that is being applied for.

ARTICLE IV
FISH CORRALS, CAGES AND PENS:

Section 25. CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF FISH CORRALS THROUGH THE GRANT OF EXCLUSIVE FISHERY PRIVILEGES –

Section 26. NON- OPERATION OF FISH CAGES, PENS AND CORRALS - Non-operation of fish cage, pens and corrals for a period of six (6) months shall be subjected to the cancellation of permit and award the same to interested party. Licensee shall deposit the amount of One Thousand Pesos (Php 1,000.00) for the eventual dismantling of the structures in case of non- operation within a period of six (6) months. Should the licensee opt to dismantle and remove the structures himself, the deposited amount shall be returned to him. Provided, fish cages shall be subject to the Development Plan and administrative regulation of the concerned Barangay.

ARTICLE V
MARINE PROTECTED AREA (MPA):

Section 27. ESTABLISHMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF MARINE PROTECTED AREA - The LGU shall henceforth declare portions of the Municipal Waters as Marine Protected Area (MPA). Appropriate Zoning of the Municipal Waters shall

be done immediately in consultation with the stakeholders and in coordination with Technical Groups. The Zoning of the Municipal Waters shall take into consideration appropriate use of the resources to ensure sustainability of the fisheries. It shall also consider the socio- economic of the fisherfolk. Provided that, existing Marine Sanctuaries shall be retained.

Section 28. The management of each specific Marine Sanctuaries however shall be the responsibility of the LGU concerned or the management body established for the purpose. *Provided, however,* that a Memorandum of Agreement/Understanding shall be executed between the LGU, Barangay Council concerned and the People’s Organization for effective and sustainable management. Provided however, scientific or educational research activities shall be allowed, but must be in accordance with the existing policies in the conduct of research.

ARTICLE VI
MANAGEMENT OF THE GATHERING OF FISH FRY AND OTHER AQUATIC JUVENILES:

Section 29. DESIGNATED GATHERING AREAS FOR FISH FRY AND OTHER AQUATIC JUVENILES - The LGU shall designate the **Multiple Use Zones** and other areas not covered by existing declared zones, for the gathering and collecting of fish fry and other juveniles for mari-culture production, scientific and educational research.

Section 30. RESERVED AREA FOR FISH FRY AND OTHER AQUATIC JUVENILES - A reserved area where no fry gathering will be allowed at any time will be designated by the LGU for sustainable supply of fish fry and other aquatic juveniles.

Section 31. USE OF APPROPRIATE GATHERING METHODS FOR FISH FRY AND OTHER AQUATIC JUVENILES - The LGU shall determine appropriate technologies for the gathering of fish fry and juvenile in designated areas and shall promote the use of said technologies where applicable.

ARTICLE VII
ECO – TOURISM MANAGEMENT:

Section 32. FORMULATION OF MUNICIPAL TOURISM DEVELOPMENT PLAN –
Section 33. NON- ESTABLISHMENT OF PERMANENT AND SEMI- PERMANENT STRUCTURES IN FORESHORE LAND - No permanent or semi- permanent structure shall be established within the foreshore land without the necessary permit(s) from the concerned agencies. All structures so constructed shall be removed by the ones who constructed them, or caused their construction, otherwise this will be done for them at their expense within two (2) months from the effectivity of this ordinance.

Section 34. ALTERATION OF SEASCAPE - No alteration of the coastal shoreline shall be allowed by the municipality, such as but not limited to, importation or extraction of sand, extraction of seagrass, and construction of seawalls or riprap without proper consultation with technical groups and compliance of the required ECC.

ARTICLE VIII
MANAGEMENT OF COASTAL AQUACULTURE:

Section 35. PROMOTION OF AQUACULTURE –
Section 36. NON- DISPOSITION OF PUBLIC LANDS FOR FISHERY PURPOSES - Public lands such as tidal swamps, mangroves, marshes, foreshore lands and ponds shall not be disposed or alienated for any purpose.

Section 37. QUALIFICATIONS OF APPLICANTS TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE AQUACULTURE ACTIVITIES - The following are the minimum qualifications of any applicant who wishes to secure a permit or lease to construct and operate any aquaculture activity in the municipal waters:

1. A resident of the municipality or of the A7 member municipalities, of legal age, and a registered voter of the municipality; and/or
2. An accredited fisherfolk organization, local investor(s) or any other organization wherein at least sixty (60) percent of its members are residents of the municipality or of the A7 municipalities and licensed fisherfolk.
3. For corporation, at least sixty (60) percent of the capital stock belongs to Filipino citizens.

Section 38. DESIGNATED AREAS FOR AQUACULTURE AND MARICULTURE - The LGU in consultation with concerned agencies shall designate sub- zones of Coastal **Zone 3** as areas for the establishment and operation of fish pens/ fish cages, seaweed farms and sea ranches and develop guidelines for the granting of permits and the terms and conditions governing said permits such as maximum area, number of units, distance between units, etc.

Provided, however, that no fish pens/fish cages, seaweed farms and sea ranches shall be allowed outside of the designated areas within **Zone 3**, except for scientific, technological and educational purposes. *Provided, further,* that the establishment, operation and management of aquaculture/mariculture structures shall not exceed the carrying capacity of the area.

Section 39. DISTANCE FROM THE SHORELINE - No fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage and culture of other aquatic organisms shall be constructed within fifty (50) metres from the lowest tide mark except in cove areas. *Provided, however,* that no fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage, and culture of other aquatic organisms shall also be constructed in designated navigation routes and eco- tourism sites. *Provided, further,* that no fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage, and culture of other aquatic organisms shall also be constructed in front of any wharf; *Provided, finally,* that violators of this section will be required to demolish their fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage, and culture of other aquatic organisms at their own expense.

Section 40. STOCKING DENSITY –

Section 41. PERMIT AND ANNUAL FEES - Any person or entity who wishes to construct and operate a fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage, and culture of other aquatic organisms within the designated area in **Zone 3** shall pay the required fees pursuant to Revenue Code of the Municipality; Provided, however, that permit to construct and operate a fish pen or fish cage shall be for a period of one (1) year renewable every calendar year from January 1-20.

Section 42. LIMITATIONS ON THE GRANTING OF PERMITS TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE FISH PENS, FISH CAGES AND CULTURE OF OTHER AQUATIC ORGANISMS - The following limitations shall be strictly followed:

1. The area for fish pen, fish corrals, fish cage, and culture of other aquatic organisms shall not be subleased in whole or in part. However, the permittee, licensee or lessee may enter into a joint venture agreement, a management contract, or a profit- sharing agreement with a resident of the municipality or of the A7 community; *Provided, however,* that the municipal government is notified of such agreement;
 2. The use of dummies shall be sufficient cause for the disqualification of an applicant from obtaining such permit or renewal.
 3. The construction of fish cage, fish corrals, fish pens, and culture of other aquatic organisms shall conform with the development plan of the concerned barangay as well as Section 61 of this Ordinance.
 4. Application for fish cages, fish corrals, fish pens, and other aquatic organism shall be limited to 2 cages per applicant with a maximum area of 1,000sq.m. per cage.
- Section 43. GROUNDS FOR THE REJECTION OF APPLICATIONS/RENEWALS OF PERMIT OR CANCELLATION OF PERMITS TO CONSTRUCT AND OPERATE FISH PENS, FISH CAGES AND CULTURE OF OTHER AQUATIC ORGANISMS** - The following are the grounds for rejection of an application for and non- renewal of a permit to construct and operate fish pen and fish cage:
1. Fraudulent, false and misleading statements in the application;
 2. Failure to pay the prescribed application fees and to comply other requirements;
 3. Failure to comply with the conditions of the contract with the municipal government;
 4. When public welfare is so required as deemed by the municipal government.

5. Incapacity of the permittee or licensee to continue the operation and maintenance of his/her project, unless there are nearest kin who are willing to continue the operation;

6. Irreversible environmental impact of the construction and operation of fish pens and fish cages;

7. Violation of fishery and other environment-related laws and regulations;

8. Construction and operation of fish pen or fish cage outside of the designated area;

9. Non- operation of fish pen or fish cage within six (6) months from the date of issuance of the permit to construct and operate fish pen or fish cage; and

10. Any other violations analogous to the above-mentioned grounds.

Provided, however, that a voluntary written request for the cancellation of the permit by the licensee is sufficient for the cancellation of a permit without prejudice to the performance of obligations obtained during the cancellation of the permit or that may arise from the permit.

Abandoned fish pens may now be open to new applicants by the municipal government in consultation with the barangay council from which the licensee obtained clearance.

Section 44. **REGISTRATION OF FISH HATCHERIES AND PRIVATE FISH PONDS** - All fish hatcheries, fish breeding facilities and private fish ponds should be registered with the municipal government where the structure will be constructed. The fees and minimum standards shall be prescribed by the Sangguniang Bayan.

Section 45. **MONITORING OF FISH PRODUCTION** –

Section 46. **MAINTENANCE OF WATER QUALITY AND CLEANLINESS** –

ARTICLE IX:
MANAGEMENT OF SPECIES:

Section 47. **REGULATION OF GEARS** -

Section 48. **RESERVED AREA FOR ENDANGERED SPECIES** -

ARTICLE X
MANAGEMENT OF GLEANING AREAS:

Section 49. **REGULATING THE GATHERING OF SHELLS AND OTHER MOLLUSKS** - The municipal government shall designate gathering, collection and reservation areas for shells and other mollusks. Collection and gathering shall be regulated and strict compliance will be required.

Section 50. **RECOGNITION OF WOMEN'S AND YOUTH ROLE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF GLEANING AREAS** -

ARTICLE XI:
MANAGEMENT OF MANGROVES AND SEAGRASSES:

Section 51. **BAN ON MANGROVE CONVERSION** - All existing natural stand of mangrove forest within the municipality are declared as reserved/protected areas. The cutting of mangrove forest and harvesting of bark for all mangrove species within the municipality declared as reserved/protected areas and conversion of mangrove areas into fishpond shall be prohibited.

Section 52. **MANAGEMENT OF MANGROVES** - The municipal government, through the CRMO, in coordination with the MFARMC and the people and their organizations in the adjacent barangays where mangroves are located shall promote the proper management and rehabilitation of mangrove areas in the municipality. *Provided, however,* that the municipal government shall develop a program that will promote and ensure community stewardship of existing mangrove areas and would follow proper zonation.

Section 53. **IMMEDIATE RESTORATION OF CONVERTED MANGROVES** - The municipal government, in coordination with the MFARMC and the people and their organizations in the adjacent barangays where mangroves are located and other concerned agencies, shall immediately take steps for the restoration of all abandoned, undeveloped or underutilized fishponds to their original state.

Section 54. **COMMUNITY-BASED MANGROVE MANAGEMENT** - The municipal government, in coordination with DENR, existing organizations and institutions, including the MFARMC, based in the locality, shall identify suitable areas for and undertake mangrove reforestation. When appropriate and subject to existing laws, rules and regulations, and government programs and projects, the municipal government, in coordination with proper government agencies, shall assist communities and community members to obtain the best arrangements possible with regard to their access to the resources in the mangrove areas they reforest, such as, Community-Based Forest Management Agreement under the CBFM Program of the DENR. The CRM Officer shall develop a program for the management of mangrove in the municipality. *Provided, however, that all reforestation and or mangrove management program shall be strictly science based.*

Section 55. **MANGROVE - FRIENDLY TECHNOLOGIES** –

Section 56. **PROTECTION OF SEAGRASSES** - The municipal government, in coordination with the MFARMC and people in the barangays and their organizations, shall ensure protection of seagrasses in the municipal waters; *Provided, however,* that the municipal government shall regulate the use of fishing gears and other human activities that may adversely affect the seagrass. The municipal government in coordination with the POs and NGOs will identify suitable areas for seagrass conservation. **Planting of mangroves in the seagrass beds shall be prohibited.**

ARTICLE XII
PREVENTION OF AQUATIC POLLUTION:

Section 57. **COASTAL/AQUATIC POLLUTION** –

Section 58. **PEOPLE'S PARTICIPATION IN WASTE MANAGEMENT** –

Section 59. **ROLE OF BARANGAYS IN WASTE MANAGEMENT** –

ARTICLE XIII
NAVIGATION:

Section 60. **NAVIGATIONAL ROUTE** - The municipal government, in consultation with the MFARMC, shall designate the navigational routes of ferries and other fishing crafts and shall disallow any activity that shall obstruct the designated navigational route: *Provided,* that nothing in the foregoing section shall be construed as permitting the lease, licensee or permittee to undertake any construction which may obstruct free navigation and impede water circulation such as the flow of tide to and from the area.

Section 61. **PORT AND HARBOR CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT** - Port development shall be located and designed in a manner that will minimize changes to existing water and sediment quality parameters such as salinity and temperature, dissolved oxygen, nitrogen and sediment concentration, organic constituents, and transparency of waters. *Provided, however,* that ports and harbors shall be placed in areas with the highest available flushing rate, and access channels shall be designed to minimize adverse water circulation changes and creation of stagnant water columns. *Provided, further,* that ports and harbors shall incorporate facilities which allow for effective waste disposal and erosion control.

Section 62. **FERRY OPERATIONS** - Ferry operations shall be subject to regulation by the municipal government, subject to existing rules and regulations on safety and public transportation standards. *Provided, however,* that within 60 days from the enactment of this ordinance, the municipal government shall issue implementing rules and regulations for the purpose.

ARTICLE XIV
POST – HARVEST FACILITIES, ACTIVITIES AND TRADES:

Section 63. **ESTABLISHMENT OF POST - HARVEST FACILITIES** -

Section 64. **EXPORTATION AND IMPORTATION OF FISH AND FISHERY PRODUCTS** - Export of fish and fishery products shall be regulated whenever such exportation affects the food security and production. *Provided, however,* that exportation of live fish shall be prohibited except those which are hatched or cultured in accredited hatcheries and ponds; *Provided, further,* that to protect and maintain the local biodiversity or ensure the sufficiency of supply of breeders, eggs and fry of bangus, prawn and other endemic species, as may be determined by the Department, shall not be exported or caused to be exported by any person.

No person shall import fish and fish products of whatever size, stage or form, for any purpose without securing the necessary permit from the Department.

Section 65. **AUXILIARY INVOICE**- All fish and fishery products must have an auxiliary invoice to be issued by duly designated municipal personnel to their transport from the point of origin to their point of destination in the Philippines and/or export purposes upon payment of the prescribed fee to defray administrative costs therefore. *Provided that,* fish and fishery products caught or otherwise obtained in violation of provisions of national laws, rules and regulations, and this ordinance, or declared as health hazards by concerned institutions, shall not be issued auxiliary invoices nor allowed to be transported.

Section 66. **MONITORING OF IMPORTED FISH IN WET MARKETS** –

ARTICLE XV
OTHER FISHING METHODS NOT ALLOWED IN THE MUNICIPAL WATERS:

Section 67. **GATHERING OF TROPICAL/AQUARIUM FISH** - Tropical/aquarium fish are generally attractive to tourists who like to snorkel and scuba dive in reef areas. Gathering them for trade as aquarium animals would mean disappearance of these species in our coral reefs that is against the efforts of the LGUs for Ecotourism. Gathering of aquarium/tropical fish is **hereby banned in the municipal waters.**

Section 68. **USE OF COMPRESSOR IN ANY FISHING METHOD SHALL NOT BE ALLOWED** - Use of industrial compressor as a breathing apparatus is very hazardous to the health of our fishermen as the air filter system is not designed for breathing. It usually results to headache and nausea. Since the diver is directly connected to a hose for breathing, any obstruction of the hose results in directly cutting the air supply to the diver, causing an emergency accent and eventually, decompression sickness, paralysis and even death. The method is very efficient and depletive. **The use of compressors in any kind of fishing activity is therefore strictly prohibited in the municipal waters.** Mere possession of industrial compressor is prima facie evidence that the possessor intends to commit illegal fishing activities

Section 69. **FISHING IN PAYAO OTHER THAN HOOK AND LINE, TROLL AND JIGGER WITHIN 100- METER RADIUS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED** - Fishing in Payao using gears other than hook and line, troll and jig within 100 meters radius is prohibited.

Section 70. **GATHERING AND POSSESSION OF “KUYOG” WITHOUT PERMIT FOR AQUACULTURE, AND HARVESTING OF SIGANID DURING CLOSE SEASON**– “Kuyog” are juveniles of siganids. Gathering of “kuyog” by any means is strictly prohibited in the municipal waters. Possession of “Kuyog” shall be construed as gathering and therefore illegal and punishable by law. A close season for harvesting siganid shall be implemented and enforced from the start of February to the end of April.

Section 71. **GATHERING, SELLING AND POSSESSION OF GRAVID CRABS, LOBSTERS AND SHRIMPS** - Gathering and selling of gravid or berried crabs, lobsters and shrimps are strictly prohibited. Possession of gravid or berried crabs, lobsters and shrimps shall mean gathering and selling and therefore illegal.

Section 72. **GATHERING AND POSSESSION OF ABALONE LESS THAN TWO (2) INCHES SHELL LENGTH EXCEPT FOR AQUACULTURE, EDUCATION AND RESEARCH WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL WATERS** - Abalone at two (2) inches shell length is estimated to have spawned about four (4) times and therefore have produced enough offspring for the next generation. However, gathering and possession of abalone less than two inches in shell length is illegal and punishable by law. Provided, that permit shall be granted for research and education purposes.

ARTICLE XVI
FISHERY PERMITS AND FEES:

Section 73. **FISHERY LICENSE AND PERMIT** - All individual, cooperatives, partnerships, firms or corporations who are listed in the Registry of Resource Users must secure Permit from the LGU through the recommendation of the Municipal CRM Office/ or OMAS before engaging in fishing using particular gear and/or boat or engage in any fisheries activities within the municipal waters. Provided however, that the Fishery Permit is non- transferable. Provided further, that the holders agree unconditionally to comply with all laws, orders, policies, and rules and regulations governing fishing. The permittee shall also assume responsibility for any and all of his acts with his fishing operation.

1. The LGU shall determine the type of gears allowed in the municipal waters;

2. Before issuance of the permit, applicants shall be required to an Ecological Awareness Seminar (EAS) and Orientation on the National and Local Laws, Rules and Regulations to be conducted by the MENRO and OMAS; and

3. No fishing permit shall be issued, unless the boat and gears are registered or licensed within the concerned municipality;

Provided furthermore, a Special Fishing Permit shall be issued to subsistence Fisherfolk as well sports or recreational fishing with a certification from the OMAS, but shall not be exempted from registration of fishing boat and gear licenses.

Section 74. **RENEWAL OF FISHERY LICENSE AND PERMIT** –

Section 75. **REQUIRED DOCUMENTS** –

Police clearance.

Section 76. **SCHEDULE OF PERMIT FEES AND OTHER CHARGES** - Permit for specific fishery activity shall be granted only to licensed individuals, organizations, cooperatives, partnerships and corporations upon payment of corresponding fees in accordance with the rates stipulated in this Fishery Ordinance.

Section 77. **TICKETING SYSTEM** –

Section 78. **COASTAL ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION FEE** - An *environmental conservation fee equivalent to .02 percent of the net income of business establishments that uses coastal and aquatic resources shall be collected.* Such funds shall go to the Coastal Resource Management Fund (CRMF) and shall be used solely for the conservation, management and development of the coastal and aquatic resources of the municipality.

Section 79. **GRATUITOUS PERMIT** -

Section 80. **BOND FOR AQUACULTURE OPERATION** – Those who wish to construct and operate any aquaculture facilities for commercial purposes shall deposit the following bond to the Municipal Government through Municipal Treasurer. The bond shall be thirty (30) percent of the amount of fees for the construction and operation of the aqua-culture facility. MENRO to conduct field inspection and validation. The bond can be withdrawn upon cessation of operation.

Section 81. **UTILIZATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE FINES** - Fifty (50) percent of all fines collected shall be given to the apprehending team, municipal or A7 enforcement team, as incentive and fifty (50) percent to the CRMO of the LGU. Revenue sharing for fees collected for the use of Marine protected areas and penalties imposed in the following:

A. Revenue generated from the fees shall be shared by the MPAMT, the barangay, and the municipal government in the following manner:

1. 20 percent of the fund to the municipality,

2. 20 percent of the fund to the barangay,

3. 60 percent of the fund will go to the CRM special trust fund for MPAMT and MFARMC, intended for CRM PPAs.

B. Revenues generated from **Administrative Fines and penalties** shall be shared in the following manner:

1. 25% percent of the penalty to the Municipality;

2. 25% percent of the penalty to the MPAMT; that will go to the CRM special trust fund;

3. 50% percent of the penalty to the apprehending person/s, informant or team.

ARTICLE XVII
CREATION OF THE MUN. COASTAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT (CRM) OFFICE:

Section 82. **CREATION OF THE COASTAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT (CRM) OFFICE** –

Section 83. **FUNCTIONS, DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE CRM OFFICER** –

ARTICLE XVIII:
PROHIBITIONS AND PENALTIES:

Section 85. **COMPLIANCE WITH NATIONAL LAWS** - The LGU notes its support and application of existing national laws, orders, rules and regulations such as, but not limited to, R.A. 8550, as amended by R.A. 10654, and R.A. 7160, especially with regard to their penalties. The following are prohibited in the municipal waters:

1. **FISHING WITHOUT LICENSE AND PERMIT** – No person shall exploit, occupy, produce, breed, culture, capture or gather in the municipal waters without a license and permit. Violators of this section shall be penalized and prosecuted under the Republic Act No. 8550, and other relevant national laws.

2. **COMMERCIAL FISHING IN THE MUNICIPAL WATERS** – It shall also be unlawful for any commercial fishing vessel to fish within the municipal waters, as it is defined in this Ordinance and in Republic Act No. 8550 and other relevant national laws.

3. **ILLEGAL CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF FISH CORRALS, FISH PENS, FISH CAGES AND SIMILAR STRUCTURES** – It shall be unlawful to construct and operate fish corral, fish pen, fish cage and other similar structure without permit and/or outside of the designated areas. Violators of this section shall be penalized.

Section 86. **OTHER FISHING METHODS AND PRACTICES PROHIBITED WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL WATERS IN ADDITION TO THE EXISTING NATIONAL LAWS** (R.A. 8550 as amended by R.A. 10654, R.A. 7160, etc.)

1. Ban in the gathering of tropical/aquarium fish;
2. Ban on the use of industrial compressors as breathing apparatus – The presence of a compressor and accessories in a fishing vessel within the municipal waters is presumed to be used for fishing and is sufficient ground for confiscation of the same and other fishing paraphernalia;
3. Fishing in *Payao* within 100 meters radius is prohibited except hook and line (*pangawil*), troll (*pagsubid*), jig (*bundak*). It is also unlawful to fish in payao within 100 meters radius without prior permission from the registered owner of the Payao;
4. Gathering of “*Kuyog*” – It shall be unlawful to gather and possess “*Kuyog*” except with a permit issued by concerned LGU which is intended for aquaculture and educational purposes;
5. Gathering, selling, buying, and possession of gravid crabs, lobsters and shrimps are prohibited;
6. Gathering, selling, buying, and possession of abalone less than two (2) inches shell length;
7. Gathering, selling, buying, and possession of mud crabs less than 400 grams;
8. Gathering, selling, and buying, and possession of blue swimming crab with carapace length of 4.5 inches and below;
9. Gathering of sea cucumbers using a rake-like device;
10. Gathering, selling, buying, and possession of sea cucumber less than 320 grams, except if a permit is issued to do so, or for culture purposes;
11. Catching, gathering and possession of gravid Siganid (*Hamul-od*, *Man-lalara*, *Danggit*, *Liliko-an* and *Kitong*) from the months of February to April, and during spawning season;
12. Fishing in Fish Sanctuaries/Marine Protected Areas, mere entries to MPAs is prohibited
13. Use of multiple layered net, commercial fishing using bag net (*lawagan*) and superlight;
14. Use of fishing light attractor more than 500 watts;
15. Gathering of *Blilang* through excavation especially in seagrass beds and mangrove areas;
16. Use of *Sudsod* in fishing;
17. Use of *Liba-liba* regardless of mesh size;
18. Unlicensed Fishing Activities;
19. Violations of the terms and conditions of License;
20. Fishing by a person not registered;
21. Fishing within municipal waters by a vessel not registered with the municipality;
22. Failure to carry Fishery license;
23. Fishing within prohibited areas during closed seasons;
24. Use of fraudulent instrument of weights and measures;
25. Commercial Fishing in Municipal waters;
26. Using illegal gears and methods;
27. Unlawful sale and/or of Illegally caught fish;
28. Non-Compliance with Color Coding and identification Scheme of Fishing boats;
29. Failure to Secure Auxiliary Invoice;
30. Using of fine mesh nets;
31. Catching of immature (small) Fish species & Shellfish;
32. Restriction of any construction at the foreshore areas
33. Abandonment of Fishing Vessel and Gears
34. Gathering, Selling, Exporting of white sand, Silica, Peebles, Corals, & other substances
35. Use of beach seine (Pag guyod)
36. Gathering, possession, harm of Endangered Marine Species
37. Use of fine mesh net of less 3 centimeters mesh size;
38. Possession of explosive, noxious and poisonous substance and/or electricity;
39. Bagnet Fishing or locally known as “*Lawagan*”.

PENALTIES:

Violations of any of the provisions in this ordinance shall be penalized by:
a. Fine of **Two Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (Php2,500.00)** for every person (natural or Juridical) per violation committed, or imprisonment of not more than six (6) months or both fine and imprisonment upon the discretion of the court except those specially penalized in the National Laws (i.e. R.A.

7150 in relation to R.A. 8550, as amended by R.A. 10654).
b. Fine due to environmental damage caused by illegal fishing and other activities shall be imposed based on accepted resource valuation:
First Offense: Fine and Confiscation of Banned Gears and Paraphernalia.
Second Offense: Fine and Confiscation of Boats, Banned Gears and Paraphernalia.

AUTHORITY TO COLLECT FINES:

The LGU, through its authorized representative, is authorized to collect administrative fines from any violations within the municipal waters. That all fines shall be properly issued by a receipt through the Municipal Treasurer or his authorized representative.
The mayor or his/her authorized representative is hereby authorized to enter into an extra-judicial or out-of-court settlement of any offense involving violation of any provision of this ordinance, subject, however, to the following conditions:
1. That the offense does not involve fraud.
2. That the offender shall voluntarily offer his interest to enter into a compromise provided that he shall pay a compromise settlement fee in the amount equivalent to the maximum fee imposed to the specific provision being violated.
3. That the confiscation of the catch and fishing gears including the impounding of the vessel if applicable shall be imposed.
ALL FINES COLLECTED SHALL GO TO A TRUST FUND. Fifty percent (50%) of the amount shall serve as an operational fund to the law enforcement team (Police, Deputized Volunteers) who made the apprehension which could only be drawn by the Office of Municipal Agricultural Officer, MENRO or CRM Officer enforcing fishery laws.

**ARTICLE XIX
LAW ENFORCEMENT:**

Section 87. **WHO SHALL ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE, OTHER LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS** - The Philippine National Police, the Philippine Coast Guard, the Law Enforcement of the DENR, the DA – BFAR, the Bantay Dagat/ Kalikasan Task Force of the municipality, the BANTAY Dagat/ Kalikasan Task Force of the A7 for ICZM, deputized fish wardens and the Barangay Officials/*Tanod/Blue Brigade* are hereby authorized to enforce this ordinance and other fishery laws, rules and regulations.
The Municipal Mayor or DA – BFAR may deputize in writing the Bantay Dagat/ *Kalikasan* Task Force or other persons to act and enforce the provisions of this ordinance, other laws, rules and regulations within the jurisdiction of the municipality or of the A7 for ICZM.
Anyone of the above persons and entities is authorized to file administrative cases before the proper agencies and bodies, enter into a compromise settlement or initiate criminal proceedings in accordance with the Rules of Court, for offense committed.

**ARTICLE XX
GENERAL PROVISIONS:**

Section 88. **MANDATORY REVIEW** - The LGU shall undertake the mandatory review of this ordinance at least once every **three (3) years** and as often as it may deem necessary, to ensure that coastal and fisheries policies and guidelines remain responsive to the changing circumstances.

**ARTICLE XXI
TRANSITORY PROVISIONS:**

Section 89. **EXISTING FISH PENS AND FISH CAGES** - Fish pens and fish cages existing and operating prior to the effectivity of this Ordinance which are situated outside of the designated area and have no permits shall continue to operate until their contract with the Municipality expires but not exceeding one year. *Provided, however,* that those whose contract have already expired and those whose operations have already stopped prior to the effectivity of this Ordinance are no longer allowed to continue. Operators of these fish pens and fish cages shall be responsible for the demolition of their structures. A moratorium period shall be decided by each municipality provided that it shall not be more than two (2) months.
Section 90. **DESIGNATION OF INTERIM CRM OFFICER** - Pending the creation of the Coastal Resource Management Office by the Municipality, as provided for

in this Ordinance, the Municipal Mayor shall designate and Interim CRM Officer to assist the Municipality in the implementation of the Ordinance.
Section 91. **REGISTRATION OF RESOURCE USERS** - Within Ninety (90) days from the effectivity of this Ordinance, the Municipal Government shall conduct a registration of all resource users, as provided for in this Ordinance.

USAID and partners award business grant to woman waste collector

Manila-The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), through its Clean Cities, Blue Ocean (CCBO) program and its Women in Waste’s Economic Empowerment Activity, awarded its first business expansion grant to help a woman waste collector start her own door-to-door waste collection business.

1 soldier killed, 5 others wounded in Northern Samar clash with NPA members

CATARMAN,North-ern Samar-A soldier was killed while five others were wounded in another clash with alleged mem-bers of the New People’s Army (NPA) in Catubig town, Northern Samar on Tuesday(July 19) morn-ing.

The names of the killed and wounded soldiers, who all belong to the 20th Infantry Battalion, have yet to be disclosed.

But based on the initial report, the 12-member soldiers were on the vicini-ty of Barangay Osang at

around 9:25 am when they were ambushed by the reb-els which resulted in a gun-fight.

The firefight resulted in the instant death of one of the soldiers and injured five others as the rebels used anti-personnel landmines.

The affected soldiers were airlifted and were brought to Eastern Visayas Medical Center, this city, Lt. Joyce Ann Bayron, spokes-person of the 20th IB based in Las Navas town, said.

It was learned that the government troops were on their way to Osang,

about 30 kms away from the town proper of Catubig, as part of their communi-ty support program as the village has been identified as a beneficiary of the gov-ernment-funded program under NTF- ELCAC or the National Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict.

The village was said to be once controlled by the NPA rebels.

The rebels were identi-fied to be part of the Sanda-tahang Unit Pampropagan-da, Front Committee-15, Sub-Regional Committee

of the Eastern Visayas Re-gional Party Committee.

In a statement, Lt.Col. Joemar Buban, the com-manding officer of the 20th IB, strongly condemned the attack staged by the rebels against his soldiers.

“I and the whole of Ca-tubig strongly condemn the CPP-NPA-NDF’s bla-tant violation of the Ottawa Convention as they used without fear anti-personnel mines which resulted in the death of one soldier and the wounding of five others,” he said.

This encounter is the

latest of a series of encoun-ter for the past few days now between government troops and NPA rebels.

Last July 5, five soldiers were also wounded when they engaged rebel mem-bers in Mapanas town, also in Northern Samar.

And just last July 16, a rookie police operative was also killed in an ambush incident in a village strad-dling between the towns of San Jose de Buan and Gan-dara both in Samar prov-ince.

Organic farming eyed as solution to high fertilizer prices

TACLOBAN CITY – The Department of Agriculture (DA) is pushing for the practice of organic farming in Eastern Visayas in response to the rising prices of fertilizers and growing demand for healthier food.

During the regional organic agriculture congress here on Wednesday, DA 8 (Eastern Visayas) Executive Director Angel Enriquez said promoting organic farming is part of food security.

“We could go into balanced fertilization but we must take into consideration the production of healthy foods. It is challenging but let us continue this enthusiasm,” Enriquez said during the event.

In the past years, the organic farming program has been focusing on the enhancement of production support to organic practitioners, increasing organic production areas in the region, promoting market and consumer awareness of organic products, and strengthening advocacy campaigns at the local government level.

Andrew Orais, chief of the DA-8’s operations division, said the target is to make organic agriculture work in at least 5 percent of farmlands in the region every year.

Currently, the DA has no data as to how many percent of farmlands in Eastern Visayas are into organic farming.

Orais, however, said he is positive that with intensive promotion and sharing of success stories and best practices, “we will be able to inspire more farmers in the region to adopt

this sustainable way of farming.”

“This is the answer to the problem of high cost of production. The release of nutrients may be slower, but in the long run, we are improving the condition of our soils,” Orais told the Philippine News Agency (PNA)

The Fertilizer and Pesticides Authority reported that the average price of urea, the most commonly used fertilizer, increased to PHP2,781 for a 50-kg. bag from July 4 to 8, significantly higher than its price of PHP1,321 a year ago.

The cost of complete fertilizers has also doubled to PHP2,369 per bag from PHP1,187 in July 2021.

Martina Reyna, owner of the organic-certified La Granja Farm based in Diit village here, said they have a very minimal cost in fertilizer through organic methods.

“There is (a) sense of security, peace of mind, and confidence knowing that we are producing the best, not just for their consumers but for the environment as well,” Reyna said.

La Granja is just one of the five certified organic farms in Eastern Visayas.

The Philippine Organic Agriculture Act of 2010 defines organic farming as all agricultural systems that promote the ecologically sound, socially acceptable, economically viable, and technically feasible production of food and fibers.

The systems dramatically reduce external inputs by refraining from the use of chemical fertilizers, pesticides, and pharmaceuticals. (PNA)

start earning so one could help feed the family and pay the bills. Failure to meet these expectations would result in insults, mockery, and the like.

These pressures and one’s desire to help the family financially sometimes drive fresh graduates to distant places in search of jobs, not realizing that in those places, there are also native folks who are doing the same search. Others just make do with whatever job is available, even if they are overqualified and the pay is too low.

Perhaps you would have noticed that many of the salesladies in local malls are actually college graduates who just bear the low salaries and contractual employment, without benefits and incentives. Such is the case of many fresh graduates just to somehow ease the outside pressures on them. Poor young people; they undergo exploitative treatment all because of job scarcity.

Lucky for those who find chances to go overseas. At least there, they earn better. Unlike here when their services are almost taken for free. But even so, job mismatches are still rampant among our workers abroad. Some even hold academic doctorates but are just employed there as babysitters or house helpers. How sad, indeed. When would that time come when jobs would be greater in number than the applicants?

the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, the police organization in Eastern Visayas has partnered with the tourism department to ensure the safety of tourists coming to the region.

Police B/Gen. Bernard Banac, the police regional director, said that the move is in consonance with the goal of the administration of President Ferdinand ‘Bongbong’ Marcos, Jr., to make the tourism sector as one of the engines in reviving the country’s economy.

“With the reopening of tourist destinations in the region, this program of PNP in coordination with DOT, will assure tourists and travelers, both foreign and local of their physical safety and security. This will also help promote a safer and secured tourist environment, which for one is the primary mission of the Topcop,” Banac added.

For this program, dubbed as ‘Enhanced Tourist Oriented Police for Community Order and Protection (Topcop),’ at least 400 police personnel have been trained as tourism police.

Banac said that having trained tourist police will also provide an added police security in areas vulnerable to crimes.

Tourism Regional Director Karina Rosa Tiopes welcomed the assistance of the PNP as their office is now in the midst of reviving the region’s tourism industry hard hit by the pandemic.
